The winner stated about her husband, "Matthew and I are positive when gambling, always thinking we will win, but never in our dreams did we think we would hit a jackpot like this in our lifetime, let alone two in a year. She calls the Wheel of Fortune her go-to machine and notes that she and her husband haven't finalized any plans as to what to do with the second major addition to the bank account.

An anonymous player turned millionaire is thankful for a Las Vegas Wheel of Fortune slot. The winner's payday amounted to a \$1,150,709 jackpot at Caesars Palace. In a frequent occurrence where a small bet results in a gigantic payday, this player only played \$5 when the big hit arrived.

## The Struggle is Over

This jackpot story begins with Manual F., or Manny, who returned to his hotel room to retrieve a forgotten item. A leftover \$40 slot ticket was burning a hole is his pocket after his stay at Agua Caliente Resort. A Wheel of Fortune progressive was calling out to him. He entered the slots area to a waiting slot on the back wall. After the fourth and final \$10, he spun the reels and watched as three Wheel of Fortune logos popped up on the center line. That final spin resulted in a nearly \$2.5 million payday.

"I thought at first that maybe I had won a couple of hundred

When her granddaughter alerted her that someone from Yellowknife had won the lottery, she decided to check her numbers online. Tutcho recalled being in shock after discovering that her numbers matched. Tutcho was the only player to match all seven main winning numbers in the draw-3, 12, 25, 36, 37, 42, and 49—making her the Northwest Territories' largest lottery jackpot winner ever.

Wisconsin Lottery fans now have more opportunities to win big, with three of its games now drawing twice daily. The state's Pick 3, Pick 4, and All or Nothing games have received new midday drawings, in addition to their current evening drawings. This brings Wisconsin games in line with most other state lotteries that already offer multiple daily drawings of popular games. The evening draw times for the Pick 3 and Pick 4 games moved to 9 p.m., aligning with the draw time of the All or Nothing game. The Wisconsin Lottery uses computerized drawings, so the public is unable to see the actual drawing take place.

## PA Arts Fest Includes Adults-Only Bingo

The Fest invites local residents and visitors to experience performances from local and national artists, learn a new skill at a workshop and take in all the community has to offer. Players paid \$12 per Bingo board (boards were emailed to players after registration) and the same board could be used for all four games. Five items in a row made Bingo. Participants then posted a confirmation photo of their Bingo trash items. Bingo prizes were donated by such businesses as Clearly Tahoe Kayaks, Alibi Ale Works, Olympic Bike Shop, North Tahoe Works, Drink Coffee Do Stuff, CLIF Bar and Tahoe Heartbeat.

## Seahawks Star Calls the Numbers

The Seattle Seahawks are known for their work with veterans and are always on the lookout for more ways to do so. With many community events on hold and social distancing very much in play, Seahawks defensive tackle Bryaån Mone was still able to find a fun way to virtually interact with vets by placing a video call and leading the veterans of Patriots Landing senior community in DuPont, Washington, in a weekend Bingo. More than 40 World War II vets took part in the event, following along by means of projection screens as Mone called the numbers. Along with celebrating each win, Mone led the veterans in a "Go Hawks" chant and awarded winners with coveted Seahawks jerseys.



Sounds like a lot, but it's not, considering the number of veterans who pass away each day. Even during this lockdown the BAA is receiving 20-30 requests for buglers every day. You can help. All you have to do is play "Taps."

The steps: Check the website at buglesacrossamerica.org. If you already play, brush up. You'll need to audition, in person, with your state's director or another designated person from the organization. You can be male or female. You can play a bugle with none, one, two or three valves; a trumpet; a cornet or a flugelhorn. The instrument doesn't matter, but your playing does. You must be very, very good with at least high school-level music playing experience. For more information, email info@buglesacrossamerica.org or click the Contact Us link on the website. If you need a bugler, click Request A Bugle. To get a feel for the BAA, go to the website and read the Bugler's Post blogs. You'll learn, among other things, that Tom Day is out there each evening at 7 p.m. to sound "Taps" in honor of all our fallen brothers and sisters.

There is no piece of music that elicits as much emotion as the 24 notes of "Taps," the bugle call played at military funerals and ceremonies.

In 2000, Congress passed legislation saying that the funerals of veterans should have two members of the military present, one to fold the flag and one to play "Taps." The problem has been that in too many places there aren't enough buglers. Funeral directors turned to "Taps" played on CD in a mechanical device that's inserted into a bugle. That's not quite the same thing.

Bugles Across America was started in 2000 by Tom Day as a means of gathering buglers who would attend the funerals of veterans and play real "Taps." Since he started, Day has signed up 4,000 buglers.



# Bingo Buddy System

#### **Dear Aunt Bingo:**

I love Bingo, play weekly, wish I were luckier, but win or lose, really enjoy the whole Bingo experience.

My one problem is that in recent years I have been unable to get any of my friends or family to go to Bingo with me.

