


Orange County Notes, No. 2

Editor's Note: Not all stage robberies took place in the "wild west" as evidenced by the above item from the minutes of the Orange County Court. Lewis was tried, convicted and punished by receiving "thirty nine lashes on his bare back well laid on at the common whipping post." Lewis was defended by William Fitzhugh Gordon.
