Alabama QB Jalen Milroe and the No. 4 Crimson Tide held on to upset No. 2 Georgia last Saturday night 41-34. Alabama led 28-0 in the second quarter only to see Georgia make a furious second half comeback. The Crimson Tide were 1.5-point underdogs marking the first time since 2007 (Nick Saban's first season) that they were in that role at home.

Misleading Finals

Rutgers (-1) beat Washington 21-18. However, Washington had a 521-299 yard edge. The Huskies missed 3 FG's and were stopped on downs at the Rutgers 2-yard line. Right before the half, Rutgers missed a FG. However, a penalty was called on Washington when a player from the sidelines ran onto the field to celebrate. Rutgers would score a TD on the next play.

NC State (-7) beat Northern Illinois 24-17. However, NIU had a 279-171 yard edge but were -4 in TO's including a fumble return TD by NC State.

Duke (+1) beat North Carolina 21-20. North Carolina led 20-0 in the 3Q!!!

Indiana was -4 in TO's and still won and covered vs Maryland.

Western Kentucky led Boston College 20-7 in the 4Q but lost 21-20.

Texas A&M (-6) beat Arkansas 21-17. However, Arkansas had a 379-297 yard edge but the Hogs were -3 in TO's.

Notre Dame (-6.5) beat Louisville 31-24. However, Louisville had a 395-280 yard edge. The Cardinals had 3 different drives in ND territory end in zero points.

Clemson (-24) beat Stanford 40-14. However, the Tigers only had a 405-361 yard edge as the Cardinal won the line of scrimmage with 236 rushing yards but were -2 in TO's.

Texas Tech (-3) beat Cincinnati 44-41. However, Cincinnati had a 555-482 yard edge. The Bearcats missed 2 FG's and and threw a 51-yard "Pick 6".

Texas State (-10.5) led Sam Houston State 22-0 and also 39-21 late in the 3Q but would lose 40-39.

Michigan State turned the ball over 3 times inside Ohio State's 20-yard line.

Oklahoma (+1.5) beat Auburn 27-21. However, Auburn had a 482-291 yard edge but were stopped on downs at the Oklahoma 1-yard line. They also missed 2 FG's and Oklahoma got a 61-yard interception return TD in the 4Q.

UCF had a 461-418 yard edge but were -3 in TO's in their shocking 48-21 blowout loss to Colorado as 2-TD favorites.

Arizona (+7.5) upset Utah 23-10. Utah did get stopped on downs twice inside the Arizona red zone.

SMU has scored 5 non-offensive TD's already this year.

Charlotte (+4.5) upset Rice 21-20. However, Rice outgained Charlotte 463-304 but were stopped on downs at the Charlotte 4-yard line and 16-yard line. The Owls also missed a 40-yard FG on the final play.

East Carolina (-2) beat UTSA 30-20. However, UTSA had a 456-341 yard edge.

Bad Beats

Wisconsin led USC 21-10 at halftime as 14-point underdogs. USC outscored Wisconsin 28-0 in the second half which included a long "Pick 6".

The Tulsa/North Texas total was 65.5. The score was 3-0 late in the second quarter but would end up 52-20 going over the total.

Thursday, October 3rd

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

Texas State 34 TROY 23. Texas State blew a 22-point lead last week in their 40-39 loss to Sam Houston State. It was their 2nd straight. There might be trouble brewing with one of their best defensive players (DE Bell) contemplating sitting out the rest of the season. It's been a tough first season for new Troy coach Gerad Parker. Troy lost outright as a TD favorite for the 2nd time last week. Despite the start, we lean with Troy here.

Sam Houston State 29 UTEP 19. Another team on a short week laying double-digits on the road. What could go wrong? The Bearcats had one of their biggest wins ever last week in the come-from-behind win over Texas State. Winless UTEP under first-year coach Scotty Walden is off a bye. We lean UTEP with the hook.

Friday, October 4th

Jacksonville State 30 KENNESAW STATE 18. Kennesaw State is having a rough first season in the FBS. Last week they lost to FCS UT-Martin although they were a short underdog. Kennesaw is No. 132 in yards per play margin. Meanwhile, Jacksonville State comes in off a bye after their best performance of the season. This is our biggest power ratings difference of the week as we lean Kennesaw.

