This year the Long Beach Branch is combining the Baroque and Bach Festivals into a single event. Participating teachers must enter students for the Bach and Baroque festival by using the registration system at scjbf.org. Please contact Mark Sullivan ahead of the Jan. 18 entry deadline if you need assistance.

All participating students will be evaluated and receive written comments by the three judges.

Piano students who participate in the Festival with original keyboard works composed by J.S. Bach will be eligible for selection to compete at the SCJBF Region III keyboard festival on Sunday, May 17, 2020. At least 50% of eligible pianists will be selected for Regional.

Singers, strings and winds players, together with pianists performing Baroque repertoire that is not eligible for the Keyboard Regional Festival will be considered for Honorable Mention.

Pianists selected for the SCJBF Regional Keyboard Festival, together with strings and winds players, pianists and singers who receive Honorable Mention, will be invited to perform at the Long Beach Branch Bach/Baroque Winners Concert to be held on Sunday, March 1, 2020.

Pianists and instrumentalists are eligible through age 18. Singers are eligible through age 25.

Please note: SCJBF organizes All-Branch Regional Festivals for Strings and Winds/Voice categories. These events combine both Branch and Regional levels and usually take place in April and May. There is no prerequisite to enroll.
