Subject: COVID-19 Update from Denver Mayor Michael B. Hancock (Monday, March 30)

Please see the update from Mayor Hancock's team below:

- The global case count now tops 740,000 and the death toll exceeds 35,000, including 2,500 fatalities in the U.S. and 47 in Colorado.
- The President has extended social- or physical-distancing guidance and travel restrictions through April 30.
- Gov. Polis has scheduled a noon news conference to provide a statewide COVID-19 update.
- Denver has pushed back the opening of a recreation center as an overflow day shelter for people experiencing homelessness until tomorrow. We still need volunteers. Contact Mimi.Scheuermann@denvergov.org if you are interested or know someone who would like to help.
- About 1,630 people were served in Denver's overnight homeless shelters the past few nights. An additional 14 people experiencing homelessness who exhibited some flu-like symptoms were served in our overnight supplemental shelter last night. Another 73 respite-care motel rooms were occupied last night as well.
- Have a question about whether a business or activity is considered essential or critical under the Colorado or Denver stay-at-home order? Send an email to caoresponseteam@denvergov.org.
- Need to report a violation of the stay-at-home order? Call 3-1-1.
- Nearly 1,000 applications have been submitted to the City for small business emergency relief.
- Denver has spent just over \$6M on supplies, equipment and facilities as part of its COVID-19 response.
- Denver's jail population remains at 1,301 inmates.
