

South Shore Meeting Minutes

November 2, 2022

Meeting was called to order at 7:04 pm

Roll call of officers and directors was taken, Tom DeRosia was not present.

Secretary report was given for the month of October 2022 and accepted.

Directors Meeting – Five new members joined the club in October. Membership stands at 732. Paving of the parking lot was quoted at 28,500 and approved by the Directors. A cook from Bridgeport will be contacted regarding cooking in our kitchen on Friday nights. Jim Brown created training Videos for running our Kitchen equipment and are located on the website. Tonya requested purchasing a new building for trap targets and seasonal lawn equipment.

Treasurer's report was given for the month of October 2022 and accepted.

Federation Report was given by Joe Snyder and Mark Folsom – All pheasants in the bird program have been released. The second round of doe permits opened November 1st. The Governors recently implemented gun laws are still in affect due to the recent appeal process. The College of Forestry is looking for grouse bag data. Funds are being allocated to upgrade two of the fish hatcheries. Women in Nature are in need of volunteers for the event in April. Some of the ammo supply shortages are due to vendors not wanting to deal with New York State.

Women in nature report was not presented.

Trap report was presented by Marc Young. – Some of the North Sportsman shooters will be joining the South Shore trap team due to their team exiting CNY Trap League. North Sportsman will be having Trap Shooting on Tuesdays for shooters not wanting to travel. Sand reminded us that Winter Trap starts December 11th and there is a signup sheet at the bar.

Old Business – Mike Dougher thanked volunteers that worked on the Pavilion. A sign will be create for dedicating the structure to John Pawlicki. Marc Young donated all of the wire for the trap barn and Dan Wilson assisted Marc on the install. Mark Folsom contacted the DEC concerning an alternate plan of remediation of wetlands if some were filled in. If the club were to remove any wetland areas, they would have to be replaced in another area that doubled the size of the wetlands removed.

New Business – Tonya Husband discussed the possibility of eliminating the 7:00 draw-time for the monthly ticket. Changes would start in January of 2023. An anti-fatigue mat was proposed for the bar workers. The Salad bar counter is in need of repair. Creation of a "Lost and Found" area was requested. The Sauerbraten Dinner will be Saturday November 12th from 4:00 to 7:00 pm. Price will be 15.00 to 16.00 depending upon meat prices. We discussed if member votes are required for large expenditures. Mike Dougher explained that it is the sole responsibility of the Board of Directors to approve money spent and vote is not required to be brought to the floor for members.
