#### APRIL & MAY IS TEST SEASON

The year is quickly flying by! This means our state's standardized test is coming up. Our school has been preparing for this and working hard for these upcoming tests.

We can make your child's test experience positive and successful by working together. Please take the time to do these little things and help your child reach their fullest potential:

- ► Talk with your child about goals for this test.
- Make sure your child gets a healthy breakfast at home or at school on the morning of the test.
- Late students will make up missed sessions after lunch in the library. They will NOT be allowed to enter a testing session that has begun.
- ► Gently encourage your child to do their best and show your faith in them. Below you will find a list of dates your child will test based on their current grade.

April  $3^{rd}$ - $7^{th}$  is  $5^{th}$  &  $6^{th}$  Grades (Monday-Friday) STRICTLY Timed April  $24^{th}$ - $28^{th}$  is  $7^{th}$  &  $8^{th}$  Grades (Monday-Friday) STRICTLY Timed May  $1^{st}$ - $5^{th}$  is  $3^{rd}$  &  $4^{th}$  Grades (Monday-Friday) STRICTLY Timed MAY  $5^{th}$  is a one day  $3^{rd}$  to  $8^{th}$  Grade Science LEAP test. May  $1^{st}$ - $19t^{h}$ - High School EOC Testing Untimed

#### SCHOOL HEALTH REMINDERS

- ► Students must be free from fever, diarrhea, & vomiting for at least 24 hours without the use of medications to treat these symptoms (ex: Tylenol, Advil, or any antinausea/vomiting/diarrhea medication) before returning to school. If your child has any of these symptoms at night, but feels better in the morning they still cannot attend school that day. This is LPPS policy & helps prevent the spread of illness.
- ► Always be aware that head lice can happen at any time. Children are in close contact with each other during play dates, slumber parties, sports activities, & school. The use of hairspray, gel, & pulling long hair back can be helpful in avoiding lice. Please check your child's head routinely. If lice are found, treat & remove all nits (eggs), & clean recently worn clothes, bedding & household. If you have treated for lice a retreatment is typically needed after a week to kill any lice or nits that did not die with the 1<sup>sr</sup> treatment. If a re-infestation continues to occur, a prescription strength treatment may be required. Head lice do not fly, or jump & cannot live off of a human host for more than 1-2 days.
