EAGLE SEWER DISTRICT FORCE MAIN – EAGLE, IDAHO

Wednesday, October 30th 2019
12:00 p.m. – 1 p.m.
Downtown US Bank Building – Room 200

T-O Engineers assisted the Eagle Sewer District (ESD) with a force main project to provide adequate capacity for the ultimate buildout of their entire service area. The 24-inch HDPE sewer main runs along SH-44 through the heart of Eagle, Idaho across three different developments with two river crossings. This project connects the ESD treatment facility to the West Boise Wastewater Treatment Works. The project includes several horizontal directional drilling crossings, extensive permitting with ITD, IDL, ACOE, and the City of Eagle. The project construction cost is estimated to exceed \$8 million. Phase 1 and 2 have been completed, Phases 3 and 4 are in progress.