TCU 32 Houston 17. Houston's offense ranks dead last averaging just 10.4 ppg. However, their defense is allowing just 20.9 and that has kept them in games (see Oklahoma). TCU is off their best performance of the season but they've been Jekyll and Hyde under coach Dykes.

OREGON 39 Michigan State 14. Oregon does have the big game vs Ohio State on deck. Speaking of Ohio State, Spartan backers deserved better last week as MSU turned the ball over three times inside Ohio State's red zone in the 38-7 loss. MSU is a respectable +1.2 in ypp margin this season but are -7 in TO's and will have to play clean here to keep it respectable.

UNLV 33 Syracuse 27. UNLV is 4-0 ATS this season covering games by nearly 24 points per game. Last week, the Rebels were in the national headlines with their QB Sluka quitting the team due to NIL. No problem as Hajj Malik-Williams was 13 of 16 for 182 yards and 3 TD's while also running for 119 yards. They're facing a Syracuse team making their first road trip this season. QB Kyle McCord leads the nation in passing averaging 365 ypg. He needs to clean up the INT's though after throwing 4 the last two games. We lean OVER at the current numbers in what could be one of the better games of the weekend.

Saturday, October 5th

Pittsburgh 34 NORTH CAROLINA 31. UNC could not have had a worse last couple of weeks. They allowed 70 points in an embarrassing loss to James Madison and then last week blew a 20-0 3Q lead to rival Duke. That should make Mack Brown a lame-duck coach for the rest of the season. In comes a Pitt team off a bye. The Panthers have one of the best offenses in the country averaging 48.5 ppg. They continue the NC woes here.

Central Florida 31 FLORIDA 29. This is a huge game in the Sunshine state. Florida fans and alumni have coach Billy Napier all but fired after suffering two home losses already. Meanwhile, UCF's performance last week vs Colorado might have been the biggest disappointment in any game this entire season as they fell short of expectation by 6 TD's! They lost 48-21 to Colorado as 2-TD home favorites off a bye and were hosting their biggest recruiting weekend ever. A lot of early money has been on UCF here but we're sitting on the sidelines.

East Carolina 29 CHARLOTTE 20. Charlotte got their 2nd fortunate win of the season so far as they beat Rice 21-20 despite being outgained badly (see page 1 misleading finals). They still rank in the bottom 10 in ypp and ypg margins. ECU has had an up and down season so far but are coming off their best win beating UTSA last week (they were outgained by 100 yards. We bet ECU on the openers but there has been value lost.

LOUISVILLE 34 Smu 25. We really liked what we saw from Louisville last week despite the 31-24 loss at Notre Dame. The Cardinals had a 395-280 yard edge. They're taking on a SMU team that is making their first road trip since almost losing outright as 4-TD favorites vs Nevada in Week Zero. The Mustangs are off two of their biggest wins in recent memory (TCU and Florida St) but have scored 5 non-offensive TD's this season making them a little overrated.

GEORGIA 37 Auburn 14. It's going to be interesting to see how both teams respond. Auburn is making their first road trip of the season. The Tigers are 2-3 despite being favored in all 5 games. Georgia is off the loss at Alabama where they fell behind 28-0 only to rally back to take the lead and then suffer a heart-breaking loss. Auburn actually has the better ypp margin (+2.8 vs +2.0).

Tulane 35 UAB 21. Two coaches and programs heading in opposite directions. We think UAB head coach Trent Dilfer will be let go by the end of the season after another embarrassment last week. Meanwhile, Tulane crushed USF 45-10 under first-year coach Jon Sumrall. The early week money has been on Tulane here.

Clemson 30 FLORIDA STATE 17. What a difference six weeks makes. Prior to the season, FSU was around a 4-point favorite in this game at most sportsbooks. Now they are a double-digit home underdog for only the 4th time since 1990. Clemson did beat them here 59-10 in 2018 as 18.5-point favorites. Brock Glenn will get the Noles with DJ Uiagalalei sidelined possibly for the season. The Tigers have won and covered 3 straight since the season opening loss to Georgia. We took the 14.5 with FSU. God help us.

