No. 8 BYU came this close to scoring on the final play in a thrilling game vs No. 14 Coastal Carolina last Saturday. Both teams entered 9-0 and the game was scheduled only 3 days prior. The Chanticleers pulled off the outright upset as 10-point underdogs 22-17.

Misleading Finals

Kentucky (-11.5) beat South Carolina 41-18. However, UK only had 24-21 first down and 492-404 yard edges as they were +4 in TO's.

Akron (-3) beat Bowling Green 31-3. However, BG had a 295-282 yard edge but were -3 in TO's. Akron got a blocked punt TD, BG missed a FG and also one of their TO's came at the Akron 10-yard line. Akron broke a 21-game losing streak!

Rice (+24.5) upset Marshall 20-0. However, Marshall had 19-17 first down and 245-213 yard edges but had 5 TO's. Marshall was also stopped on downs 3 times inside Rice's 30-yard line!

UCLA (+3) upset Arizona St 25-18. However, ASU had 25-22 first down and 442-363 yard edges but were -2 in TO's. ASU missed a FG, fumbled at the UCLA 1-yard line and threw an interception at the UCLA 32.

Nevada (-6.5) beat Fresno St 37-26. However, Fresno had 30-14 first down and 599-416 yard edges.

Cal (+9) upset Oregon 21-17. However, the Ducks had a 368-271 yard edge but were -2 in TO's.

Indiana (+12.5) upset Wisconsin 14-6. However, Wisconsin had 19-15 first down and 342-217 yard edges. Both Wisconsin TO's occurred inside the Indiana 40-yard line and they were also stopped on downs at the Indiana 21 in the final minute.

Texas Tech (-26.5) only beat Kansas 16-13. However, TT had a 410-214 yard edge including 293-112 on the ground but were -4 in TO's. TT missed 3 FG's but got one with 5:36 left for the win.

Oklahoma (-23.5) beat Baylor 27-14. However, Baylor had 19-16 first down and 288-269 yard edges. The Bears missed 2 FG's and also threw 2 INT's inside the OU 40-yard line.

San Diego St (-7.5) beat Colorado St 29-17. However, Colorado St had a 265-247 yard edge but were -2 in TO's. San Diego St led 23-17 at halftime that including a 93-yard kick return TD and a 90-yard punt return TD.

Bad Beats

Florida (-18) backers got a bad beat as Tennessee trailed 31-7 in the fourth quarter but went 94 yards in 11 plays for a TD and then 96 yards in 13 plays to get the backdoor TD with :27 left.

Games in Rotation Order

Thursday, December 10th

Pittsburgh 32 GEORGIA TECH 26. The OVER has cashed in 7 straight Pitt games including in their last game vs Clemson when we recommended it on these pages. At 5-5 on the season, they need a win to increase their bowl chances. However, what is the mood on the team as they just saw another key player opt out this week in All-American DE Rashad Weaver. Meanwhile, Georgia Tech has controlled the line of scrimmage in their last two games but their pass defense has allowed 300-plus yards in each. We lean OVER.

Florida Atlantic 23 SOUTHERN MISS 16. FAU comes in off the loss to Georgia Southern last week that was closer than the 20-3 final (FAU only out-gained by 17 yards). Remarkably FAU games have averaged only 30 total ppg this year (6-1 to the UNDER). Southern Miss has seen their last two games cancelled in what has been a forgettable 2-7 season. They will have a new coach in 2021 and it will be interesting to see what frame of mind they will be in here for their finale. Note they have covered their last two games. Tough laying more than a TD on the road with FAU when they're only averaging 18 ppg on offense this season. Lean UNDER.

Friday, December 11th

NORTH TEXAS 36 UTEP 26. We've seen UTEP just one time since October 24th and they were crushed by UTSA. They looked like an improved team but that was in September. This game got moved to Denton with all the COVID issues in El Paso. Who knows what to expect from the Miners. Meanwhile, we haven't been impressed with North Texas the last few weeks other than their stud WR Jaelon Darden who leads the nation with 15 TD receptions. Number seems right to us.

MARSHALL 35 Charlotte 17. This game was just cancelled on Wednesday morning. Marshall suffered one of the biggest upsets of the season last week as they lost 20-0 as a 24.5-point favorite to Rice. It was a misleading final as Marshall had 5 TO's and were stopped on downs 3 times inside Rice's 30-yard line. Marshall QB Grant Wells had a 16-to-4 TD-to-INT ratio coming into the game but had a disastrous 0-5 ratio! How do they respond here? If FAU beats Southern Miss on Thursday, Marshall will need a win to host UTSA in the CUSA Championship game next week. Meanwhile Charlotte playing their first game in over a month, lost 37-19 at home to WKU as 3-point favorites. They're on a very short week as they played on Sunday. Not a lot to like but we would lean Charlotte.

† **San Jose St 28 Nevada 27.** Game has been moved to Sam Boyd Stadium in Las Vegas due to COVID restrictions in California. The Spartans are 5-0 for the first time since 1939 and a win here gets them in the Mountain West Championship game (a win would also do the same for Nevada). The only game San Jose hasn't covered was a push vs UNLV. Meanwhile, 6-1 Nevada just won a game with Fresno as they were outgained by nearly 200 yards. QB Carson Strong has had a "Strong" season with a 21-to-4 TD-to-INT ratio. This is the 3rd trip already to Vegas for Nevada while San Jose, off a trip to Hawaii and playing on a short week, is not in an ideal spot. We lean UNDER.

