Riders and handlers must adhere to the Stallion Safe Practice Policy effective 1 July 2018 as amended. When tied to a truck or trailer, the colt/stallion must be suitably restrained or yarded within an approved solid framed portable yard and must display the EA Stallion Identification Card with a green background and should also be wearing the correct identification as per point 2 of the Stallion Safe Policy. The EA Stallion Identification Card with a green background must be placed on the outside of the stable or yard clearly notifying others that the horse within is a colt/stallion. It must also display the name and contact details (including phone number) for the rider or person responsible for the colt/stallion during the event.



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Please remember to check in at the desk when you arrive

- The Adelaide Hills Dressage Club will conduct the 2022 Horseland Mt Barker Spring Dressage Festival under the auspices of the Equestrian SA
 (ESA) in strict accordance with Equestrian Australia (EA) Dressage Rules and Official Procedures for Dressage Competitions effective 1 July 2022
 and the FEI Rules for Dressage Events effective 1 January 2022) as amended.
- 2. (a) **Riders** taking part in the Competition must be financial members of EA. In open competition riders must be 10 years or over on the day of competition (or at least 8 years old if riding a Pony). Both/all owners/lessees on joint registered Horses must be financial members of EA.
 - (b) **Horses and ponies** in the competition must be currently registered with EA, have a current Competition Licence for Dressage or Pony Dressage and be owned by a financial member of EA. All horses and ponies may compete at only two (2) consecutive levels.
- 3. **Swabbing:** Random swabbing may take place in accordance with the FEI Veterinary Rules, subject to any amendment or inclusions as of 8th October 2022. Please make yourself aware of prohibited substances and the relevant withdrawal period. Check the ingredients of all products you are using including herbal products with your vet. Security and access to the horse is the sole responsibility of the owner/rider.
- 4. All Tests: are current EA tests (refer to https://www.equestrian.org.au/dressage-rules) or FEI tests (https://inside.fei.org/fei/your-role/organisers/dressage/tests). No test may be commanded or ridden Hors Concours.
- 5. Protective headgear as per the current EA Dressage Rules and Official Procedures for Dressage Competitions. All helmets are required to be tagged with a current visible EA 'Helmet Tag' (effective 1 July 2022) indicating they meet the current approved safety standards. Riders with a non-compliant helmet and no EA helmet tag (see Section 5.2) will be given a Recorded Warning Card and eliminated; riders with a compliant helmet (see Section 5.2) but no tag will be given a Recorded Warning Card but allowed to compete (Rule 1.6.2)
- 6. **HC:** Horses and ponies may NOT compete Hors Concours at this competition.
- 7. Performances must be detailed on the Nominate entry form. ENTRIES WILL NOT be accepted unless this is included. HC performances used as qualification must also be recorded or a copy of the relevant test must be included with the entries.
- 8. Horses in EA and FEI classes must exceed 149 cms with shoes or 148 cms without shoes. Riders of Ponies: please be aware of any Rule changes in 2022 in regard to height measurement and certificates. EA Rules will be applied.
- 9. Entries are via Nominate and must be correctly and fully completed. Any errors and omissions may result in the entry being rejected. Entries close midnight on Friday 2nd September 2022. After the closing date Late Entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Organising Committee with conditions and fees. Late entries will attract an additional \$25 fee per horse per day of competition if received before the draw commences. After the draw commences riders must contact the Secretary on 0429 190 653 before attempting to enter. The Secretary will notify riders IF AND WHEN AN APPROPRIATE SCRATCHING IS AVAILABLE. Then after payment of the correct entry fees and an additional \$25 late fee per horse per day your entry/s will be included in the competition. After the close of entries a competitor may only substitute a horse with the approval of the OC and no later than 48 hours before the start of an event. Change of rider as per Rule 4.2 and at the discretion of the OC.
- 10. Any horse may compete in two consecutive levels only. A maximum of two tests within those levels at EA or FEI Level can be ridden on any single day.
- 11. No rider may ride more than two (2) horses in any class. For riders with multiple horses entered in the event, the OC will make every effort for a draw which gives sufficient time between rides but this may not always be guaranteed.
- 12. **REFUNDS**: A full refund of fees will be given for entries not accepted or balloted out. Once an entry is accepted, the Administration Fee is non-refundable.
 - STABLE DEPOSITS will be refunded after each horse has completed all its nominated tests or is scratched before 12.00 noon on Friday 7th October 2022. Stables must be cleaned before leaving. After inspection by a Committee member to ensure this has been done, the \$20 deposit will be refunded when the Competitor or representative presents to the Secretary's desk.
 - SCRATCHINGS: Fifty percent (50%) of entry fees less the administration fee will be refunded upon presentation of a Veterinary Certificate or Medical Certificate, which must be presented to the Committee no later than two days after the competition. Where a horse is on a reserve list and does not compete in that event or has to scratch and is replaced by a Reserve, then all (100%) of the entry fee for that event will be refunded.
- 13. HORSE IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS: must be worn with one on each side of the horse (bridle or saddle blanket) at all times at an event so that the horse can be identified by all Officials, including Stewards. They are the responsibility of the competitor to provide. The SA Bridle number system will apply. The Horse Identification Number must also be worn as described whenever the horse is being ridden / lunged / led / tethered or grazed from the time of their arrival on the grounds until the end of the event. Entrants in Participant classes will be allocated a temporary bridle number for the event. For stallions, EA compliant green Stallion Identification must be worn at all times in accordance with EA Rules. Riders and handlers must adhere to the Stallion Safe Practice Policy effective 1 July 2018 as amended. When tied to a truck or trailer, the colt/stallion must be suitably restrained or yarded within an approved solid framed portable yard and must display the EA Stallion Identification Card with a green background and should also be wearing the correct identification as per point 2 of the Stallion Safe Policy. The EA Stallion Identification Card with a green background must be placed on the outside of the stable or yard clearly notifying others that the horse within is a colt/stallion. It must also display the name and contact details (including phone number) for the rider or person responsible for the colt/stallion during the event.
- 14. **PRIZES AND PRIZE MONEY:** Winners and placegetters in all classes will be presented with rosettes to 6th place (or 8th place if 15 or more riders in a class) and prizemoney and/or vouchers and/or product of equivalent or greater value, to 3rd place where there are 3 or more competitors in a class. Presentations will be unmounted but competitors must be in full competition attire. **Failure to comply will result in withdrawal of prizes** and prizemoney.

