



Now, let me update you on what United is doing to spread the gospel's good news through mission projects that improve the quality of life for some of the neediest people among us. In May, friends of United donated supplies to create one-hundred personal hygiene kits. The kits were distributed evenly between two shelters, the Dudley House in Plainfield (a haven for men) and a shelter in Newark that services homeless families.

Praise God for Desirae, a member of our youth fellowship, and her classmate Zion. On May 14, the girls spent part of their Saturday compiling all one hundred kits and organizing the church's small food pantry. Then, on May 16 and 17, Davaughn and I delivered the kits to the shelters. Both organizations expressed gratitude for our congregation's thoughtfulness.

The Newark shelter has asked for our help collecting baby formula, baby bottles, diapers, pull-ups of any size, and sensitive skin baby wipes. I informed the shelter we would not donate formula because the families the shelter services are eligible for WIC (a federally funded nutrition supplemental program that helps women, infants, and children).

However, I promised to collect one hundred baby bottles (glass or plastic bottles in 4oz and 8oz sizes), 1,000 disposable diapers, and 1,000 sensitive-skin baby wipes. I hope to make the donations over the next three months, focusing on collecting a different item each month.

To achieve the donation goals, I need your help. Eight people or families are needed to donate one box of diapers or pull-ups, any size, in quantities of one hundred forty or more per box. Another family or individual is asked to contribute two packs of sensitive-skin baby wipes in amounts of six hundred or more per pack. To collect the one hundred bottles, twenty-four people need to contribute bottles in groups of four or more per package.

Please drop off or have items mailed directly to the church to participate in this critical ministry that helps needy families care for their young children. You can claim your donation as part of your charitable giving by sending your receipt to the church treasurer. Receipts must contain your name and show the items donated and the amount paid.

Well, sisters and brothers, until next time, Godspeed!


> *Father's Day—June 19, 2022* Blessings to our fathers, the men of UPC & fathers everywhere!



Father's Day honors fatherhood, paternal bonds and the influence of fathers in society. In the United States, Father's Day was founded by Sonora Smart Dodd, and celebrated on the third Sunday of June for the first time in 1910. The day is held on various dates across the world.

Early history

In 1908, Grace Golden Clayton proposed the day to honor those men who had lost their lives in a mining accident in the US. Though it was not accepted then, in 1909 Sonora Smart Dodd, who along with her five brothers was raised by her father alone, after attending Mother's Day in a church, convinced the Spokane Ministerial Association to celebrate Father's Day worldwide. "This is my wish for you: Comfort on difficult days, smiles when sadness intrudes, rainbows to follow the clouds, laughter to kiss your lips, sunsets to warm your heart, hugs when spirits sag, beauty for your eyes to see, friendships to brighten your being, faith so that you can believe, confidence for when you doubt, courage to know yourself, patience to accept the truth, Love to complete your life." The UPC administration committee wants to be certain all UPC members and friends are aware of the establishment of the Building Fund at UPC to which contributions can be made to help defray the cost of four maintenance projects scheduled for 2022. National Gun Violence Awareness Day-June 3rd

National Gun Violence Awareness Day falls on the first Friday of June. This is also known as the Wear Orange Day and was founded to honor survivors and victims of gun violence.

A broad coalition of U.S. public health, education, and advocacy groups chose the date to honor Hadiya Pend-

leton, a Chicago teenager who was shot and killed on a playground in Chicago, on January 29, 2013. She was barely 15 and just a week earlier, she had performed at Obama's second presidential inauguration. Supporters were asked to wear orange.

Why Do People Wear Orange?

Not long after Pendleton passed, her childhood friends began to wear orange as a tribute and commemoration of her life, as orange is the color traditionally used by hunters in the woods to alert others not to shoot and to protect themselves and others.

In the wake of the latest mass shootings in the U.S., in the span of less than two weeks, an elementary school and a grocery store more than 1,700 miles apart were shattered by gun violence. Uvalde, Texas, and Buffalo, N.Y., now both share the tragic loss of friends and family.

It's unclear as to the specific motive in the Uvalde, Texas, shooter's mind – He killed 19 children and two teachers. The gunman responsible for the attack that killed 10 members of the Black community of Buffalo apparently chose the location specifically and that he was motivated by white supremacist ideology.

People are calling for action on gun legislation in the country. Pledge your support to end gun violence by recognizing and showing solidarity with the National Gun Violence Awareness Day.