Arizona St 32 ARIZONA 20. Neither team has a win this season but at 0-2 we think Arizona St is a pretty solid team. They nearly upset USC in the opener and then after not playing for a month, they nearly beat a solid UCLA team last week after a slow start (trailed 17-0). We can't say the same for the 0-4 Wildcats who have been outgained by 96 ypg and have given up 274 rush ypg (6.1) including 407 rush yards last week to Colorado as we won on these pages fading them. If Arizona QB Grant Gunnell misses again (he is ? as of press time), note frosh QB Will Plummer is averaging just 4.6 yards per attempt and has an 0-3 ratio (54%).

Utah 26 COLORADO 24. We played on both of these teams last week on these pages and had disparate results. First, we thought we were sunk with Colorado as they trailed Arizona 13-0 early but the Buffs scored 24 unanswered and stopped a couple of drives in the red zone to move to a perfect 4-0 SU/ATS on the season. Meanwhile, we looked good with Utah vs Oregon St as the Utes led 30-10 in the fourth quarter before giving up a couple of late TD's in a non-cover. Our power ratings say Utah is one of our strongest plays of the week as we now think you're paying a premium on the red-hot Buffs.

Saturday, December 12th

Wake Forest 32 LOUISVILLE 31. We haven't seen the Demon Deacons since November 14th as they have had their last couple of games cancelled. Wake has certainly exceeded expectations this year with a 6-1 ATS record. However, it should be noted they are -6 ypg on the season as they have benefited from a +15 TO ratio. Louisville has been the exact opposite this year as the Cardinals have had a disappointing season. Despite outgaining their opponents by 71 ypg, the Cards are just 3-7 as they are -14 TO's on the year. They say TO's are mostly random but that big of a disparity would have us projecting Wake will win the turnover battle here and teams that win the turnover battle are 70% ATS in CFB the last 15 years.

FLORIDA ST 31 Duke 27. Another game that has so many question marks but we should be used to this in 2020. First, we haven't seen Florida St since November 14th in what has been a very disappointing season at 2-6 SU/ATS for first-year head coach Mike Norvell. Do they go full youth movement here after the long break? On the other side, we have a Duke team off 3 straight blowout losses including 48-0 last week to Miami. Have the Blue Devils waved the white flag on the season? It sure looks like it. One thing is for certain, it is tough backing a Duke team that is -17 in TO's this season. Pass.

Oklahoma 33 WEST VIRGINIA 20. West Virginia comes in off their worst performance of the season as they were crushed by Iowa St 42-6. "We've been in every contest until the end of the game," Mountaineers coach Neal Brown said. "That was definitely not the case. I don't know if we were in this game past the first quarter, and they soundly beat us." It might have been the 3-week layoff that did them in. WV is still only allowing 20 ppg on defense and are +125 ypg on the season. Meanwhile, after 5 straight covers, OU also looked sluggish last week in a 27-14 win over Baylor that was closer than the final. The Sooners defense has been much improved this year and is only allowing 89 rush ypg this season. That's key because the Mountaineers struggle when they can't get their run game going. They've averaged 211 yards on the ground in their wins and 64 in their losses. We lean UNDER.

1★ **Troy (plus the points) Coastal Carolina 31 TROY 21.** Really tough spot here for Coastal Carolina off their biggest win in school history and with the Sun Belt Championship game on deck. Head coach Chadwell already brought it up in the BYU post-game as he doesn't understand why his team has a game to play at Troy (postponed from last month) while the West champs UL-Lafayette have next week off before playing the title game. "How's that fair? Have y'all thought about that," Chadwell said. Meanwhile, Troy is off one of their better performances of the season, a 29-0 win over South Alabama. Too good of a spot to pass up to back the big home dog.

Cincinnati at Tulsa was cancelled due to COVID issues at Cincinnati The two teams will play each other at Cincinnati for the AAC Championship next Saturday Night.

Stanford 29 OREGON ST 26. Stanford continues to stay on the road with COVID restrictions in California. The Cardinal are off their best performance of the season in an upset at Washington as double-digit underdogs. It was a crazy week as Stanford relocated its entire program to Seattle, used a high school for practice and even had its walk through in a public park. Meanwhile, we have been impressed with Oregon St who has covered 4 straight games. Last week, they were down their starting QB and starting RB and didn't give up in a cover at Utah (trailed 30-10 4Q) much to our dismay on these pages. We lean OVER as the Cardinal are taking a step down in defensive class after playing Cal and Washington the last couple of weeks.

Texas 47 KANSAS 17. Have to give it to the Horns last week as we questioned their motivation with a couple of captains opting out prior to the game. All they did was crush Kansas St 69-31 as true frosh RB Bijan Robinson ran for 172 yards and 3 TD's. It was one of their better performances of the entire season. Meanwhile, Kansas got their first cover of the season last week in a 3-point loss to Texas Tech. Please note, TT had a 410-214 yard edge including 293-112 on the ground but were -4 in TO's and they missed 3 FG's. We lean OVER which is 7-1-1 in Kansas games and 6-3 in Texas games.