- 15. Protests must be lodged in writing, together with a \$50.00 deposit, no later than half an hour after the incident which gives rise to the dispute. The deposit will be refunded only if the protest is upheld.
- 16. **TEST SHEETS:** can be collected from the Secretary's Office once all results for the competition have been officially posted. Uncollected test sheets will be emailed after the weekend of the competition.
- 17. **Youth Competition:** Open to riders who are 10 years and over up to the end of the year in which they turn 21 riding a Horse and from 8 years if riding a Pony (EA Rule 4.5). Youth Horses and Ponies will compete together (no separation of classes for Horses and Ponies). Horses and Ponies must be registered with EA. Competitors may compete in both Competitive, Pony and Youth Rider classes (if eligible) on the same Horse at the same event, but not more than two tests per day.
- 18. **Pony Competition:** Open to Ponies registered with EA.
- 19. **Participant Competition:** Riders must be current Participant or Competitive members of Equestrian Australia. Horses do not need to be registered with EA.
- 20. Youth and or Pony competitors who are competing in a level that has not been allocated a specific Youth or Pony Class may ride in the Open class as a Youth or Pony competitor (please contact the Secretary if you wish to do this).
- 21. The Committee reserves the right to change the day of competition, limit entries withdraw prizemoney or cancel classes with insufficient starters at their discretion. An effort will be made to run classes with 3 or less horses but prizes are not guaranteed.
- 22. BALLOTING OF ENTRIES: There will be a limit of 35 horses per event with six reserves and one division only in all classes. Where more than 35 entries are received balloting will occur. Balloting will be based on the average of the highest percentages of three tests at the particular level, back twelve months from the date of close of entries. The 35 highest average percentages will be accepted in each event. Horses with three performances will be considered ahead of those who have two or only one performance percentages. An HC performance will be considered to be a qualification but will be balloted as above.
- 23. **AMATEUR OWNER RIDERS:** to be indicated on entry forms, for separate ranking of places. AOR as defined by EA criteria. BY ANSWERING YES TO THE AOR QUESTION ON NOMINATE YOU ACKNOWLEDGE THAT YOU MEET AND WILL BE BOUND BY THE AOR CRITERIA SET BY EA. AOR rankings will apply to Preliminary, Novice, Elementary, Medium and Advanced Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 10, 11, 12 and 13 only. Refer to www.equestrian.org.au/sites/default/files/National Adult Amateur Owner Rider 2019 Division.pdf and the 2022 Dressage Rules (including amendments as of 1 July 2022 to Rule 4.6.1 regarding payment for coaching) for the current criteria.
- 24. **THE DRAW**: Will be strictly adhered to and riders must present to at their specified times. Failure to present to the Judge at the correct time may incur elimination.
- 25. GEAR CHECKING: ALL COMPETITORS must present to the Gear Steward (PRIOR TO EACH TEST). FAILURE TO HAVE A GEAR CHECK WILL INCUR ELIMINATION as per EA Rule 4.4.
- 26. SCRATCHINGS: the contact for Scratchings is 0400 289 481 (text messages please with rider name, horse name and classes). DO NOT SCRATCH VIA SOCIAL MEDIA.
- 27. An administration fee of \$25.00 will cover the administrative costs. In the unlikely event that the competition is cancelled before the competition day the administration fees are non-refundable. A copy of the draw will be available at www.ahdc.net.au/draw.html. The Organising Committee has the right to cancel/postpone the event at any time during the day if conditions are deemed to be unsafe for horses and/or riders. NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN.
- 28. LIABILITY: NEITHER THE ORGANISING COMMITTEE, ESA NOR THE OWNERS/LESSEES OF THE VENUE ACCEPT ANY LIABILITY FOR ACCIDENT, DAMAGE, INJURY OR ILLNESS TO HORSES, OWNERS, RIDERS, SPECTATORS, PERSONS OR PROPERTY WHATSOEVER.
- 29. The EA Concussion Policy applies to all competitions: www.equestrian.org.au/news/%E2%80%9Cif-doubt-%E2%80%93-sit-them-out%E2%80%9D-ea-concussion-protocols-implementation-all-disciplines-1-july-2019
- **30. Para Competition:** Riders must be current Participant or Competitive members of Equestrian Australia. Horses do not need to be registered with EA for EA Intro championship tests. Horses must be registered for EA Para and FEI Championship Classes.
- 31. To be eligible for the Para Championship classes and prizes, riders must enter all tests within their grade and class: (eg. below)
 - Para Intro Championship must ride EA Level 1 and Level 2 Tests.
 - Para Champion class must ride EA Level 3, Level 4 and Freestyle Tests.
 - FEI Para Championship must ride Team, Individual and Freestyle Tests.