Statistically, when the U.S. is compared to other high-income countries, specifically Canada, Australia and the UK, America has a much higher gun-related deaths per homicide. In 2020, 79 percent of all homicides in the U.S. were gun related.

Between 1968 and 2017, there were 1.5 million gun deaths in the U.S., a figure higher than the total number of soldiers killed in every single U.S. conflict since the Independence War in 1775.

Over 45,000 Americans died in 2020 because of gun violence, whether it was a homicide or suicide, a 25 percent increase from 2015.

Observed on June 17th, 2022 in New Jersey

Juneteenth, also known as "Emancipation Day" or the "Day of Freedom," is both the somber and celebratory day to commemorate the Thirteenth Amendment abolishing slavery.

WHAT IS JUNETEENTH?

The day remembers June 19, 1865, when Union soldiers brought news of the Emancipation Proclamation to enslaved people in Galveston, Texas, and declared that all people held in slavery in the U.S. must be freed. They were the last slaves to learn of their freedom. The event happened more than a month after the end of the Civil War and about 900 days after President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation.

Juneteenth has been celebrated for more than a century in parts of the U.S. But gained added attention after George Floyd's death in Minnesota and the nationwide Black Lives Matter protests that followed.

N.J. will officially celebrate Juneteenth as a state holiday for the first time Friday, June 17th, 2022

"While Juneteenth is celebrated to mark the end of slavery, we must use this day to take stock of where we are as a nation in achieving true equality for all Americans, especially the Black and Brown Americans who have lived with the vestiges of systemic racism," Gov. Phil Murphy said.

Presbyterian Church USA (PCUSA)

PCUSA: J. Herbert Nelson to preach for Juneteenth service during General Assembly

The Rev. Dr. J. Herbert Nelson, II, Stated Clerk of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), joined Louisville, KY, Mayor and others to announce plans for the city's Juneteenth Jubilee Celebration. A series of activities and events will be held June 11–19. The commission chose the theme "*Our Story, America's Glory.*" Events planned will include a visual arts day camp, a luncheon and a number of youth activities.

During the news conference, Nelson said this is a time to celebrate and reflect.

"We celebrate the opportunity of freedom on one end, but we are also reminded that the church has a calling and that calling is to continue to press for the freedom of individuals who have been left behind even in present day," he said. "To be able to walk faithfully in communities with hope and possibility rather than places of struggle and despair. One of the first orders of business is to worship together, to remember and repent, even in the life of the church. It's the right and sacred thing to do."

CHILDREN'S CORNER

Parents, please read this to your younger child(ren)

We Are One

Theme: In unity we show God's love to the world.

Object: none

Scripture: John 17:20-26

I'm so glad to have all of you here today. Each of you brings something different that adds to our time together. (Name some things that stand out about individual children, and how they add to the

group. Invite kids to share about others, as well, making sure one strength of each child is shared.)

We'll learn from the Bible today that when we're all united, that's one way we show God's love to the world. So let's do something to help us think about that.

Have children gather in a circle and hold hands. Have them stand and walk in their circle. Invite them to discuss ways the circle can represent believers being united in Jesus.

We're all different, but God works through all of us, and when we are all excited and working toward the goal of loving others together as one big circle, others will see God's love and want to join in. In the Bible, Jesus prayed for His friends that they would be united with Him and with one another. (Invite kids to share what they think that means.) It means we all work together to follow Him and love others. One way we can do that is to pray together like Jesus prayed.

Still holding hands, lead kids in a brief prayer. Allow kids to say prayers, if they want to.

It also means we celebrate Jesus together! We tell others about Him and we worship Him!

Invite kids to brainstorm what they do when they're really excited about something. Challenge the children to perform some of these actions without letting go of one another's hands. If time allows, invite them to sing a verse of a worship song they're all familiar with and celebrate Jesus together while still holding hands.

Being united in Jesus means we also pay attention to everyone in Jesus' family, like the people to our left and our right. We stop and comfort them when they're down. We're helpful and encouraging.

While still holding hands, have kids turn and speak encouraging or comforting words to their left and their right. If time allows, invite children to share some other ways they think people can be united in showing Jesus' love, and challenge them to perform an action to demonstrate that idea.

Today we've practiced being one in Jesus, and we can be one in Jesus in our lives, too. We don't have to hold hands. If we all love Jesus and love others, this is a way to show God's love to the world together.

PRAY: Dear Father, help us to be united in Jesus so others can see Your love. In Jesus' name, amen.