MEMPHIS 33 Houston 32. Houston hasn't played since November 14th and now they're laying more than a FG on the road? The 3-3 Cougars are an average team as their average score is 33-33 and they've been outgained by 9 ypg. They've won and covered vs the 3 worst teams on their schedule and lost and failed to cover vs the 3 best. Memphis is in between those groups. We just don't agree with this line even with Memphis just 2-7 ATS on the season. Memphis has won 4 straight and covered 5 straight in the series. Another!

Boise St 31 WYOMING 20. We thought we were going to like Wyoming here but there are too many injury concerns. QB Levi Williams was banged up in last week's shocking loss to New Mexico as 15.5-point favorites. Also their RB Xazavian Valladay did not play due to an injury to his left leg suffered during the first quarter of the UNLV game. Meanwhile, Boise has had their last two games cancelled. They still can get to the Mountain West championship game with a win here. Pass for now as we check the status of Wyoming's two key offensive players.

Oklahoma St 28 BAYLOR 22. Very disappointing effort out of Oklahoma St last week as they blew 13-0 and 16-7 leads in an upset loss to TCU much to our dismay on these pages. The loss to Texas in overtime has derailed their season as after starting 4-0 SU/3-1 ATS, they've failed to cover in 5 straight games. Meanwhile, Baylor is starting to show some life. Last week in a respectable loss at Oklahoma, Baylor had 19-16 first down and 288-269 yard edges. The Bears missed 2 FG's and also threw 2 INT's inside the OU 40-yard line. Despite those results from last week, we think this line is fair.

TCU 39 Louisiana Tech 17. This game was just added last week. Both teams surprised us last week. Louisiana Tech in their first game since Halloween showed no signs of rust in a 42-31 win at North Texas. Meanwhile, it looks like TCU has officially turned their season around as after a 1-3 start, the Horned Frogs have now won and covered 4 of their last 5 games. The Horned Frogs won and covered vs Oklahoma St last week despite being -4 in TO's! That's hard to do. Still, we're not sure we want to lay more than 3 TD's with them here vs a capable Louisiana Tech offense averaging 32 ppg. We lean OVER.

2★ COLORADO ST 34 Utah St 17. Two teams having forgettable seasons at a combined 2-8 straight up. However, we think there is value on Colorado St here. The Rams are only -35 ypg on the season. They've actually outgained both Boise St and San Diego St in their last two games but have been crushed by allowing a ridiculous FIVE special teams TD's. That's not a typo, five special teams TD's in two games including a 93-yard kick return TD and a 90-yard punt return TD in a 12-point loss at San Diego St last week. After a solid win over New Mexico, Utah St showed their true colors last week in a 35-7 loss at home to Air Force. The Aggies are -210 ypg on the season and have an interim coach with not much to play for. Colorado St needs a feel good win for first-year coach Steve Addazio and gets one here.

HAWAII 38 Only 20. UNLV is 0-4-1 ATS on the season and there really isn't anything to hang your hat on. They are -169 ypg and are allowing 250 rushing ypg. However, we feel you're paying a big premium in wanting to fade them here as this is their largest underdog role of the season despite the fact they've played all 5 teams are power-rated higher than this Hawaii outfit. The Rainbow Warriors are playing their 4th straight game at home but they've been outgained by 35 ypg on the season while allowing 233 rush ypg themselves. We like the Rebels here and wish we could have given them out at +25 which is what we bet them on Sunday morning.

Auburn 30 MISSISSIPPI ST 23. Auburn really disappointed us last week in their 31-20 loss to Texas A&M. We felt really good about our bet when the Tigers led 20-14 in the fourth quarter but the Aggies outscored them 17-0 down the stretch. How motivated will they be here after games vs Alabama and A&M? Please note that Auburn QB Bo Nix is just 4-6 SU away from home and has an 11-to-12 TD-to-INT ratio on the road in his career. They're taking on a Mississippi St team that is off two of their better performances in covers at Georgia and at Ole Miss. We lean OVER.

The Ole Miss at Texas A&M game has been cancelled due to COVID issues at Ole Miss.

ARKANSAS ST 44 Incarnate Word 24. Incarnate Word is playing their only game this fall so they've had time to prep exclusively on Arkansas St (we feel that is a positive). The Cardinals were 5-7 a year ago but did lose their last 5 games of the season. They're taking on an Arkansas St team that is having a disappointing season at 4-7. The Red Wolves did get a win and cover over a winless ULM team last week as WR Corey Rucker set the NCAA FBS record for a freshman with 310 yards receiving. Not sure we see much value here.

Alabama 49 ARKANSAS 19. The Crimson Tide are separating themselves from the rest of CFB this season. Despite playing an SEC only schedule, the Tide are outscoring their opponents by 31 ppg (highest scoring differential in Saban's tenure) and are +191 ypg. Alabama has covered six straight games by 12 ppg including last week's demolition of LSU. They really don't have a weakness especially on offense where they have 3 of the better players in the country. QB Mac Jones is among the Heisman favorites as he has a 27-to-3 TD-to-INT ratio. RB Najee Harris has 20 rushing TD's and WR DeVonta Smith has 15 receiving TD's. Meanwhile, Arkansas has been one of the most improved teams in the country this year (7-2 ATS). They could be even better than their 3-6 record as they've lost 3 games in the final seconds including last week to Missouri. Even with the SEC Championship game on deck for Alabama, we're just not interested in stepping in front of the Elephant here.