Ole Miss 31 SOUTH CAROLINA 21. How will Ole Miss respond to the upset loss to Kentucky last week? Does Lane Kiffin have one foot out the door to Florida like the rumors are suggesting? What we do know is the Ole Miss defense has a huge edge here. The Rebels are No. 1 in the country with 53 TFL's already. Meanwhile, the Gamecocks are off a bye and should get back QB Sellers here. However, their OL is allowing 16 sacks, 3rd worst in the country.

COASTAL CAROLINA 31 Old Dominion 24. ODU comes in off the stunning upset win at Bowling Green last week where they scored a TD in the final seconds. They're taking on a Coastal team fresh off a bye. ODU is running the 2nd fastest tempo in the country but their offense ranks just No. 124 in yards per play. We don't think they can keep up with Coastal here.

Western Michigan 35 BALL STATE 27. Ball State's defense is allowing 8.7 yards per play, 525.8 yards per game and 49 points per game. No defense has taken a further step back in recent memory considering how well they performed down the stretch last year. Now they get a WMU offense that came up short in the red zone vs Marshall last week. We like the OVER which is 4-0 in Ball State games this year.

NC STATE 31 Wake Forest 24. Both teams have been extremely disappointing this season. NC State's offense only managed 171 yards last week but somehow they beat Northern Illinois. Wake did suffer a loss to a Group of 5 team as they fell to UL-Lafayette 41-38. This is their first road trip of the season. As of now, we're not involved.

TOLEDO 25 Miami, OH 21. A rematch of last year's MAC Championship where Miami, OH pulled the upset. The Rockets come in off a bye while Miami survived UMass in OT. The Redhawks have played the much tougher schedule (No. 36 vs No. 147 in Sagarin). We bet them on the Sunday openers and still would at current.

MARSHALL 31 Appalachian State 27. We're not sure the mental state of Appalachian State considering the massive flooding that hit Boone, NC last week and cancelled last week's game vs Liberty. On the field, the App State defense is allowing 7.0 yards per play (No. 130) and 35.8 ppg (No. 126). They're taking on a Marshall team that is 4-0 ATS this season and has a much better ypp margin (+0.4 vs -1.0) despite playing a tougher schedule. We like Marshall.

GEORGIA TECH 31 Duke 22. We like the spot here for GT coming off a bye taking on a surprising 5-0 Duke team that is off a dramatic win over rival North Carolina. The Blue Devils trailed 20-0 in the 3rd quarter. GT has played the tougher schedule and has a better ypp margin (+1.5 vs +1.2). We expected a little cheaper line though as the market is all over this.

Bowling Green 33 AKRON 19. How will BG respond after the shocking last second loss to ODU last week? Akron ranks No. 130 in ypp margin, No. 131 in ypg margin and No. 132 in scoring margin. We can trust BG as a big underdog (see Penn State and Texas A&M), can we trust them as a big favorite?

VIRGINIA 27 Boston College 24. BC QB Thomas Castellanos was a late-week scratch. The Eagles barely survived without him beating Western Kentucky 21-20. BC trailed 20-7 in the 4Q. Castellanos returns here but is facing a fresh UVA team off a bye. We lean with UVA here as BC is playing a 6th straight week and has been involved in 3 straight games decided in the final minute.

NORTHERN ILLINOIS 31 Massachusetts 14. Both teams suffered tough-luck losses last week. UMass fell in OT at Miami, OH and NIU has lost two straight since their biggest win in school history. The Huskies are No. 12 in ypp margin at +198 despite a 2-2 record. However, they are not the type of team we want to lay 3 scores with.

Navy 23 AIR FORCE 14. If you blindly bet the UNDER in every Service Academy matchup you are on a 44-9-1 run. However, this Navy offense ranks No. 5 in the country in yards per play and No. 9 in scoring at 46 ppg. Their games are 4-0 to the OVER this year by 3 TD's per game. AF has been a total mess but we actually lean OVER here.

