I am still seeking input from a number of people regarding this focus and next steps. However, in order for us to move toward building a healthy community of faith we are launching the Midweek Gathering event that begins on Wednesday, September 20th. Live music begins around 5:00 p.m., followed by dinner at 5:30 p.m. (catered by i•Que BBQ). After dinner, there will be activities for all ages – Kids Kingdom, Youth Ministry, and adult-learning time. Please plan to be a part of this weekly community-building time.

Speaking of live music, Leigh Taylor has recently been commissioned by our Session to serve as a "Missionary through Music." Leigh's musical gifts combine with his heart for people to know Jesus. His music conveys God's restorative love and grace. He ministers at the San Diego Rescue Mission, the Learning Center (a halfway house), the Ladle Ministry (serving the homeless) downtown, and other venues. Pray for Leigh and his ministry. You may also support him financially. A fund is in place to facilitate his support.

Another Session-approved enhancement to our ministry is the expansion of Rebecca DeBreau's role to include adult spiritual formation (or discipleship). Rebecca has a real heart for people to be Jesus' disciples, to grow deep in faith and understanding, and to live as Christ-followers. Her expanded role will serve our focus on disciple-making.

Please pray for Trinity Church and Trinity Christian School as they kick off the new year, and for God to be glorified in all we say, all we do, all we are, and all we will become as we journey together as a community of faith.

Leigh Taylor, Urban Missionary

reetings! It's your friendly, neighborhood urban missionary, Leigh Taylor, here. I just wanted to let you know what I've been doing since mid-July. I've played more than usual. Some were solo gigs, but I often played with an ever-changing lineup of awesome musicians. We now call ourselves Leigh Taylor's Tribal Elders.

There are some gigs that I do regularly, like every other month.

Those are the ones that are at places like homeless shelters, prisons, etc.

I like these kinds of gigs. They don't pay much, if anything. I call them Ministry 1 gigs, M1 for short.

Then there are gigs that are at actual venues for music – coffee houses, an occasional Christian music festival, etc. I call these Ministry 2, or M2 gigs for short. It's all ministry, but there's a definite, obvious difference between those attending.

Here's what the *Tribal Elders* and I have been doing over the summer:

July 20 - Celebrate Recovery

An M1 gig for people recovering from addictions. This one is all the way up in Dana Point!

July 21 - Angel City Coffee House

An M2 gig in Bellflower that I've done twice a year for the past few years. I'm actually wondering if I should continue ministering here. Prayers, please!

August 3 - 1st Christian Coffee House

This is an M1 gig in Oceanside that calls itself a coffee house, but is actually an outreach to the area homeless, offering food, clothing, and a place to hang out on Thursday evenings. Love this place!

August 18 - Gathering Grounds

This is an M2 gig in Chula Vista. This was our first time playing here. A few Trinity folks even found their way there. Seems promising!



August 19 - Venice Beach Gospel Fest

An M1 gig under the guise of a free music concert. Food, clothing, and prayer aplenty were given out! The next one is this time next year. That will be 21 years in a row!

Lastly, I'm going to play with the San Diego Banjo Band twice a month. It's an opportunity, without opening my mouth, to play some cool tunes from the 20s, 30s, and 40s!

I'll keep you posted as to what's going on, and try to think of a better way to present it! Thank you for your prayers and support! That's all for now.

The 2017-2018 School Year Begins!

he new school year will begin on Tuesday, September 5th with our traditional classroom meetand-greet followed by a school-wide picnic. Formal classes will begin the following morning.

Mrs. Linda Shepersky retired last June after serving the Lord at Trinity Christian School (TCS) for many years. Mrs. Tina Bowidowicz (Mrs. B) will be team-teaching in her place in first grade with Mrs. Debi Kohl. We have 20 new families throughout the school, and we are hoping to host six to seven Korean students for 10-20 weeks as well. God has been truly faithful to TCS since 1969, and we are looking forward to seeing what He will do as we begin another school year here on the Trinity hill.

"Academic Excellence Faith in Action"

The daily business of the school is obviously focused on academic excellence through a biblical perspective. Throughout the year, our students practice putting their faith into action by participating in various activities and events. These events

and activities include our Mission Week and Serve-a-thon, Operation Christmas Child, Children's Hospital, MOM's, Feeding America, Tecate Mission School, visiting rest homes, beach cleanups, and supporting Travis Klingforth, a former TCS student, serving in Kenya. The students also perform Christmas programs, Dad's Chapel, Mom's Chapel, Grandparent's Chapel and Patriotic Chapel as a way to reach out to others in Jesus name. This year we have chosen the following scripture verse as faith is our focus: "Faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see." Hebrews 11:1

During their school days, love for God and others is nurtured, lifelong friendships are made, Christ-like character is developed, and wisdom is manifested through academic excellence.

We still have a few spots open in some classes so please be sure to let friends and family know about TCS. Trinity Church members are offered a 20 percent discount on tuition. Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

What is the purpose for the Midweek Gathering?

At this point in the life of Trinity Church, there is a significant need to build unity as a community of faith. This weekly gathering of people of all ages will help us build a strong faith community.

What will happen during these Midweek Gatherings?

The doors open at 5:00 p.m. for socializing with special music in the background. Dinner will be served at 5:30 p.m. From approximately 6:15 p.m. to 6:30 p.m., we will engage in intergenerational activities around the tables. At 6:30 p.m., the children will head to Kids Kingdom, teens to Youth Group, and the adults will have a time of Bible-centered study and discussion. The evenings will end no later than 7:30 p.m.

Why is the dinner being catered?

In the past, teams graciously and generously prepared meals for midweek events. Having catered meals frees all our people to participate in the evening activities. Remember the goal is to build community.

What does the meal cost?

Tyrone Hopkins, owner of i•Que BBQ Catering, has generously agreed to provide the meals for \$6.00 per person. We are capping that at a maximum of \$20.00 per family to make it affordable. Some may offer additional donations to underwrite the cost of the meals. The staff was treated to a sampler of i•Que's food; BBQ chicken, ribs, slider patties, side dishes, etc. It was delicious!

What if I am unable to afford the cost of dinner?

The most important thing is that you come, enjoy the meal and community-building time together. Contribute what you can for the dinner. We can be confident that God will provide.

How can I pray for these midweek Gatherings?

Ask God to use these evenings as a means of our getting better acquainted, connecting with one another at a deeper level, building a robust unity as we study God's Word and apply it to our lives, and as we gain a clearer focus for the future ministry of Trinity Church.

MILITARY OUTREACH MINISTRY

The distribution center for MOM held an open house in June. Michele Woodard, Venita Barry, and Cherie Klaiber attended and were impressed at the enthusiasm, organization and caring that was shown for the outreach to the military families (Junior Enlisted E-5 and below). Watch for the date of the next open house planned in the month of October. It's good to see one of the church's ministries in action.

At the San Diego Military Outreach Ministries (SDMOM), the sacrifices that military families make for us is recognized by giving a little back to show our appreciation. It's a ministry to active-duty military families who are experiencing difficulty living in the San Diego economy. Everything the ministry provides is free of charge. There are regular food and bread distributions, and a Distribution Center where the following items are distributed:

- Household items: dishes, pots/pans small appliances, linens, etc.
- Diapers (sizes: NB, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5)
- · Baby wipes, formula and baby food
- · Children's clothing, toys, books, hygiene items
- Baby equipment when available: strollers, pac 'n' plays, high chairs, etc.)