Georgia 34 MISSOURI 20. Missouri head coach Eli Drinkwitz is quietly having a great first season as the Tigers are now 5-3 after last week's thrilling win over Arkansas on the final play. After a 0-2 start they've won 5 of their last 6 games but are taking a major step up in class after playing South Carolina, Vanderbilt and Arkansas. Remember, they were handled easily by Alabama, Florida and even Tennessee who was red-hot at the time. The Bulldogs come in off a bye and their offense looks much better with JT Daniels at QB. Meanwhile, the rush defense is allowing just 75 rush ypg. Georgia wins and covers.

1★ Tennessee 35 VANDERBILT 17. We're not sure how motivated a 0-8 Vanderbilt will be here with an interim coach and a depth-shy roster (rumor is less than 50 scholarship players will be available this week). There are also rumors that the Sarah Fuller story is not being embraced by everyone in the locker room. The Commodores sure didn't show much emotion in their last game, a 41-0 loss to Missouri two weeks ago. Meanwhile, we think Tennessee should be plenty motivated as head coach Jeremy Pruitt needs a feel good win with the Vols on a school-record 6-game losing streak. We don't think they've given up on the season as they got a back-door vs Florida last week and should've covered at Auburn (464-385 yard edge).

Wisconsin 21 IOWA 20. The early money this week has been on Wisconsin in this match-up as they have flipped to a road favorite. The concern we have is their motivation with most of their season goals out the window at 2-2. Statistically, they have still been dominant at +15 ppg and +172 ypg as their defense hasn't allowed 300 yards or more than 17 points in any game. Meanwhile, the Hawkeyes have won 5 straight games since their 0-2 start. Public service announcement: The weather forecast calls for wind and rain as it does for most Big Ten, MAC and middle of the country games this Saturday. Make sure you're checking before you bet a bunch of OVERS. As for this one, we see it low scoring and going down to the wire.

INDIANA 31 Purdue 20. This game was just cancelled on Wednesday morning. Obviously, the two teams are heading in opposite directions in 2020. The Hoosiers remain the best ATS team in the country at 7-0 after their upset win over Wisconsin last week. Note Wisconsin had 19-15 first down and 342-217 yard edges. Indiana QB Jack Tuttle, filling in for the injured Michael

Penix was 13 of 22 for 130 yards and 2 TD's. "I think most people wrote us off because we lost Michael Penix, who is a special player. But we are a football team." Indiana coach Tom Allen said, putting special emphasis on his final word. Meanwhile, Purdue has lost 4 straight games and failed to cover 5 straight. They're one dimensional on offense as they had MINUS-2 yards rushing last week to Nebraska. Both teams are having COVID issues this week and both paused their football activities on Tuesday. With that in mind, there's too many question marks to make a recommendation here.

The Michigan at Ohio State game has been cancelled due to COVID issues at Michigan. The two teams had played every year since 1918 and is easily one of the top 5 rivalries in the sport.

PENN ST 33 Michigan St 17. Both teams have won two games this season but we feel much differently about them. Penn St has won and covered two straight games after their disastrous 0-5 start. Statistically, the Nittany Lions look like a winning team as they are +85 ypg on the season. Meanwhile, Michigan St is as bad as their 2-4 record as they have been outgained by 76 ypg and have been crushed in 3 of their last 4 games including last week to a short-handed Ohio St team at home. We lean Penn St.

2★ Rutgers (plus the points) MARYLAND 30 Rutgers 27. The market really loves Maryland. We don't, especially laying more than a TD here. The Terps have had 3 of their last 4 games cancelled and it's tough seeing how they could be in rhythm here. Defensively they are allowing 229 rush ypg and they are -46 ypg on the season. Meanwhile, we know what Rutgers is about as they've played all 7 games so far and they are a much improved team. Yes, they're off arguably their worst performance of the season but that was against an underrated Penn St team and still Rutgers only fell short of expectation (point spread) by 3 points. We think they cover here.

Appalachian St 27 GEORGIA SOUTHERN 20. Georgia Southern has had App St's number the last two years in back-to-back upsets as double-digit underdogs. They are having some injury issues as QB Shai Werts missed last week's game and they are down a pair of RB's along with some key defenders who were suspended. Meanwhile, App St has left a lot to be desired in year one under Shawn Clark (we're not the biggest fans of offensive line turned head coaches). The Mountaineers are 2-8 ATS after their outright loss to ULL last week and there won't be a SBC Championship game for them. Georgia Southern does play much better at home (+13 ppg and +106 ypg) as opposed to the road (-3 ppg and -45 ypg). We lean GS.

BALL ST 36 Western Michigan 34. The winner here heads to the MAC Championship game next week as the West Division champ. The Cardinals have now won 4 straight games and easily delivered for us on these pages last week in a blowout win over Central Michigan. Meanwhile, Western Michigan is off their first loss of the season as they got upset as near 2-TD favorites vs rival Eastern Michigan. As long as the weather holds out, expect a ton of points here but we don't see much value.