Alabama 42 VANDERBILT 17. Obviously a flat spot here for Alabama off the emotional 60-minute effort vs Georgia. Vanderbilt is off a bye and already upset Virginia Tech and nearly upset Missouri this season. We think the flat spot is priced into the market but we do like the OVER with two mobile QB's and an Alabama defense that we think has taken a step back.

Indiana 27 NORTHWESTERN 16. We've upgraded Indiana more than any team in CFB this year. IU ranks in the top 7 in ypp margin, ypg margin and scoring margin. The Hoosiers were -4 in TO's last week and still won and covered vs Maryland. This is only the 8th time since 2000 that they find themselves a double-digit road favorite (7-0 SU/4-3 ATS). Northwestern is off a bye. This game will be played at the lake-side stadium and we've seen UNDER money again.

BOISE STATE 45 Utah State 20. Boise State RB Ashton Jeanty should be in New York for the Heisman this season. He already has 845 rushing yards and is averaging 10.3 yards per carry. We believe this is the best Group of 5 team in the country but they are coming off a big win over Washington State while Utah State was on a bye.

ARIZONA STATE 27 Kansas 26. ASU was a double-digit underdog when this line was posted in the summer. However, the Sun Devils are 3-1 straight up and Kansas enters 1-4 SU/0-5 ATS failing to cover by 8.4 ppg. Kansas still has a +0.7 ypp margin and we feel like this is their last stand to turn around their season.

Miami, FL 33 CALIFORNIA 21. Raise your hand if you had ESPN College Gameday going to this matchup in the preseason? Miami enters unbeaten after a dramatic win over Virginia Tech last Friday which had some controversy. The Hurricanes rank No. 4 in ypp and ypg margins. 3-1 Cal enters off a bye. They are allowing just 12.8 ppg and have forced more TO's (39) than any team in CFB the last two seasons. We lean Miami as we feel they got their scare last week.

SAN JOSE STATE 29 Nevada 23. Both teams have first-year head coaches and both have over-achieved so far this season. San Jose State is 4-0 ATS covering by 10.8 ppg. They are +1.4 in ypp margin (No. 36). However, we have seen money come in on Nevada so far this week as the Wolf Pack have played the tougher schedule.

Virginia Tech 30 STANFORD 22. Stanford QB Ashton Daniels is questionable for this game. That's why we've seen some early week money on the Hokies. Speaking of the Hokies they are an extremely disappointing 2-3 on the season but come in off their best performance in the near-upset of Miami. Does that emotion loss give them confidence or did it break them?

ARIZONA 35 Texas Tech 27. This is one of our strongest power ratings plays this week. Despite playing a tougher schedule, Arizona is +1.9 in ypp margin while Texas Tech is +0.0. The Red Raiders have won 3 games by one possession at home this year. The only time they went on the road was a 3-TD loss at Washington State. This Arizona team is better and the Wildcats are off an impressive upset over Utah.

Tennessee 35 ARKANSAS 24. The Vols come in off a bye. Tennessee is 4-0 ATS this season with a cover margin of 21.6 ppg. They rank No. 3 in ypp margin, No. 1 in ypg margin (+390) and No. 1 in scoring margin (+47.0). They've already went away from home and have taken care of NC State and Oklahoma. Arkansas has two losses this year where they had a 648-385 yard edge at Oklahoma State and a 379-297 yard edge vs Texas A&M last week. We lean with them here.

Army 31 TULSA 20. Army finds themselves a double-digit road favorite for the 2nd week in a row. They passed last week's test easily as they hammered Temple 42-14. The Black Knights rank in the Top 20 in ypp and ypg margins and have the 10th best scoring margin at +25.8. Tulsa is off a 52-20 loss to North Texas as only a TD underdog. Their pass defense has been their weakness which probably won't be exploited here. We bet Army early in the week but are passing now.

IOWA STATE 30 Baylor 17. Baylor comes in off back-to-back close losses. How many more can head coach Aranda suffer before his eventual firing? Iowa State ranks in the Top 20 in ypp, ypg and scoring margins. However, head coach Campbell is not our favorite coach to back when it comes to laying double-digits. Pass.

