FROM THE PASTOR

January 27, 2019
Third Sunday in Ordinary Time
Lk 1:1-4, 4:14-21

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Back with Advent, we began a new church calendar year. In our weekly series of Sunday Mass readings we follow a three year cycle, giving a whole year to read through the gospels of Matthew (Year A), Mark (Year B) and then Luke (Year C) (*John is not left out---his gospel is reserved for special occasions*). At Advent, we entered **Year C, Luke's turn**. In the first half of today's reading, we hear the beginning of Luke's gospel where Luke states his own mission in writing down the gospel. Then in the second half of the gospel, we hear Jesus deliver His mission Statement in His hometown synagogue, announcing the arrival of the Kingdom of God. Let's call this **'Mission Sunday'**. Of course, Luke's mission (just like John the Baptist's) is to introduce us to Jesus. Once Jesus (He is The Message!) arrives, we can let go of the messenger. Luke tells us that he is going to 'compile a narrative of the events... fulfilled among us, ...handed down to us from eyewitnesses.... (vs1-2). And Luke is not a sloppy blogger or loose note-taker. He says he is **'investigating** everything **accurately** anew....., writing it down in an **orderly sequence**' (vs 3). So Luke is careful and trustworthy. He recounts the events surrounding Jesus' ministry with an eye toward helping others to meet, know and understand the mission of Jesus and His coming to save us. What Luke says at the beginning of his gospel in the first chapter, John will say at the end of his gospel, writing, "But these words are **written so that you may come to believe** that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through this belief **you may have life** in his name" (John 20:31). We call the gospel writers 'evangelists' because they are introducing us to Jesus. They work to give us an encounter with Christ, bringing Christ to us or us to Christ. They want us to come to know and believe in Christ!

So enough about the gospel writers (front-men)! Let's get to the Good news itself, and today we hear that Jesus Himself is the Message! Jesus says that much in the gospel as He reads some messianic prophecies from Isaiah about God coming to His people, and then Jesus demonstrably declares, "Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing"(Luke 4:21). He's IT! Jesus is the 'Word Made Flesh' (John 1:14), the Gospel Incarnate, the Good News in Person! Or as Turtle Man would say it, "Jesus is the Kingdom of God, 'Live Action'! Exactly what does Jesus embody of God? Or what does the Kingdom of God look like? The Blind will see, the Oppressed be set free, Captives released, a Year of Favor announced, and the Poor will receive Good News! A great opportunity for a personal Bible study would be to take this mission statement of Luke chapter 4 and then read the rest of Luke's gospel and list every miracle under one of these five headings! A similar study could be done with the Beatitudes (Luke 6), which are also snapshots of what the Kingdom of God looks like. For example, we can take each of them as prophetic statements of Jesus' mission and then go on to show how Jesus specifically blesses each type of person or situation. We can ask, "When through the rest of gospel is the poor blessed? How are the hungry satisfied? When and how will those who mourn be given joy and laughter?" I believe these early teachings of Jesus are His way of inviting or catching disciples Himself. We do have to hang around with Him to find out how His mission is fulfilled. Jesus will enact and embody these redemptive promises in His works of ministry and His teachings. Really, every encounter with Jesus is a demonstration of His Word. Jesus tells potential followers, "**Come, and you will see**" (John 1:39), and "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Mark 1:17). Jesus tells Nathanael in John 1:50, "Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? **You will see** greater things than this." Jesus does embody what he says. He lives a demonstration of His teaching. In Luke 7: 22, He tells some people who came from John the Baptist checking on Him, to "Go back and report to John what you have seen and heard: **The blind receive sight**, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the **good news is preached to the poor.**" Today's gospel previews what Jesus will accomplish. Jesus presents the 'Kingdom of God'. Come, follow Him and See!
