### Recent Communication from Jonathan Laton (our newest Point Leader):

"Thank you for thinking of my unit. I am the Battalion S4, which is the Logistics Officer. I handle supplies for the whole Battalion. I also have a good relationship with the unit Chaplin. I know he will be happy to help me pass things out. Maybe on Sundays after his service. So anything your church sends to us will find a home with one of our Soldiers. Thank you so much.

The base we are at was once owned by the British and there isn't a lot here now that the US forces have taken over. There are two Subway trailers; however, they have been closed for over a month due to not being able to get supplies in from convoys. Same goes for the PX. It is very small and the supplies are limited. A lot of the items sold there are from the local economy and the quality is just not there. We are still waiting on a lot of our equipment to arrive. The Soldiers have the basics, **but in time these will run out....**"
