Tiffany Grab & Run

According to numerous media reports, the NYPD is trying to track down a man who pulled off a jewelry heist in broad daylight at Tiffany's on Fifth Avenue in Manhattan. Police have released surveillance video of the suspect, who got away with two necklaces around 3 p.m. on June 7.

Both were diamond necklaces, worth an estimated \$100,000.

Police say the man began talking to a store employee, removed the necklaces from the counter and fled the scene.

No one was injured.

The suspect is described as a black male, last seen wearing a dark-colored suit and tie.