Miami, Oh 38 BOWLING GREEN 14. Breaking news...for the first time since 2018, a team other than UMass is dead last in our power ratings. That claim as worst in the country now falls on Bowling Green who was crushed by an Akron team last week that had lost 21 straight games. BG is -34 ppg and -149 ypg and are allowing 310 rushing ypg. Meanwhile, Miami would just like to get a game in as they've seen two of their games cancelled this fall. The Red Hawks easily handled that same Akron team in their last game 38-7. More misery for BG here. We would be on Miami here but there are question marks surrounding QB Brett Gabbert who was banged up in their last game.

BUFFALO 45 Akron 14. Congrats to the Akron Zips who just broke their 21-game losing streak last week in a 31-3 win over Bowling Green. Their best player Teon Dollard ran for 185 yards and 2 TD's. However, reality will set in this week vs the best team in the MAC. The Bulls saw their game vs Ohio cancelled last week and remember in their last game RB Jaret Patterson ran for the 2nd most yards (409) in FBS history. The Bulls are +26 ppg and +104 ypg on the season. They can name their score here as the MAC Championship game is on deck.

EASTERN MICHIGAN 34 Northern Illinois 28. Eastern Michigan got their first win of the season last week in an upset over rival Western Michigan. The 53 points were the most Eastern has scored in the 56-game history of the series. Meanwhile, Northern Illinois is still looking for their first win of the season. Last week's 41-24 loss to Toledo was a bit misleading as the game was tied at 24-24 entering the 4Q. We've been quoting awesome ATS trends on Eastern Michigan as underdogs especially on the road but they've been 50% at best as a favorite the last 5 years. We like the OVER but need a final check of the weather later in the week.

The Ohio at Kent St game has been cancelled due to COVID issues at Kent State this week.

TOLEDO 33 Central Michigan 24. Toledo had won an covered 9 straight in the series before losing 49-7 last year. Last week we faded CMU on these pages as they were crushed by Ball St. CMU QB Ty Brock was 20 of 30 for 188 yards and a 2-2 ratio in his first career start. He also had a 82-yard TD run. Meanwhile, Toledo beat Northern Illinois 41-24 as they outscored the Huskies 17-0 in the fourth quarter. UT did have a 610-382 yard edge. We lean Central Michigan here but prefer the OVER if the weather co-operates.

FLORIDA 44 Lsu 23. This is the largest favorite role in the series for Florida since 1994 and the 2nd largest overall point spread ever in the series. LSU was facing an historical point-spread last week vs Alabama and got their doors blown off 55-17 trailing 45-14 at halftime. Not much to play for other than pride at this point. We've never seen a team go from one extreme to the next in just one calendar year as we'd favor last year's LSU team by at least 31 points over this year's LSU team. Meanwhile, Florida has the SEC Championship game on deck. Do they pull players like Kyle Trask (38-3 ratio) and Kyle Pitts early? That has us leaning LSU.

MIAMI, FL 38 North Carolina 34. A really good game here in the ACC. Miami is playing their first home game since October 24th while North Carolina is playing their first road game since November 7th. The Canes showed no signs of rust in their 48-0 beat down of Duke last week. Miami is +13 ppg and +79 ypg on the season and are led by QB D'Eriq King and is 20-to-4 TD-to-INT ratio. On the other side, the Tar Heels are +12 ppg and +131 ypg on the season. They are led by QB Sam Howell and is 26-to-6 TD-to-INT ratio. Should be plenty of fire-works, we lean OVER.

Virginia 31 VIRGINIA TECH 30. Two teams and two programs heading in opposite directions. Virginia has won four straight and covered 5 straight after last week's 43-32 win over Boston College. UVA QB Brennan Armstrong was 19 of 27 for 287 yards and a 1-1 ratio while also running for 130 yards. Meanwhile, Virginia Tech has lost 4 straight games and failed to cover the spread in all 4 after last week's 45-10 loss to Clemson. Note it was just 17-10 Clemson late in the third quarter but VT is having trouble keeping guys healthy especially at QB. Virginia broke a 15-game series losing streak last year and while one can say revenge for VT, we simply think the tide has turned.

NEBRASKA 35 Minnesota 25. Minnesota hasn't played since November 20th as they continue to struggle with COVID issues. They've had a key opt out in WR Rashod Bateman since their last game and it doesn't look like the Gophers were locked in this season to begin with. They're taking on a Nebraska team that should be looking to finally establish some momentum under Scott Frost. The Huskers won at Purdue last week holding the Boilers to MINUS-2 rushing yards. However, do you really want to lay doubles with Nebraska? They're just 5-10 ATS as a favorite under Frost.

NORTHWESTERN 27 Illinois 14. Check the forecast as this could be the worst weather game of the weekend (rain and 20mph wind). Northwestern will be playing in the Big Ten Championship game next week but would love to atone for their first loss of the season two weeks ago as they fell at Michigan St. Northwestern does take this rivalry seriously as they've won 5 in a row while going 4-1 ATS. Meanwhile, Illinois allowed 35 unanswered points to Iowa last week as its been an up and down season for them. Do you really want to lay doubles with Northwestern? They are just 8-16 ATS as a double-digit Big Ten favorite since 1980.

