Thanks to your advocacy, the Assembly last week passed the bill to suspend, for an additional year, the Annual Professional Performance Review process. The bill previously passed in the state Senate and will move to the governor's desk where Gov. Kathy Hochul's signature would enact it.

D. Program Exploration for Future Teachers/Take a Look at Teaching

The NYSUT "Take a Look at Teaching" grant gives us the opportunity to research and develop a plan to engage students in activities that will lead them into a career in education. E. Health Care Bonuses

The recently adopted 2023 state budget created a healthcare and mental hygiene workers bonus program to recruit and retain existing employees. Eligibility will be for members in those titles making less than \$125,000. It is a \$3,000 bonus to be paid in two payments of \$1,500 for each 6-month vesting period over a one-year period. Employees who work fewer hours will be eligible for a prorated bonus. It is the employer’s responsibility to identify the eligible employees and apply for the funding on their behalf. The association has begun discussing this process with the district for our eligible members. I look forward to bringing you more information throughout the process.

F. Union Sick Bank

Thank you very much to all who have donated so far. Unfortunately, the bank currently has more requests than days available, leaving the bank at zero. Please consider donating to help fill those requests. The bank runs on our members’ generosity.

G. Long Beach Board of Education

A motion was made and passed to support the Long Beach School Budget. The overall budget-to-budget change does have an increase from the current year. However, it will result in a 0% increase in the Long Beach Tax Levy. This means the district will once again not be asking the community for any additional money. I believe the budget is fiscally responsible for the Long Beach Community while maintaining and enhancing many of our programs for the students. The Board will put the budget up for a vote to the community on Tuesday, May 17, 2022. The community will have the opportunity to vote on the Budget and one School Board Trustee position. Anne Conway is running unopposed for the Trustee position. Please remember to get out and support on your local budgets on May 17th.

H. Eyeglass Reimbursement

We are in year two of a two-year cycle for eyeglass/contact purchases. Members have \$400 to spend on glasses/contacts. Plus such coverage may now be used for the member and his/her family. Completed claim forms with receipts attached must be sent to the HR department in Administration, or email Dr. Natali.