Do not misread my point—I am not a needy person. But I know from experience that it is far more fun to do an activity when you have someone along enjoying it with you.

In the past I have had several Bingo buddies who I would go to Bingo with, but for various reasons they stopped going to Bingo which is why I am now making these trips on my own.

#### **Dear Solo:**

As kids, it was so easy for us to fall into friendships. The classroom, the playground, the neighborhood—daily opportunities abounded for crossing paths with kid by the dozen.

Unfortunately, as adults, especially older adults, striking up new friendships can be a real challenge. No one likes being a recipient of the suspicious, narrow-eyed glare of someone you're trying to chat with who clearly wants you to go away. In your case, you have a big leg up: You share an interest in Bingo with a room full of people who have the same interest.

The next time you visit a Bingo hall, why not look for someone who is also solo and sit at their table. Before Bingo starts, you can chat with them casually and see if they respond positively. If they are short with their responses, drop it. If they are pleasant, then you've succeeded with your first step.

From there you can try a little more chatting during breaks and perhaps exchange names. At the end of the games, joke about winning or losing, wish them a nice evening and be on your way.

You have now established a basic connection. From there all you have to do is look for the person again, sit at their table, chat a little more, maybe bring a tempting snack to share, and wait and see if the two of you are heading down Bingo Buddy Boulevard.

# How to Make the Most of Your Telehealth Appointment

#### Dear Savvy Senior,

I manage a large doctor's clinic that treats hundreds of seniors each month. We are moving to more telehealth visits to help keep our patients safe at home during the coronavirus pandemic, but this new way of seeing a doctor is befuddling to many of our elder patients. Can you write a column educating patients on how to prepare for a telehealth appointment? — **Regular Reader** 

#### Dear Reader,

I'd be happy to help! To help keep patients safe and at home during the coronavirus crisis more and more doctors and other health care providers are turning to telehealth (a.k.a. telemedicine) appointments, which are remote e-visits using a digital communication device like a smartphone, tablet or computer.

Although telehealth has been around for a few years now, recent updates to regulations and a surge in demand has made it the easiest way to get many different types of medical care. Most telehealth appointments today tend to be primary care or follow-up visits that can assess symptoms or check on people who have had a medical procedure. Telehealth also works well for some specialties like dermatology or mental health care services.

So, what can patients expect from a telehealth visit, and how should they prepare?

The first step is to call your doctor's office to find out whether telemedicine visits are available and whether you will need to set up an account or install special software on your computer, phone or tablet.

Until recently, doctors were required to conduct telehealth visits through platforms such as Doxy, Thera-Link or MyChart that were compliant with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, or HIPAA. But some of those requirements have been relaxed, so many providers are using popular apps such as FaceTime, Skype and Zoom.

Once you know what technology you will be using, get familiar with it. You don't want to spend the first ten minutes of your visit trying to figure out how to unmute the audio.

For older patients that aren't familiar or comfortable with technology, ask a relative or friend with a smartphone, tablet or laptop to assist you.

Take the time to clarify the purpose of the visit before it begins. Prioritize a written list of three or four issues you want to discuss with your doctor and make a list of the medicines you're taking, along with the dosages.

Also, have relevant medical devices or logs on hand, such as a penlight or smartphone flashlight for viewing a sore throat, a bloodpressure cuff and thermometer (or recent readings), blood-sugar logs if you're diabetic or a food log if you have gastrointestinal problems.

If you've received medical care at different places, have your latest medical records with you during the telemedicine visit.

Wear loose clothing that will allow you to show your medical provider what is concerning you.

A routine visit could be very quick, while others, such as a physical-therapy appointment, may last as long as a session at a clinic.

Before the visit ends, make sure you know the follow-up plan. Do you need to schedule an inoffice visit, fill a prescription or get a referral to a specialist?

Right now, Medicare and Medicaid are covering the cost of telehealth visits (see medicare.gov/ coverage/telehealth for details), and most private insurers are following suit. If, however, you don't have a primary care physician or need urgent care, you can get help through a virtual health care service like Doctor on Demand (doctorondemand.com) or TeleDoc (teladoc.com). These services currently do not accept original Medicare, but they may be covered by private insurers - be sure you check.

### Hi Guy,

What is the deal with prize money at Bingo? When you go to casinos and Indian games many times the jackpots are in the thousands of dollars. Meanwhile, when you are home and go to local Bingo the top prizes are only in the hundreds and most of the time are much less.

It seems to me that the charity Bingos would do a lot better if they would give out more prize money. I know, I know...this is where you tell us that charity Bingo is for supporting worthy causes and that's where most of the money should go. Of course, I am not going to disagree with that. But isn't it logical that the more prize money there is, the more people will come to charity Bingo to play, which means the more money there will be for needy causes as well?

To me that results in a total win-win-win. Higher prizes (and more of them) means more players spending more money (on games, food, etc.) which means more income for the charity Bingo to support the hall itself and the worthy causes they help.

