EDITORIAL

UNTO THEM SHALL HE APPEAR

"And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment: So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation." Hebrews 9:27-28

Christ; the sinless one; the holy one; the only begotten of the heavenly Father was offered to take upon Himself and bear the sins of many once and for all. Never again would it be necessary for the priests to offer the blood of animals for the sins of mankind. Again in the book of Hebrews we see these glowing words of truth, "How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God, purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?"

If we believe in God; if we believe in the Son of God; if we believe in the gospel of redemption through Christ's sacrificial atonement these scriptures mean everything to us. We might as it were place ourselves alongside the hundred and twenty believers who followed Jesus up mount Olivet, who listened to his final words of instructions: "And, behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you: but tarry ye in the

city of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with power from on high." "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen." (Luke 24:49 Mark 16:15b Matthew 18:19-20)

This small band of one hundred twenty Christians believed the words of the Lord. After Jesus' ascension, they returned to Jerusalem and tarried until the day of Pentecost. When God verified His promise they were there to receive the gift of the promised Holy Spirit.

These hundred twenty Christians were stunned when they saw their Lord and Master disappearing into heaven. But when the angels stood by them and assured them that this Jesus, this same Jesus should return as they had seen him disappear, they believed the report. All of the remaining days of their lives they looked forward to the return of their Lord and Master.

Consecrated Christians of all ages have believed this report! As we in

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our minds at the present moment place ourselves alongside the original one hundred twenty Christians and the millions of Christians who have died in faith, we believe the report of His return. If we believe the report, we are looking for His coming.

What did the one hundred twenty Christians do? They returned to Jerusalem, waited for the promise, and after they received the promise of the Holy Spirit--- "And they went forth, and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following. Amen." (Matthew 16:20)

Often the invitation hymn is sung, "There's a bright day coming, A bright day coming, There's a bright day coming bye and bye, But its brightness shall only shine to them that love the Lord. Are you ready for that day to come?"

The Second Coming of Christ is only a vague story to many people in the world. Certainly, they have heard it but they cannot comprehend it. But there are those that believe! Psalms 69:30, "I will praise the name of God with a song, and will magnify him with thanksgiving."

Can God forget His own? No, a thousand times, NO!! All He asks that we magnify His name and point the lost to Christ. We are all in need of hours of thanksgiving, times of refreshings and days of praise to Him who is worthy of all praise. Never let a nonchalant idea rule the day, for God is worthy of all worship and praise and thanksgiving.

We cannot feel that another has so much more than we, that we harbor a feeling that God has not judged equal or that He is a respecter of persons, but we must come before Him, thankful.

There is a word, "parvis", meaning the enclosure about a church, and even this was to be entered into with praise. Perhaps the modern way of transportation has killed the beauty of the approach to the gates of His House. Perhaps the lack of beautiful church-yards and church buildings has hindered some in the way of worship. Let us thank Him from our homes, or zones of occupation, and give glory to His name. Let each highway become a "Highway of Life" on which we can praise the Lord. With the bitter or sweet, with the

night or day, with the cold or the heat, it is needful to send up thanksgiving to our God. It has been said, that a man complained because he had no shoes until he met a man who had no feet.

Are we taking notice of the little things of life that make the whole sweeter? **Psalms 107:21, "Oh that men would praise the Lord for his goodness, and for his wonderful works to the children of men!"** Men may dream and fancy and scheme without Christ, but He is the center of the universe. Life in the past was of His wish, the life we live today is by faith. Death does not end it all—only for a moment the shadows fall then the light of His eternal day will bring praise and worship beyond our present expression. Think of the voice of the ten thousand times ten thousand and thousands of thousands, plus the beasts and the elders and the angels that will cry saying. **"Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power, and riches, and wisdom, and strength and honour, and glory and blessing."** Rev. 5:9-12.

I am glad that we have a special Thanksgiving Day, but I am also thankful to the Lord that we have many days, even all the days of our accountable life to praise and thank Him, from whom all blessings flow. Shouts of victory will follow the theme of perfect praise and thanksgiving. My prayer is for the Lord to make me more thankful and to express those thanks to Him before all men.