1★ † Fresno St 35 New Mexico 20. Played at Sam Boyd Stadium in Las Vegas. Kudos to New Mexico for breaking a 14-game losing streak last week in their upset over Wyoming as 15.5-point underdogs. The win also broke a 20-game conference losing streak. However, the Lobos do have massive QB issues as Isaiah Chavez listed as New Mexico's fifth-string QB in the spring took over for fellow walk-on Connor Genal who left in the second quarter after suffering an apparent left-wrist injury. Chavez finished 5-of-10 passing for 55 yards without an interception. They're taking on a Fresno team off a loss to Nevada where the Bulldogs had 30-14 first down and 599-416 yard edges. Jake Haener threw a program-high 65 passes, completing 41 including a pair of TD's. We think that creates value on Fresno here!

BYU 31 San Diego St 17. It's going to be real interesting to see how BYU responds to their first loss of the season. There will be no playoffs and no major bowl games for them as they were shockingly out-rushed 281-165 by a much smaller Coastal Carolina team. A lot of effort was put into that cross-country trip. It's tough to get margin especially on a San Diego St allowing just 16 ppg and 270 ypg this season. The Aztecs upset BYU last year 13-3 and are 28-18-1 ATS as underdogs since 2010.

ARMY 23 Navy 16. It's the first time this game will be held on campus since 1943 and not on a neutral site. This is only the 2nd time Army has been favored in the series since 2002 but it is deserved. The Black Knights have had the last two weeks off in preparation for this game while Navy has had to play two conference games. Army had controlled the line of scrimmage (297-119 rush yard edge) this year albeit against a much weaker schedule than Navy who has been out-rushed 213-185. Totals players note the UNDER has cashed in 14 straight meetings by an average of 14 ppg. However, this is the lowest total in that stretch and it well below the two teams' scoring averages this season.

Usc 33 UCLA 30. This should be a good one as both teams have used the shortened Pac-12 season well. The Bruins have covered 4 straight games and own a winning record for the first time since 2017. They held on last weekend at Arizona State as they got back QB Dorian Thompson-Robinson in the line-up. Meanwhile, the 4-0 SU Trojans led Washington St 28-0 after the first quarter on Sunday night and slept-walked through the rest of the game. WR Amon-Ra St. Brown caught 4 TD passes all in the first quarter as he tied the FBS record for touchdowns scored in any quarter. Our power ratings say USC is the play here but we're concerned about them at the line of scrimmage as they only had 5 rushing yards last week and are taking on a UCLA team that has controlled the line of scrimmage better including 228 rush yards. We'd have UCLA as a best bet but our power ratings say USC is the play. We pass for now.

OREGON 30 Washington 24. The winner of this one wins the North division. Both teams come in off losses and both have been underwhelming so far. Oregon has lost two straight games and failed to cover in 3 straight. TO's have been the main culprit as they are -6 on the year. Meanwhile, Washington is +5 in TO's but the Huskies couldn't get off the field in an upset loss to Stanford last week. Oregon has dominated this series with a 14-2 SU and 14-2 ATS mark the last 16 years. However, we don't see much value at the current number.

California 28 WASHINGTON ST 26. Cal has owned the series with a 13-2 SU mark the last 15 years. The Bears finally broke through and got a win last week upsetting Oregon as 9-point underdogs. The Bears have steadily improved since their opening game blowout loss to UCLA as you can tell the practice restrictions in the state of California played a part. Meanwhile, Washington St was never in the game vs USC on Sunday night falling behind 28-0 in the first quarter. The Cougars did limit USC to just 5 yards rushing. After playing a bunch of Pac-12 games this season, this is another game where we think the market has finally caught up.

Uab 26 RICE 19. What should we expect of UAB who hasn't played since October 31st? We weren't overly impressed with what we saw of the Blazers as they are 2-5 ATS. Meanwhile, Rice is off one of the biggest upsets of the entire CFB season as they took down unbeaten Marshall last week 20-0 as 24.5-point underdogs. That's a 44.5-point cover! It should be noted though that Marshall had 5 TO's and were stopped on downs 3 times inside Rice's 30-yard line! The Owls were without their starting QB Mike Collins and top WR Austin Trammell. We found this trend to be interesting: How do teams fare the next week after covering a point spread by 40 points? How about dead even 156-156-4 (50%) since 1980. That surprised us. We're passing.

Week 15 Computer Projected Lines for Every CFB Game

For the past four seasons we have posted computer projected lines for every game. **Games where there was of difference of more than 3 points saw our computer lines actually beat the Vegas line at a 302-252-12 (55%) clip the last three years.** That's pretty solid and actually better than our own handicapping in some seasons. **Last week's plays went 4-6 and now the record for this year is 56-46.** Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

Of the 8 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be **Rutgers +8.**

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.

