WEEKLY THOUGHTS 22nd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME SEPTMBER 1st 2024

Dear friends, welcome to the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary time and first Sunday in September 2024. Let us be thankful to God for all blessings and favors received in the past month. Let us continue to entrust ourselves to God's care, love and mercy. I am deeply thankful to you all for your generous contributions and donations to our two sister Churches, Holy Infant and Shepherd of the Hills.

For the last six weeks, we have been listening to Jesus' teaching on the discourse; "Jesus the bread from heaven giving eternal life to all who partake of his body and blood." This teaching is under the background of the miraculous feeding of over 5,000 people. These same people deserted Jesus as they found his teaching difficult to believe. Only the 12 stayed behind with him.

In today's gospel Jesus encounters the Theological commission of inquiry constituted of the Pharisees and scribes blaming Jesus for the sin of his disciples who ate bread without doing the ceremonial washing of hands.

Jesus equally criticizes the Pharisees for making the tradition equal to and as binding as the law of Moses. Jesus tells them that holiness, unclean and clean is not found in external acts alone. It comes within a person's heart other than from the food one eats.

On saying this, Jesus exposed the hypocrisy of the Pharisees and other religious leaders of the time occupied with offering lip service other than heart service or love of God and mankind. Under this background Jesus quoted Isiah; "These people pay me lip service but their hearts are far from me."

For me celebrating this Day of the Lord, I need to examine myself in regard to being honest with God and neighbor.

What about what I speak of others? Is it borne out of love, compassion or hatred and malice? Let us think of the evils our tongue and pen could cost one's reputation, respect and honor.