The Manifestation of the Spirit

The first of a series on "The Gifts of the Spirit"

In First Corinthians, chapter twelve, nine manifestations or gifts of the Holy Spirit are listed. There are three gifts of revelation: (1) the gift of the word of wisdom, (2) the gift of the word of knowledge, and (3) the gift of the discerning of spirits; three gifts of power: (1) the gift of faith, (2) the gifts of healing, and (3) the gift of the working of miracles; three vocal gifts or gifts of utterance: (1) the gift of prophecy, (2) the gift of different kinds of tongues, and (3) the gift of interpretation of tongues. All these gifts are miraculous and supernatural in their origin and nature. They cannot be acquired by study and human effort. The fact that they are not attainable through human effort is plainly shown by the following scriptures: "For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; to another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit; to another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another the interpretation of tongues: but all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will."

The gifts of the Spirit are not given to be used for selfish purposes or for vain display but for the common

good. I Cor. 12:7, James Moffat translates this verse as follows: "Each receives his manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." It is the purpose of God that Christians should do the works that Jesus did. John 14:12. Jesus was as dependant upon God for power to do the works that He did as you and I are. John 5:19, 30; John 14:10. He did His mighty works through the power of the Holy Spirit. Matt. 12:28; Luke 4:14, 18; Acts 10:38. All New Testament miracles were performed on the basis of faith and the power of the Holy Spirit. Gal. 3:5; Acts 3:16; Acts 13:9-11; I Cor. 12:9-11.

Gifts of the Spirit are being manifested in the Church today. But no one can seriously say that they are as common as they were in the days of the early Church following the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost. Many people are being healed by the power of God in answer to believing prayer, but where are the mighty works such as Jesus did and such as the disciples did as recorded in the book of Acts? Mighty miracles are few indeed today.

One of the most prominent preachers of divine healing in America today freely admits that he would be quite happy if one-fourth of the sick for whom he prays would be healed. He hides the badly deformed and

very serious cases from public view. Almost all of them return home disappointed and sometimes heartbroken. We are not saying this by way of criticism, but to draw attention to the fact that we have a long way to go to reach the standard set by Jesus himself. If all the gifts of the Spirit were in full manifestation the church would be doing all the works that Jesus did. The hard cases, so-called hopeless cripples, who truly look to the Lord for deliverance, would be healed, and sometimes every sick person, without exception, would be healed. Acts 5:12-16.

The gift of the discerning of spirits, as well as all the other gifts, need to be in full operation in order to give us a true Apostolic ministry.

There are several reasons based on the Scriptures that lead us to believe that we can expect mighty outpourings of the Holy Spirit on the true Church before the return of Jesus. Let us examine some of the things Peter said in his great sermon on the day of Pentecost. When the people couldn't understand about the outpouring of the Holy Spirit with the attendant speaking in other tongues, they asked the question, "What meaneth this?" Peter answered, "This is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel: and it shall come to pass in the last days saith God, I will pour out of my Spirit upon all flesh: And your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams: And on my servants and on my handmaidens I will pour out in those days of my Spirit; and they shall prophesy: And I will shew wonders in heaven above, and signs in earth beneath; blood, and fire, and vapour of smoke: the sun shall turn into darkness and the moon into blood, before that great and notable day of the Lord come: And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved." It is quite evident from the language used in Peter's sermon on that occasion that there was no complete and exhaustive fulfillment of Joel's prophecy on the day of Pentecost. Nothing is said about signs in heaven, or about the blood, and fire, and vapour (or "Pillars" in Joel 2:30) of smoke at the time of the first outpouring. What is more suggestive of nuclear explosions than mushroom-like pillars of smoke and blood just

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What Will You Do With Jesus ? ?

"For God so loved the world that He gave His **only begotten Son** that **whosoever believeth in him** should not perish but have **everlasting life**. John 3:16.

I will again ask the question that has been asked many times. "Are you saved?" In most cases the answer is, "I don't know." How can you be sure that you are saved? We find in Mark 11:22-24. "And Jesus answering saith unto them, Have faith in God. For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith. Therefore I say unto you, what things soever you desire, when you pray, believe that you receive them, and ye shall have them." One of the most important steps to salvation is faith in God. Some may say, "I am afraid that God will not forgive me because of my many sins."

When a sinner comes to Jesus with a repentant heart and believes that God is able and willing to remove your sins and remember them against you no more. What more could one ask?

