

Cream Dot


2 rectangles (A) 11/4" x 43/4" 1 rectangle (B) 11/2" x 111/4" 2 rectangles (C) 11/8" x 10" 2 rectangles (D) 13/4" x 121/2" sections 1 and 1 reversed, patches 1, 4 and 5 sections 2 and 2 reversed, patches 2 and 3 sections 3 and 3 reversed, patches 1 and 4 Green Print and Red Print from each sections 1 and 1 reversed, patches 2 and 3 sections 2 and 2 reversed, patches 2 and 3 sections 1 and 1 reversed, patches 2 and 3 sections 2 and 2 reversed, patches 2 and 3 sections 2 and 2 reversed, patches 1

sections 3 and 3 reversed, patches 2 and 3

Each shoe is made from 3 sections. Make 2 paper copies of each foundation and reversed foundation section.

Make 1 shoe and 1 reversed shoe from each color. Foundation piece the sections in numerical order, pressing and trimming after each patch addition.


Join the sections to make each shoe. Join the shoes with patches A−D as shown to complete the block.

Saturday 12 May Speed Classes

May's Program will be a series of "Speed Classes'. This is a round robin event where members visit several mini classes, demonstrations, and view antique sewing tools.

VOLUNTEER GUILD MEMBERS

will host, entertain and teach quilting techniques in one event. "Stations" will be visited in timed intervals. Come learn something new. See new equipment. Learn a new "trick." Have some fun seeing what your fellow guild members can do!



Round Robin Mini Demos

Paper Piecing – It is a technique of machine stitching your fabric directly onto paper. You can achieve perfect points if you position your fabric correctly and sew perfect straight lines. It is also known as Foundation Paper Piecing. Binding Techniques – A strip of fabric that is sewn over the edges of the quilt after the quilt has been quilted. Binding adds extra strength and support to a quilt, and this is when a quilt is considered finished by many quilters.

Machine Quilting – Sewing through all three layers of the quilt top with a sewing machine. It is usually done with a walking foot or a darning foot. Or a professional!



ANTIQUE TOOLS a collection of vintage/antique sewing and quilting tools plus two old pedestal sewing cabinets.



Fabric Cutters/ Die-cutting – The process of cutting layers of fabric by rolling it through a die-cutting machine, which is a time-saving alternative to rotary cutting.
