The next meetings scheduled are July 13th, August 10th, and September 14th starting at 6:30 p.m. The hall is set up to accommodate anyone who wishes to attend, however, social distancing will take place. 2020 ELECTIONS NEWS!!!

The April 7 Spring Election was held despite the pandemic. All those who made the effort to vote in one way or another should be commended. I also want to give a big "THANK YOU" to the Election Inspectors who worked that day: Karen Stuhr, Gail Schley and Cathy Volz. We had 152 ballots cast with 80 voting absentee and 72 voting at the polls.

The next Election is the Partisan Primary on August 11, 2020. The polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. In the Partisan Primary you may vote in only ONE party's primary. When you choose a party, votes cast in that party will be counted. Votes cast in any other party will not be counted. If you do not choose a party, and you vote in more than one party, no votes will be counted. So, at the start of the ballot, you will choose your party, Democratic, Republican or Constitution; then you proceed to vote for the candidates within that party. You can vote absentee, NOW, by mail, if you are pre-registered. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued. The last day to apply by mail is Thursday, August 6th by 5 p.m. You may also request and vote absentee in the clerk's office by appointment starting Tuesday, July 28th. The last day to vote absentee in the clerk's office is Sunday, August 9th.

You can request an absentee ballot, register, find out what's on the ballot, or get the clerk's information, etc., online at https://myvote.wi.gov. Covid-19 Preparations Election Day: The same Covid-19 preparations will be activated for the next two Elections; social distancing, etc. The machines, counters, bathrooms, door knobs, etc. will be disinfected regularly. Everyone will receive their own pen for signing the poll book. Wear a facemask if you are sick.

FREE TIRE PICKUP:

Every year the County Recycling Center offers a Free Tire Pick-up program for municipalities. Maple Creek will participate again this year. There will be a dumpster at the town hall on Friday, September 11 through Sunday, September 13th. You can bring your old tires (rims allowed) 18" or less with a limit of 4 tires per household and drop them in the dumpster. The dumpster will be hauled away early Monday morning the 14th.

REFUSE AND RECYCLING:

Garbage pickup is every Friday. There is an exception for those months that have a holiday during the week. Then the pickup would be on Saturday of that week. Refuse pickup is every other Friday with the same exception as garbage pickup. Here's the schedule:

FOR THE HISTORY BUFFS:

The Town of Maple Creek was organized December 31, 1852 as the Town of Embarrass. Attached is a photo copy of the original text. It didn't become the Town of Maple Creek until 1861. We have all the original books. I will try and translate for you. I'll probably wreck some of the names. I'm sure there are some in Maple Creek who know the old names. Let me know of corrections and I'll get it in the next newsletter. Here we go....

Town Book, State of Wisconsin, County of Outagamie, Town of Embarrass, Transcript of Records: Resolved; That so much of the territory of Outagamie County as lies north and west of Wolf River (?) and the same is hereby organized into a (?) Town, and the legal voters therein are duly authorized to elect town officers and conduct town business-and that the first town meeting be held at the house of (Washington?) law on the first Tuesday of April next. The polls to be opened at the house specified by law for annual elections. Said Town to be known by the name of Embarrass. And be it further resolved that (?) (?) be and is hereby requested to past up in said Territory three or more copies of the (?) resolution. Said resolution to be furnished him by the Clerk of Board. Adopted December 31st, A.D. 1852 (Locewya?) E Darling Clerk...(A J Saubarn?) (Dep?) A true copy, Attest ALHolcumb. I certify the above to be a true copy Porter Bowen, Town Clerk.

Whew...I know that is not all accurate. Again, let me (clerk Gitter) know what you see different. Thanks.