Satan knows when to tempt a person, because he knows every person's weakness. If he can cause doubts to drive out our faith he certainly will. Possibly every young Christian is confronted with this question: "**Am I really saved?**" If Satan can make you doubt, he'll have you exactly where he wants you. Do not give him the benefit of one doubt! Keep your faith in Jesus! When Jesus comes into your heart there will be no doubt. You are saved—**SAVED!**

When you are saved there is such a wonderful feeling that comes into your heart and life. I am sure that no one, including myself, could express all that we felt when our sins were washed away. When you are under a heavy weight you want desperately to have that weight lifted.

When you are in sin the feeling is the same. But after you are saved that weight and burden of sin is gone. You feel free and at the same time you gain the dearest Friend you will ever have. Jesus will take your burden and leave you with a song. You can have a **know-so** salvation, simply by believing that Jesus can bring you out of darkness into light.

What are you doing with Jesus?

Many people today believe in all sincerity that by going to church each Sunday morning and doing what they please during the week is pleasing to God. They convince themselves that God should not expect them to go to church but once a week. Keeping our Christian life in line does not entirely depend on church attendance, whether it be two, three, or even four times a week. If it is possible to go that often, certainly you should, because church attendance is important and you cannot

We just received our Report and enjoyed reading it very much. May the Lord bless your every effort toward publishing the gospel.

We enjoyed Bro. Adair's ministry and feel his coming was a blessing to our church. Response of the people was not the best, but we feel the effort toward the special meetings was well worth while.

God has blessed the work here this summer with a better Sunday School attendance than we have had for about five years. Beginning in March we averaged over 100 each month and this is much better than our usual attendance. The Lord has given a few souls along and we have had the privilege of baptizing 19 or 20 in water. At present we are engaged in a building effort toward doubling the size of the basement. We have the walls up and the weather is pressing us to get the rest done as soon as possible. The new addition is 48 feet long and same width (32 feet) as the building. Present building is 32 by 50. It will provide some class rooms and space to grow into. It is a real step by faith when normal operating costs for the winter are quite high but I feel the Lord has been in the effort. The radio ministry continues to reach out to quite a number of people. Pray for this radio ministry.

Last year we had planned to leave Alaska by Spring. We sold our house and bought a house trailer. It seems the Lord has had other plans for us as not much headway could be made toward making the move. I'm still praying and have my future committed to the Lord as to where we should work. I do plan to come to the States within the next 5 or 6 months if I can work it out some way. I had hoped to fly the plane down and use it to get around while visiting some of the churches. I don't know if that will work out or not. Your prayers for the guidance of the Lord would be appreciated.

Pray for us. The Lord richly bless you all is our prayer.

II Peter 3:10-11, "But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in the which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up. Seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved, what manner of persons ought ye to be in all holy conversation and godliness."

The coming of Jesus will be as a thief to the ones who are not prepared. I suppose you read in the paper about the smog in London, how the people got panicky thinking that the end of the world was coming. In 1941, I believe it was, when Orson Welles put on a radio program called, "The Invasion From Mars;" we were in Wichita at the time, and people were so alarmed that they were kneeling in the streets seeking God. This is one of the peculiarities of human nature. When things are rocking smoothly, people forget God, but when the going gets rough, they begin to call on the Lord.

Yes, you have been in services and I have, too where the Spirit of the Lord was so very present and sweet—and the services were so sacred and the presence of Jesus so very near, that you just wanted to remain quiet in His presence, but I'm sure that even this, though a rich, precious experience, is nothing to be compared to His actual presence. Now for verse 11, "Seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved, what manner of persons ought ye to be in all holy conversation and godliness." Many people have taken the attitude that they will just rock along until they see things reach a climax—see the Jews fill their place in prophecy, etc., and then they will get ready. Beloved, then it will be too late. We as Children of the King know that we should be ready at all times.

Verse 12, "Looking for and hastening unto the coming of the day of God." Notice the word hastening—rushing—in a hurry to get there. Many times when I have been gone from home on a trip for some time, I would be so anxious to get home to the wife and children that the last hundred miles or so I would find myself rushing—my foot getting a little heavy on the accelerator unconsciously. Then every thought was, "I'll soon be home—just a few more hours." Hastening! Christians should feel that way about the coming of Jesus. Hastening! Longing! Desiring! Wanting His return more than anything else. Father give us grace to go on. Sure the power of the Devil will be strong, but the Promise of God is to raise up a standard against Him. Even so, come Lord Jesus, come quickly. I enjoy my family and the association of friends and loved ones, especially so since I have a real experience in salvation, but I have no ties so great, or anything so important that Jesus can't more than satisfy. He is coming soon.