OKLAHOMA STATE 33 West Virginia 30. A lot of money has come in on West Virginia in this one. It's a nice spot for the Mountaineers who come in off a bye. Meanwhile, Oklahoma State is playing a 6th straight week and are off back-to-back games vs ranked teams. West Virginia has the better ypp margin as Oklahoma State's defense leaves a lot to be desired allowing 481 ypp (No. 130).

CONNECTICUT 33 Temple 16. Connecticut has covered 4 straight games by an average of 29 ppg. They've destroyed FAU and Buffalo at home the last two weeks and those teams are better than this Temple team that could be playing a 3rd string QB.

TEXAS A&M 26 Missouri 23. This is the biggest strength of schedule disparity (A&M No. 27 vs. Mizzou No. 143) this week. The Tigers are making their first road trip of the season but are off a bye. Their defense ranks in the Top 10 in ypp, ypg and ppg but haven't faced a good offense yet. We're not sure this A&M offense is good although they've won 4 straight games after losing to Notre Dame in the opener. Not a lot of value here and keep an eye on A&M QB Weigman's status, we'd actually lean Missouri if he were to play.

James Madison 32 UL-MONROE 17. A pair of 1st-year coaches that have greatly exceeded expectations so far. ULM has a pair of big outright upset wins already including last week at Troy and have surpassed their season win total of 2.5. Meanwhile, James Madison's offense has scored 133 points the last two weeks and they have covered the spread by a combined 65 points. ULM runs the slowest tempo in CFB and we think they can limit JMU's possessions.

UL-Lafayette 34 SOUTHERN MISS 21. We like the spot here for Southern Miss off the bye after a -5 TO margin. Meanwhile, ULL comes in off the upset win over Wake Forest. Anything above 2 TD's is worth a bet.

NEBRASKA 24 Rutgers 18. Rutgers had the most misleading win of last week (see page 1 misleading finals). The Scarlet Knights are 4-0 but are just No. 74 in ypp margin. Nebraska is +1.8 in ypp margin (No. 23) and should have beat Purdue by more last week. It is tough laying a full TD here though with such a low total and a pair of Nebraska kickers that have combined for 5 misses already this season.

South Alabama 31 ARKANSAS STATE 30. This is a nice spot for Arkansas State who comes in off a bye while South Alabama is playing their 3rd straight road game. Statistically, the Jags are the much better team as they are +0.5 in ypp margin while Arkansas State is -2.2 (No. 128). There's been a back and forth battle in the market on this game. We lean with Arkansas State.

Use 31 MINNESOTA 20. This is not the best spot for USC who is coming off back-to-back physical games with Michigan and Wisconsin and have Penn State on deck. While the Minnesota defense ranks No. 6 in ypp and No. 5 in total defense they have not faced any offense that has the skill and the pass game that USC has. Keep an eye on the wind forecast in the upper Midwest this week. Obviously, this would impact USC more.

WASHINGTON 22 Michigan 19. Michigan has played the tougher schedule but this is their first road game of the season. Washington has the far better ypp (+3.2 vs +0.5) and ypg margins (+219.6 vs -7.4). Michigan is 2-0 in close games the last two weeks vs USC and Minnesota while Washington is 0-2 in close games this year including an extremely misleading loss at Rutgers last week (see page 1). Washington gets revenge for last year's National Championship.

OHIO STATE 33 Iowa 13. This is by far Ohio State's toughest opponent to date as the Buckeyes have embarrassingly played the No. 131 toughest schedule so far. To their credit, they are No. 2 in ypp margin, No. 3 in ypg margin and No. 2 in scoring margin. Iowa's offense is improved this year thanks to RB Kaleb Johnson as the Hawkeyes are running for 250 ypg (just 116 last year). Again, they will face their stiffest test of the season here. We've seen some OVER money in this game as Iowa games are 4-0 to the OVER this year.

OREGON STATE 31 Colorado State 18. In every game this season, the money has come in against Oregon State and this week is no exception as this line opened Oregon State -13. We find it a little surprising considering the Beavers 3-1 record and they are off a bye. We're not buying Colorado State under Jay Norvell. His offense ranks No. 119 in scoring.

