II. Acceptance of Minutes from Meeting Held on October 21, 2021 - accepted

III. Presentation:

A. Bikeways in SN22 : Ana Ramirez Huerta, TxDot gave a presentation on the I-10 Pedestrian/Bicycle connection to Memorial Park. This was a very in depth presentation. Discussions of the obstacles that will be faced during all these improvements ie Utilities, pedestrian crossings, bridges, safety. SN22 is collecting questions.

IV. New Business:

A. MKT Spur Connection Meeting: City of Houston is wanting to empliement a long awaited connection, the MKT Spur Connection that was damaged by fire. It is being rebuilt. For further information a meeting 5:30 on Tuesday, send email to SN22 and link will be provided to attend.

B:Detering One Way Letter of Support: Mike Van Dusen, City has been looking at making this a one way street since it is not wide enough to occomadate two lanes, Recent meeting involving effected parties and It is desired to make the on way direction South towards Washington from Center St., a letter has been drafted to send to the CofH requesting that it be south bound not north bound. No objections of sending the letter.

C: SN22 Bylaws Amendments Vote: A poll was taken on approving the new by-law updates, the last time it was updated was in 2004 lacking areas regarding voting stake holders, some didn't exist anymore, some old are now active in SN22. New by-laws passed.

D: Sound Ordinance Revisions Update: Stacie Fairchild, Sallie Alcorn, At Large 5 has been heavily involved in this issue for the past year regarding new revisions, city came with new ones last week and there was a strong rejection on how it was presented. There will be more meetings pushing to get restrictions in place.

E. Redistricting Harris County Precincts: There was meeting today with over 125 public people to speak to decide on one map and move forward and the vote is to take place on Tuesday. Depending on which map is decided on would change a portion of SN22 on which precinct it would fall under. Stacie will provide more information as it becomes available.

F. Quarterly Meetings with Chief Finner: Stacie Fairchild, other super neighborhoods are having noise issues as well. The goal is to discuss the issues and measure progress. Abbie Kamin will be setting these meetings up with folks in leadership rolls with in Super Neighborhoods.