Week 15 CFB ATS Trends

- If you win the turnover battle in CFB, you are 70% ATS the last 15 years.
- Colorado is just 1-7 SU vs Utah the last 8 years but find themselves 2-point home favorites this week.
- Eastern Michigan is on a 3-19 straight up run vs Northern Illinois but find themselves 6.5-point favorites vs NIU this week. It's the largest favorite role for EMU in the series since 1998.
- Toledo had won and covered 9 straight vs Central Michigan before losing 49-7 last year. The Rockets are 11.5-point home favorites this week.
- Florida is a 23-point home favorite vs LSU this week. That's their largest favorite role vs the Tigers since 1994 and the 2nd largest overall spread in the series ever.
- Virginia had lost 15 straight to Virginia Tech prior to last season's win (were just 4-11 ATS). This year Virginia is a 2.5-point underdog at Virginia Tech and are looking for their first win in Blacksburg since 1998.
- Northwestern is 8-16 ATS as a double-digit Big Ten favorite since 1980. This week the Wildcats are 14.5-points favorites vs Illinois.
- The UNDER has cashed in 14 straight Army/Navy games by an average of 14 ppg. However, this year's total of 38 is the lowest priced total during that span.
- Oregon is on a 14-2 SU and ATS run vs Washington. This year the Ducks are 6-point home favorites.
- How do teams fare the next week after covering a point spread by 40 points? How about dead even 156-156-4 (50%) since 1980. That applies to Rice/UAB this week as Rice covered the spread by 44.5-points last week in their upset over Marshall.
- Vanderbilt is 7-1 ATS vs Tennessee the last 8 years. This year the Commodores find themselves 15-point home underdogs.
- Wisconsin is on a 7-1 SU run vs Iowa with an average win of 8 ppg. This week the Badgers are 1-point road favorites.
- Oklahoma is on a 6-0 SU (+21.5 ppg) and 6-0 ATS (+8.4 ppg) run vs West Virginia. This week the Sooners are 14-point road favorites.
- Hawaii is just 6-16 ATS as a home favorite since late 2014. This week the Rainbow Warriors are 20-point favorites hosting UNLV.

Games in Rotation Order Thursday, December 10th

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

L.A. RAMS 24 New England 18. In what we dubbed as the biggest coaching mismatch of all time New England crushed the Chargers last week 45-0 despite a ton of money coming in on LAC. The Pats did stay in L.A. the last few days and have now won 4 of their last 5 games. Teams off a 40-point or more cover in the NFL are just 9-17 ATS since 1989 so it doesn't happen often. The Rams got a big win over the Cardinals last week. That's now 7 straight wins and covers in the series. Thursday Night home favorites are 60% all-time since 1989. The Rams are +104 ypg this season (No. 1 in the NFL) while the Pats have managed just 470 total yards of offense the last two weeks. We lean Rams and UNDER.

Sunday, December 13th

Green Bay 31 DETROIT 24. The Packers won the earlier matchup 42-21 but the Lions had covered 6 in a row in the series prior. Green Bay comes in off the win and cover over the Eagles as they try and keep pace with the Saints for homefield advantage in the Playoffs. QB Rodgers now has a ridiculous 36-to-4 TD-to-INT ratio. Meanwhile the Lions got the come-from-behind win over the Bears in the first game post-Patricia. The team morale already seems to be better under interim Darrell Bevel. We don't see too much value here other than teasing the Packers down to -1.5. This game did get moved to 4:25pm ET.

Tennessee 30 JACKSONVILLE 23. Last week cashed on these pages fading Tennessee as they were boat-raced in the first half vs Cleveland before making the final respectable in the second half. Yes, the Jaguars are 1-11 SU on the season but they haven't given up with 4 covers in their last 5 games including last week at Minnesota. The Titans are 2-6 ATS as a favorite this year and Jacksonville gave them all they could handle in the first game. Lean Jags on anything north of 7. The Titans make some sense at -1.5 in a 6-point teaser.

Dallas 22 CINCINNATI 19. The Cowboys were just run over by the Ravens (allowed 294 rush yards) on Tuesday and are on a short back-to-back travel week. The Bengals aren't capable of doing the same as they've managed just 150 total rushing yards in their last 3 games combined and their offense hasn't topped 200 total yards in each of their last two games without QB Joe Burrow. Obviously, Andy Dalton's return to Cincy where he spent 9 years at is a story but we're not anxious to lay more than a FG with Dallas. We lean Cincy and UNDER.

Arizona 22 N.Y. GIANTS 20. Two teams heading in opposite directions. The Cardinals are 1-4 SU in their last 5 games and have failed to cover all 5 games. Kyler Murray doesn't look 100% as he has rushed for only 61 combined yards in the last 3 games. Meanwhile, the Giants just pulled off one of the biggest upsets of the season beating Seattle on the road with Colt McCoy at QB. That was McCoy's first win since 2014 as a starter but it looks like Daniel Jones will be back here. The G-Men have now won 4 straight games and are 5-1 ATS in their last 6 games. Lean UNDER and also the Giants +8.5 in a teaser.

Houston 23 CHICAGO 22. After a 5-1 start, the Bears have now lost 6 straight games (1-5 ATS) and you have to wonder if Matt Nagy keeps his job at this pace. Last week they blew a 10-point lead to the Lions in the final 2:30. Meanwhile, Houston has already replaced their coach and last week lost to the Colts also in heart-breaking fashion with QB Watson fumbling a snap at the goal line. Now at 4-8, they don't have much to play for and are missing many offensive weapons. We're passing for now. Teasing Chicago up to +7.5 makes some sense.

CAROLINA 26 Denver 22. Carolina comes in off a much-needed bye. The Panthers have exceeded their low expectations this season. Teddy Bridgewater is back at QB and it looks like Christian McCaffrey will return as well. Still it's tough laying more than a FG with a 4-8 team. Meanwhile, the Broncos are off a close loss to the Chiefs on SNF. Still, QB Drew Lock has a 8-13 ratio in his last 8 starts and we don't want to back him here on back-to-back road games.

