HISTORIC **ST.** MARY'S CITY

Last week, several grades visited Historic St. Mary's City for a field trip. Our student learned so much about life in 17th-century Maryland.

They visited the reconstructed Brick Chapel of 1667, and toured a recreated Woodland Yaocomico Indian Hamlet. They learned how they made canoes from tree trunks, what the inside of a witchott looked like, what tools the Yaocomico used, and how they traded with the colonists for goods they brought from England.

Next they toured the Godiah Spray Tobacco Plantation, a working colonial farm, and helped grind and sift corn in the kitchen. They learned about the tobacco trade during colonial times, rolled barrels used to transport tobacco, and observed drying tobacco In historic leaves. the town center, they got to view a working printing press, storehouse, and housing.

On the beautiful waterfront, they toured the *Maryland Dove*, a replica small trading ship, and participated in hands-on activities to learn about winches, anchors,

and navigation techniques.
