

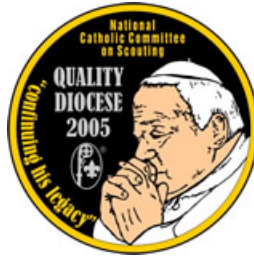

CCOSBR ADULT AWARDS HISTORY

The Diocese of Baton Rouge Catholic Committee on Scouting awards Religious Adult Awards to adults in recognition for their dedicated years of service to the spiritual development of scouting religious awards.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Award

Elizabeth Ann Seton was a woman of tremendous courage. She was a convert to Catholicism and a founder of a religious order. Her religious daughters carry on her works of education and charity. She was a teacher whose love and respect of young people led her to devote her life to the establishment of the Catholic School System in America. The St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Adult Award was inaugurated in 1980 to recognize the contributions of an adult leader whose commitment to the Catholic religious awards has enabled the Girl Scouts to grow in their knowledge, love and service to God.

St. Anne Award

The St. Anne Award is the highest national recognition for adults who serve Catholic girls through Girl Scouting and Camp Fire. The St. Anne Award was inaugurated in 1957 and redesigned in 1980. The purpose of the St. Anne recognition are:

- To honor the outstanding services of adults who contribute to the spiritual development of Catholic young people in these organizations.
- To further Catholic adult leadership in youth ministry through these national youth-serving organizations.

Bronze Pelican Award

The Pelican has been used as a liturgical symbol since the early days of Christianity. It denotes the tender care of the young by the parent and of the Church. Golden Medallion Award

The Golden Medallion Award program is established to identify and recognize the outstanding Catholic Cub Scout Pack, Boy Scout Troop and Venturing Crew/Ship in each of the fifteen Episcopal Regions of the United States.
