# 'Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate'

The gospel today contains the most challenging of all the Christian commandments and probably the most difficult to keep: love your enemies and do good to those who hurt you.

In last week's gospel, through the Beatitudes, the disciples learned that to be a faithful follower of Jesus, they must be committed to a new order at variance with ways of the world. This week's text tells them how they must live in that new order; in a sense it provides the practical details. What Jesus is suggesting should not be confused with passivity or simply inaction or resignation in the face of persecution and injustice. Quite the contrary! What Jesus is suggesting is radical action. It demands that we act towards others without being asked, that believers offer friendship and pardon constantly, without asking or hoping for anything in return. In Jesus is located God's self-revelation, God's actions in and for the world, plan for salvation and its fulfilment. Followers of Jesus must act in these ways precisely because they are the ways of God – and God, as we are told, is Love which of its nature is open to see the potential good in others and to act out of the goodness within oneself. Jesus goes on to elaborate: turn the other cheek; love your enemies do not retaliate as this serves to endorse wrong doing; do good to those who hate

you! Be agents of healing not retributive hurt. This may well seem an impossible ideal as a way of life - a huge challenge beyond the Beatitudes.

The first disciples of Jesus may well have made this judgement, had it not been for the memory of the life Jesus had lived in their midst. In the New Testament, these first followers shared how they came to recognise the central importance of the New Commandment of love, as they reflected in the selfless life of Jesus and its culmination in his tragic death. In Jesus' words through John the evangelist, "no greater love can there be than to lay down one's life for one's friends" (Jn 25:12-13)

Clearly the Law of Love – proclaimed today, is an ideal that none of us will ever

fully realise. But 'being Christian is about striving towards the ideal nevertheless. So how can we love others as Christ himself has loved them in our daily interactions? It's about compassion. "Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate." Jesus is teaching us not to set limits to the practical goodwill we bear towards our fellow human beings. The way of true happiness lies in celebrating and sharing the gifts of God's Spirit that we have received through our faith in Christ Jesus.

#### **National Catholic Safeguarding Standards**

A second draft of the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards has been released prior to final adoption. After rigorous consultation processes conducted by CPSL, a second draft of the Standards was provided to the No vember plenary meeting of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference and to Catholic Religious Australia for their consideration, in line with CPSL's constitution.

CPSL CEO, Sheree Limbrick said it is understood that finalisation could take another month or so but that significant changes are not expected. "We have decided to release this second draft to enable participating entities to closely consider the detail of the Standards and support material designed specifically to support implementation. It is very important that those entities scheduled for audit have time to prepare. This current draft of the Standards is the result of 18 months of consultation and testing. They have been mapped against state legislation, the recommendations made by the Royal Commission and by national bodies and overseas experience. They take the new National Principles for Child Safe Organisations and apply them to the Catholic Church context," Ms Limbrick said. 