TAMPA BAY 28 Minnesota 24. The Bucs come in off a much-needed bye. They looked tired prior to it as they lost back-to-back home games to the Rams and Chiefs by identical 27-24 scores. Meanwhile, the Vikings have failed to cover 3 straight games all in the favorite role and have barely escaped Carolina and Jacksonville at home the last two weeks. They haven't been a dog since November 1st and now they're back in their preferred role as they have covered their last 4 as dog. Lean MIN.

Kansas City 29 MIAMI 20. Despite their lofty 11-1 record, the Chiefs haven't been dominant in covering point-spreads as of late. They've now failed to cover 4 straight games in wins (all by 6 points or less). Meanwhile is an NFL-best 9-2 ATS in their last 11 games and are off a cover as a double-digit favorite last week. QB Tua Tagovailoa has a 7-to-0 TD-to-INT ratio but he and the Dolphins are taking a major step up in class this week after facing the Chargers, Broncos, Jets and Bengals the last 4 weeks. Lean KC but they do have the Saints on deck.

1★ OVER 51.5 Indianapolis 28 LAS VEGAS 27. The Raiders come in off the near embarrassing loss to the Jets basically getting a "Hail Mary" TD in the closing seconds thanks to some idiotic coaching by the Jets. Indianapolis was also fortunate to beat Houston last week thanks to a fumbled snap by the Texans late. This isn't a great spot for the Colts on back-to-back road in non-division action. The Raiders have been "Jekyll and Hyde" all year perfectly capable of beating the NFL's best (Chiefs and Saints) but also capable of losing to the worst teams (last two weeks). We think this is more of a play-on game for them. However, we prefer the OVER which is 8-3-1 in Raiders games this year. The OVER is also on a 6-2 run in Indy games and should have cashed last week.

SEATTLE 32 N.Y. Jets 17 . Both teams off crushing defeats last week. First, the Jets looked like they had their first win of the season and then... DC Gregg Williams dialed up a Cover Zero Blitz and were excruciatingly beat over the top. Williams was correctly fired the next day. Meanwhile, the Seahawks suffered arguably the biggest upset of the season losing to the Giants team with Colt McCoy at QB as double-digit home favorites. You can pretty much kiss a No. 1 or No. 2 seed in the playoffs goodbye now that the Saints and Packers are ahead of them. Still, double-digit favorites are 60% ATS in the NFL the last 6 years. We actually like the spot here for the Seahawks as we won't question their motivation this week.

Atlanta 26 L.A. CHARGERS 24. The Chargers are so inept coaching wise and now you have to wonder if the players have finally given up on them. After so many close losses, they were embarrassed last week in a 45-0 loss to the Patriots. That's 6 straight non-covers for them and you have to think the writing is on the wall for Anthony Lynn and company after the worst loss in franchise history. Meanwhile, we lost on these pages backing the Falcons in their loss to the Saints last week. They almost got the comeback but fell just short. The look-ahead line on this game was "Pick" so if you're wanting to back the Falcons it isn't cheap. Lean OVER.

New Orleans 26 PHILADELPHIA 19. Jalen Hurts is going to get the start here for the Eagles as the Carson Wentz era might be coming to an end. Remember, Wentz' 4-year \$128 million dollar contract doesn't kick in until next season which could make it the worst contract in NFL history! Somebody is going to pay for that decision. Meanwhile, the Saints are rolling with 9 straight wins and 5 straight covers. We regrettably went against them last week and came up just short. This is their third straight road game and they do have Kansas City on deck so this spot isn't optimal. Slightest of leans on the OVER.

2★ San Francisco 27 Washington 20. This game will be played in Arizona (Cardinals stadium) due to California COVID restrictions. Obviously, Washington is off a big upset win over the previously unbeaten Steelers last week as they rallied from a 14-0 deficit. However, they had a big rest advantage in that one and now are on the road for a 3rd straight week. They're taking on a San Francisco team that has been "Jekyll and Hyde" this season but coming off a disappointing performance on Monday night (much to our dismay on these pages), they should rebound here. Please note that SF head coach Kyle Shanahan holds special animosity toward Washington because both he and his father Mike were fired by Washington owner Dan Snyder. Kyle gave the game ball from last season's 9-0 shutout of Washington to his father and that score would've been worse if not for being played in a torrential downpour.

1★ BUFFALO 26 Pittsburgh 20. Horrific spot again for the Steelers who are playing their third game in 11 days. The unbeaten season is over for them after giving up a 14-0 lead to Washington and they have looked spent the last couple of games trying to hold on to that unbeaten record. Meanwhile, the Bills just could be the 2nd best team in the AFC. They had a very nice win and cover against us on MNF and now have covered 4 straight en route to a 9-3 record. A lot of early sharp money has come in on the Bills this week and we agree with it.

Monday, December 14th

Baltimore 24 CLEVELAND 23. The Ravens come in on one day less rest after running over the Cowboys on Tuesday night. They easily crushed the Browns in Week 1 38-6 but these two have had different trajectories since. The Browns have won 4 straight and are now clearly thinking playoffs for the first time since 2003. They looked like they started to get ready for this game last week after they led Tennessee by 31 at halftime. Despite a huge rally by the Titans, we easily cashed on these pages. The look-ahead line was Baltimore by 3 and both teams over-achieved. Down to the wire.