SAN DIEGO STATE 24 Hawaii 23. San Diego State got a lot of money in the market last week. It was the right side as they "only" lost to Central Michigan by 1 after leading most of the game. Hawaii comes in off a bye. We're like the UNDER here as each team is only averaging 41 total points per game this season.

PENN STATE 38 UCLA 10. UCLA QB Ethan Garbers is questionable for this game after getting hurt in last week's game vs Oregon. This is the 4th straight Top 25 team that UCLA has played in our power ratings. Will James Franklin be conservative knowing he has the big game vs USC on deck? We're passing.

WISCONSIN 31 Purdue 17. Purdue is not in a good spot after going 0-3 SU and ATS the last 3 games getting easily handled in each game. They fired their OC Graham Harrell and Jason Simmons is the interim. This is a "buy low" spot for Wisconsin after back-to-back losses vs Alabama and USC. Last week, they led the Trojans 21-10 at halftime before getting outscored 28-0 after the break.

Week 6 Computer Projected Lines for Every CFB Game

For the past eight seasons we have posted computer projected lines for every game on Wednesday. **Games where there was of difference of more than 3 points saw our computer lines actually beat the Vegas line at a 487-414-14 (54.1%) clip!** That's pretty solid and actually better than our own handicapping in some seasons. Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots or if there are late-week injuries. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

This year's record is a pathetic 7-14 so far. Of the 3 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be **Arizona -6**.

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.

We think it's the best value bets we make all week. 2020 was the first season where we tracked every single bet we made and posted them in the weekly newsletters. We were very pleased with our 119-76-3 (61%) record on these Sunday bets with an average line value of 2.6 ppg! In 2021, we were 224-196-5 (53.3%) vs the Circa openers with an average line value of 1.8 ppg. In 2022, we were 314-262-14 (54.5%, CLV 417-122-51 +1.65 ppg). Last year we were 405-358-6 (53.4%, CLV 577-137-55 +2.09 ppg). Below is some of what we bet already. ATLANTA 23 Tampa Bay 20. Winner takes the early lead in the NFC South. Both come in off wins. Atlanta won 26-24 (didn't cover) over New Orleans. The Falcons did have a +1.0 ypp margin. Meanwhile Tampa Bay pounded Philadelphia 33-16 at home. The Bucs had a 445-227 yard edge and were +1.9 in ypp margin. Atlanta has played the tougher schedule and has the better year-to-date ypp margin (+0.9 vs +0.2). We lean with the home team.

Sunday, October 6th

† **Minnesota 21 N.Y. JETS 20.** @*Tottenham Hotspur Stadium in London, England.* The first London game of the year. The Jets come in desperate having lost at home to Denver last week 10-9. The Jets defense limited the Broncos to just 186 yards but somehow NYJ lost outright as 8-point home favorites. Meanwhile, Minnesota is the only team in the NFL to be 4-0 SU and ATS on the season. The Vikings raced out to a big lead last week and held on in Green Bay 31-29 as 2.5-point road underdogs. Minnesota is better in ypp margin and has played the tougher schedule. However, the spot says the Jets for us.

CHICAGO 21 Carolina 18. Somehow the Bears are 2-2 on the season despite a -1.2 ypp margin. Last week they were outgained and were -0.7 in ypp but were +2 in TO's in their win over the Rams. Now they face a Carolina team that came back to earth last week in their 10-point home loss to the Bengals. The Panthers have a better ypp margin and we still don't trust the Bears laying more than a FG.

Baltimore 25 CINCINNATI 24. The Ravens destroyed the Bills on SNF last week 35-10. Baltimore had a 427-236 yard edge and were a shocking +3.8 in ypp margin. Meanwhile, the Bengals got their first win of the season 34-24 at Carolina. We feel both of these teams are underrated. At 2-2, the Ravens have the best ypp margin in the NFL and rank No. 2 in DVOA. The 1-3 Bengals are +0.7 in ypp margin and we believe are an above average team. We lean with the division home dog and hope a +3 shows later in the week.

