November 24, 2019 Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ Lk 23:35-43

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Today is the end! Well, okay, only the end of the 2019 church calendar year! As Advent opens Sunday December 1, we begin a new 'liturgical' year. The 'liturgical year' is our worship calendar of special days to observe in church each year. I love that the last Sunday celebration of our church year is given the name 'Christ the King'. Jesus is the end all and be all of our lives! This feast identifies Christ as the ruler of our lives ('Our Alpha and Omega'-Revelation 1:8; 21:6; 22:13, our beginning and end-1 Peter 1:20), and our "all in all"-Colossians 3:11). This feast recognizes that Jesus is the Lord of all Time and the King of History. So we crown the year by calling Christ the 'Lord of Lords and King of Kings' (Rev 19:16).

Yet, it seems that Jesus rules like no other king the world has ever known before, and His followers haven't fully stepped up to lead in imitation of His style so far. Regardless, the end is the same that his kingship is not embraced or even recognized by the world. His unique style is not power-greedy and hungry to dominate others. Rather, Jesus is hungry for justice and eager to serve and support others ('Blessed are the hungry and thirsty for justice'-Matt 5:6 & 'I came not to serve not be served'-Mark 10:45). As Jesus stood before Pilate's judgement, He Himself renders this verdict! "My kingdom is not of this world" (John 18:36). This is quite the judgement upon Jesus' disciples. Jesus was pointing out that His followers (us) look a lot more like Caesar's subjects ruled by the world, not guided by God's commands and kingdom. Even now, when we look around, do we see disciple-lives sacrificially serving God and His commands or lives managing to serve the world's rule of comfort and convenience? Though we all pray the Lord's prayer and desire that God's kingdom come 'on earth as it is heaven', it takes heavenly citizen-disciples to make God's kingdom visible and present on earth. Of course, living in God's kingdom is not a 'one and done' accomplishment. We have to commit every day to living under God's rule. We have to make every decision committed to staying within God's way. Long before His confrontation with Pilate, Jesus had realistically assessed that God's kingdom on earth was going to be fragile and tentative, because of the sacrifice and focus it demands. In Luke 12:49, Jesus had said, "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" Yet, Jesus had found God's kingdom lived on earth in some places and present in some persons. He did announce 'The Kingdom of God is among you' (Luke 17:21). There are pockets of God's kingdom population scattered around the earth like leaven, just as Jesus intended to insert and sow good within the world to bring about its transformation from within. As a wonderful prayer reflection about God's Presence in the world, think about Jesus' revealed teaching about the Kingdom. Jesus taught that God is present and known in the world, similar to the transformative mystery of fermented wine shared and the rising dough of bread broke (1Cor 11:24-25). Or recall His parabolic images of good disciples being the 'light of the world' and 'salt of the earth' (Matt 5:13-16). There are deep realizations in these simple images Jesus takes up to illustrate the Kingdom of God.

But the most impressive image of Jesus' kingdom is Himself on the throne of His Cross, crowned with thorns. His kingly leadership is manifest in that greatest act of love, dying on the cross to serve His people. But, He is tempted three times on the cross (similar to the earlier 3 temptations in the desert-Luke 4:1-13). The rulers (verse 35), the soldiers (verse 36), and the unrepentant criminal beside him (verse 39) all tempt him to selfishly save himself. It's like they all say, "Think of yourself first, forget about everybody else. Do your own thing!", seducing him to come down from the cross. But Jesus withstands the distraction and persists in His redeeming. He maintains His forgiving response of us in the face of evil colluding against Him. Always the personal savior, He is ever-ready to welcome others into the kingdom. Even on the cross dying, He does this still, by forgiving the sorrowful thief. The thief asked, "Remember me in your kingdom" (Luke 23:42). Of course, Jesus forgives, and promises him the comfort of 'being this day with me in Paradise'! We praise God for such a Savior! And in the end, we are left with this question to answer ourselves: "Is Jesus the King of our lives?" Thanks be to God, if we can say "Yes!" Colossians 3:15 reminds us to always, 'Let the peace of Christ rule your hearts'. So, "Come Lord Jesus!" (Rev 22:20).
