So....., everyone is talking about Corona Virus

(COVID-19).

What should I be doing (or not doing) about it?

- 1) Don't panic. We will get through this.
- All of your local Health Care Systems are ramping up to deal with scenarios from "no problem" to "big problem."
- 3) All of your local Health
 Care Systems have
 emergency plans for
 earthquakes, epidemics,
 and system failures
 (electric, water, etc).
 Health care is the original
 "Plan for the worst, hope
 for the best". We will do
 our best for you.
- 4) Since you have chronic heart and lung disease, it is important to be careful.
- 5) Wash your hands as many times as you can during the day and avoid touching your face, eyes, and lips.
- Limit the amount of time you are in large, crowded public places.
- 7) You don't need a mask.

 Leave these for health care
 workers that are face to
 face with infected patients.

- If you do feel ill, it is still more likely to be the common cold.
- 9) Don't immediately go to an urgent care or hospital if you are mildly ill. Only go to the ER for things you would normally go to the ER without the Corona virus outbreak.
- 10) IF you do go to a health care facility with the suspicion you have Corona Virus, put on a mask as quickly as possible and tell the health care intake worker immediately.
- 11) Use the Centers for Disease Control (https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/index.html) for up to date information.
- 12) Los Angeles County has a very robust public health system.

LA County EMS Agency Disaster Services

Out of the tens of thousands of travelers screened in the US the past 7 weeks, there are only 129 patients that are being treated in 16 states. Eleven (11) people have died, ten (10) in Washington State and recently one (1) in Northern California. In comparison current CDC statistics show that 14,000 people died and 250,000 people were hospitalized so far during the 2019-2020 flu season. So although there is legitimate concern regarding COVID-19, there is no widespread community outbreak in the US like there has been in other countries."

16) COVID-19 testing will becoming more available in the next week to 10 days as LabCorp and Quest (commercial labs) begin large scale testing.

Things will be changing quickly, so keep up with local news reports and information.
