

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

OF BELIEVERS AND DOUBTERS

In John's account, all of us – believers and doubters – are present at the



empty tomb. Mary of Magdala instinctively concludes, as the authorities had warned Pilate, that someone has removed Jesus' body. Even for this loving disciple, the empty tomb does not "prove" that Jesus is risen, orthat his body is missing. When Peter enters

the tomb he sees no Jesus, but only what Jesus left behind: signs of death that are not yet, for Peter, signs of life. When the beloved disciple enters, "he saw and believed," but not clearly, for the Gospel concludes, "they did not yet understand" (John 20:8-9).

Thus, in a comforting paradox, Easter morning's Gospel proclaims not Jesus' presence but Jesus' absence; yet despite that absence, belief begins to blossom. What joy for those among us who serenely believe! What comfort for those among us who wrestle with doubt! What peace even for those who rarely worship! Let us recall Pope Francis' continual challenge that we who worship weekly be especially welcoming to visitors who may not simply wonder about it at all.

Luke's Emmaus Gospel, appropriate for an afternoon or evening liturgy, models the Eucharist: two disciples trudging life's path are joined by Jesus (gathering); Jesus interprets the scriptures (Liturgy of the Word); the disciples invite Jesus to join them at table (preparation); Jesus says the blessing, and breaks the bread among them (Liturgy of the Eucharist); they glimpse Jesus, Jesus vanishes, they go forth to witness (Communion and dismissal). The experience of every generation of disciples, each Lord's Day, from the first Easter evening until this.

How will I bring the reality of having met the Risen Jesus in word, Eucharist, and others to those who may never have encountered the transforming power of his compassionate love? (Pastoral Patterns, 2017)


RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: There will be Religious Education classes this week, Tuesday, April 18th.
