M4 Tree works Severn Beach to Swindon 31 August to 4 November 2021

National Highways operates, maintains and improves England's motorways and major A roads.

As part of our commitment to safety and the environment we need to carry out work on dead or dying trees along the M4 between Severn Beach and Swindon. A recent survey identified a number of trees which need to be removed or otherwise made safe where they may pose a hazard to road users or third-party property. Replacement planting will be included in next year's work programme.

Work will take place during the day and we anticipate each site will take 1 to 3 shifts to complete. For the safety of our workforce hard shoulder closures will be in place.
