The Slave Mentality

Is it a small thing that you have brought us up out of a land flowing with milk and honey, to kill us in the wilderness, that you must also make yourself a prince over us?

Numbers 16:13

What is the slave mentality? It's the mentality that keeps us in our chains, bound to sin and death. It's the idea that slavery is comfortable, predictable, and ultimately good for us.