Just think: A fresh coat of paint, new furniture (for players and workers), a better sound system, better heat and AC improvements like that would make our dinky little Bingo halls so much more comfortable and inviting. Awarding charities thousands of dollars to help their good deeds instead of hundreds would obviously be a good thing. And it goes without saying that awarding lots more players lots more prize money would be very exciting and fun. Win-win-win!

I hope that Bingo games everywhere will see this letter and think about these ideas. It could be the start of a Bingo revolution! — **Carlos L., via email** 

#### Hi Carlos,

It's unclear whether you are aware of the regulations most charity Bingo games fall under, particularly with regard to the money passing through them.

Regulations vary from state to state and are considerably different for smaller charity Bingos versus large Indian and other casino games. But the bottom line is this: States regulate (and in some cases, prohibit) Bingo because it is considered gambling; a key part of that regulation is keeping the amount of money collected and awarded (whether as prize money or charitable giving) relatively low.

The reason behind it is simple: Whenever there is money changing hands, there is the potential for criminal elements to step in and corrupt the process. The best way to avoid that? Don't allow the amount the money involved to ever get so high that it catches the eye of money-grubbing lowlifes.

I would encourage you to search the Internet for the regulations that govern Bingo in

#### your state. If you can stand wading through the legalese—and trust me, there's a lot of it—you might find it interesting to see just how much "in as much as," "whereto" and "wherefor" there is pertaining to something as seemingly simple as Bingo.

After all that, if you are still determined to do something to increase Bingo prize limits, I encourage you to begin a petition, get some Bingo game sponsors involved, approach your favorite state lawmaker and see if you can make it happen. Win-win-win! — **Guy**

I am so tired of serving the same old meals seven days a week. Can you suggest something different, but not too costly? I have two children and a husband who are tired of my cooking. — 1 pound ground chuck 1 cup breadcrumbs

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup chopped onions

- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper
- 1 egg
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup ketchup

To prepare the sauce, combine the currant jelly and chili sauce in a saucepan. Heat until melted and well blended. Preheat the oven to 400 degrees. Combine the remaining ingredients in an appropriate-sized bowl. Mold into a five by nine-inch loaf pan. Pour about one half of the sauce over the meat loaf. Reserve the remainder for later. Bake for one hour. Add more sauce, if desired, when serving the meat loaf. Serves 4 to 6.

- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon baking powder
- 1 cup butter, softened

- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract



## Marginal Hand Makes for Tough Call on River

In a recent \$10,000-buy-in PartyPoker Live event, I got off to a great start. I was up to 1.6 million in chips from a 1 million starting stack, mostly from stealing pots that didn't belong to me.

My table was full of aggressive players. Only one very skilled player seemed to be out of line. He was sitting two seats to my left, so I was forced to play a bit tighter than normal because I expected him to apply significant pressure. When you expect someone to apply pressure, you either need to play stronger-than-average hands or be willing to apply even more pressure. With blinds at 2,500-5,000, I picked up 8h 8d in first position and raised to 15,000. The overly aggressive player, who had about as many chips as me, called from third position. The hijack, button, small blind and big blind all called, too. I assumed most players would reraise their best hands, so I figured they all had non-premium ranges.

The flop came 9h 9c 7c. The blinds checked to me, and I also decided to check.

If I bet and got called, I would be up against a range of decently strong made hands and draws. Since I was in marginal shape against any reasonable calling range, checking was an option with a lot of merit.

If I checked, someone bet and someone else called or raised, I could easily fold. If one player bet and everyone folded around to me, I could call. The flop will occasionally check through and I'll get outdrawn by a hand that would have folded to a flop bet, but at a table full of aggressive players, checking puts me in the best situation while also keeping variance low.

This time, everyone checked through. The turn was the 3h.

The blinds checked. I assumed most players would bet the flop with trips or an overpair, which led me to believe I had the best hand. I bet 25,000.

This bet size was designed to make hands with a marginal amount of equity, such as A-J or K-Q, fold while keeping in marginal made hands that I beat, such as 7-6 or 5-5. Of course, flush draws would probably stick around no matter how much I bet.

The aggressive player in third position called and everyone else folded. I thought this loose, splashy player could easily have had strong overcards or a gutshot straight draw, in addition to marginal made hands and strong draws.

The river was the Kh. I checked and my opponent bet 110,000.

Although my opponent's bet put me in a difficult situation with my bluff catcher, in live poker, you can occasionally make a read on your opponent based on his bet size or his demeanor that sways your decision one way or the other.

I thought my opponent would correctly put me on either a marginal made hand or a missed draw, and I thought he would try to bluff me off those hands. I thought his bet was a bit too large to expect me to call with marginal made hands. Since I thought he would likely bet smaller for thin value, this led me to believe he had either a premium hand (a flush or trips) or nothing. Since I thought his bluffing range was quite wide, I called.

My opponent quickly mucked his hand and awarded me a goodsized pot.




