No New Business


Dan Grecco introduced our speaker, Brian Zeeck from Hinshaw & Culbertson presenting "Professional Engineering Ethics Requirements". The major points are as follows:

- 1. The Professional Engineer's Act requires ethical practice from those given the privilege to practice the profession.
- 2. Most of the ethical questions can be resolved by using common sense.
- 3. Evaluation of the impact on Public safety is the key requirement for determining any actions by the Courts or Administrative Review Boards.
- 4. If you are rationalizing your conduct, you have probably crossed the ethical line.
- 5. NSPE publishes an Ethics Reference Guide.
- 6. Regarding any ethics question, make sure that the facts are known.
- 7. Ignorance is no excuse for the rules.
- 8. If there is a contract relationship, there is a duty to notify your client of any ethical issues.
- 9. When seeking work, you must be competent in the work that is being sought.
- 10. Seal work as if it was your own. If you have not done it directly, then you must be satisfied by your review of the work that it is satisfactory to seal.
- 11. For reports, any personal interest in the matter must be revealed.
- 12. If there is an ethical question, first talk to your client regarding a conflict of interest and also seek an attorney if needed.