HOUSTON 24 Buffalo 23. The Texans are somehow 3-1 SU despite a 0-4 ATS mark. They should have covered last week in the box score as they had 122 yard and +1.0 ypp edges vs Jacksonville. They're playing a Buffalo team that was embarrassed by Baltimore last week on SNF. We think Buffalo is the slightly better team but not enough to make them a 1-point road favorite here. Lean Texans.

JACKSONVILLE 23 Indianapolis 22. Jacksonville is the only winless team in the NFL right now. This line is telling you they are the right side in this one. Despite a -1.0 ypp margin vs Indy's +0.7 (Indy also played the tougher schedule), the Jags are 3-point home favorites. Joe Flacco got the win for the Colts last week and likely starts here. Is he that big of a downgrade vs Anthony Richardson? Is he actually an upgrade? We lean Colts

NEW ENGLAND 17 Miami 17. This is about as bad as it gets. The Pats are dead last in ypp margin at -1.8. They were destroyed by the 49ers last week with a -3.7 ypp margin. On the other side, we think Miami head coach Mike McDaniels is by far the most overrated coach in the league (0-4 ATS). The Dolphins suffered an embarrassing 31-12 loss to the Titans on MNF where they managed only 184 yards of offense. Tyler Huntley looks like he will get the start again here? Neither team deserves to be picked as a straight up winner.

WASHINGTON 24 Cleveland 20. The Browns have played the weakest schedule in the NFL so far but yet find themselves 1-3 despite being favored in 3 of their 4 games. Deshaun Watson is dead-last in QBR for the season while Washington rookie Jayden Daniels is No. 4 in QBR. That was a shocking blowout win over the Cardinals on a short week traveling after shocking Cincinnati on MNF. Our NFL guys are telling us that Cleveland is the right side here. We don't trust it.

DENVER 20 Las Vegas 17. Despite pulling their 2nd outright upset of the season, we don't like what we're hearing out of Raiders headquarters. Davante Adams is asking for a trade and we think Maxx Crosby will be out again this week (or at least far less than 100%). The Broncos come in off back-to-back upsets over Tampa Bay and the Jets but are now favored for the first time this season. How will they handle expectations? They have played the tougher schedule and +0.1 in ypp margin while the Raiders are -0.6.

SAN FRANCISCO 29 Arizona 20. The 49ers got back on track in a big way last week as they pummeled the lowly Patriots. Despite a 2-2 record, San Francisco is +0.9 in ypp margin. They're playing an Arizona team that is 1-3 and off 3 straight home games. They were destroyed by the Commanders last week. We don't think it gets any better here.

Green Bay 25 L.A. RAMS 22. The Rams are in desperation mode at 1-3. They had a 322-264 yard edge last week but lost to the Bears 24-18. For the season they are -1.2 in ypp margin. Meanwhile, the Packers got back QB Jordan Love last week. There was some rust early before he almost led the huge comeback. The Packers are +0.8 in ypp margin. We don't see much value in this one.

SEATTLE 24 N.Y. Giants 17. How could you not be impressed with this young Seattle staff? The Seahawks are 3-1 and +1.2 in ypp margin. The same can't be said of this Giants staff these days. After impressing in year one, it's been all down hill. Even with extra time to prep (off Thursday night vs Seattle off Monday night), we lean with the home favorites here. Giants games are 4-0 to the UNDER this year.

PITTSBURGH 23 Dallas 21. Obviously one of the better matchups for the NFL traditionalists with these two meeting up in 3 different Super Bowls. We don't expect either back in the big game this year as we feel both are overrated. The 2-2 Cowboys do have extra time to prep after winning last Thursday. They've been better away from home at 2-0 this year. Meanwhile, the Steelers are dead even in ypp margin despite a 3-1 record. We think Dallas would be a good teaser play.

Monday, October 7th

KANSAS CITY 24 New Orleans 20. A lot of back and forth in the market on this game. The 4-0 Chiefs are just +0.1 in ypp margin this year. All 4 of their wins have come by 7 points or less. Meanwhile the Saints are +0.2 in ypp margin. The Saints' two wins are via blowout and their two losses are by a combined 5 points. KC has played the tougher schedule but we don't think they will get margin here.
