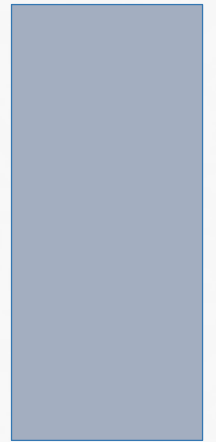


INTENSIVE REENTRY CASE MANAGEMENT

(IRCM)



WHAT IS IRCM?

- The IRCM is a grant funded program for incarcerated clients who have multiple risks and needs to address in order to transition back into the community.
- The ultimate goal is to help people who are serious about making positive changes to become productive citizens and remain crime-free.

AREAS OF FOCUS

- Employment
- Education
- Housing
- Transportation
- Money management
- Mental health needs
- Substance use counseling and treatment
- Spiritual needs
- Family/parenting issues

PAYMENT FOR SERVICES

- Payment for Shelter Placement
- Rent – up to 6 months
- Security deposits (rent and utilities)
- ID and certification assistance
- Inpatient and Outpatient Substance Service
- Basic Furniture
- Housing Repairs/Maintenance/Pest Control
- Household Supplies
- Food Supplies
- Prescription Assistance
- Mental Health Counseling
- Withdrawal Assistance Medications (Vivitrol or Suboxone)
- Recovery Support
- Parenting Classes
- Transportation

CASE MANAGEMENT ASSISTANCE

- Help acquiring important documents such as birth certificate, identification, driver's license
- Help acquiring financial assistance such SSI, SSDI, Medical Assistance (MA), TANF, and other low income assistance services
- Referrals to outside agencies for non-treatment services such as food banks
- Help applying for housing programs

FORENSIC CASE MANAGER DUTIES

- Weekly client contact to discuss current situation and needs
- Coordination of services
- Report behaviors to supervisor and individual's Adult Probation officer
- Maintain client records

IRCM TREATMENT TEAM

- Jail Re-entry Team
 - Prerelease officers and supervisor
 - IRCM/DRC Director
 - Warden
 - Deputy Warden of Inmate Services
 - Jail Correctional Treatment Specialists
 - Jail Special Services Director
 - Public Defender's Office representative

IRCM TREATMENT TEAM

- Reviews program referrals
 - Members provide feedback, ask questions, and vote on acceptance into program
- Meets weekly after Reentry Team meetings to discuss all participants
- Provides insight into relevant mental health and substance use issues
- Makes suggestions to improve services and programming

REFERRAL PROCESS

- Reentrant completes application form
- Application is scanned or faxed to IRCM director
- IRCM director reviews application
- Application is emailed to treatment team members with deadline date for response
- IRCM director goes to jail to interview Reentrant if needed
- Reentrant is notified by jail staff of acceptance or denial
- IRCM director forwards information to shelter provider for review and interview.
- Shelter interviews Reentrant and provides feedback to IRCM director on acceptance or denial.
- If accepted, Prerelease Department notified to complete jail release process and DRC referral.
- Shelter picks up Reentrant and brings to DRC for intake
- IRCM Forensic Case Manager completes intake process includes signing release of information forms for all entities involved in court process and treatment

PROGRAM STIPULATIONS

- Attend the DRC program
- Attend required treatments
- Adhere to treatment recommendations
- Meet with and maintain contact with Forensic Case Manager

MENTAL HEALTH

- Individuals with identified mental health needs may be referred to the Jail Diversion program for additional support.