The selection for all Champions will be made according to the EA Rules for Dressage: Rule 3.19. There will be no equal champions.

MEDIUM Must have obtained 55% or more of the total possible marks at Medium level in the preceding 12 months prior to close of

entries (Friday 2nd September 2022) and have gained less than 40 upgrading points at Advanced in Official Dressage

Competition as per Rule 4.8.3.2.

ADVANCED Must have obtained 55% or more of the total possible marks at Advanced level in the preceding 12 months prior to close of

entries (Friday 2nd September 2022) and have gained less than 30 points in FEI Dressage Competition as per Rule 4.8.3.2.

FEI As per rule 4.8.3.2 (see also dot points below) **OR** must have obtained 50% or more of the total possible marks at the level

you are entering (eg. at least 50% in an official Prix St George competition to qualify for the Prix St George class) in the

preceding 12 months prior to close of entries (Friday 2nd September 2022).

YOUTH Per Condition 17. Youth combinations do NOT require qualifications.

PARTICIPANTS Do NOT require qualifications: there is no minimum percentage requirement for entry.

PONY Per Condition 18. Pony combinations require qualifications.

EA Competition

Your Horse / Pony only needs ONE performance at 55% to allow you to make an entry. If this is your only performance, it may be HC. Further performances are required for balloting purposes only and do <u>not</u> have to be >55%. One or both of these may be HC ie. Two (2) or three (3) performances submitted require one non-HC score. For Advanced qualifications to enter Prix St George the Horse / Pony must have achieved 60% or above on two occasions in Official Advanced competitions to be eligible to compete PSG, Intermediate 1. These qualifications may be HC. Also see the FEI Competition dot point (below).

• FEI Competition (see also Rule 4.8.3.2 of the 2022 National Dressage Rules)

HC performances may be included in qualifications. This also applies to the Advanced Qualifications to enter the Prix St George class. Small Tour: Combinations must have gained a minimum of one performance of at least 50% at Small Tour (Prix St George/Inter 1) or have achieved 60% or above on two occasions in Official Advanced competitions to be eligible to compete PSG, Intermediate 1. In the event that the competitions are held at the one event, they must be judged by a different panel of Judges. These qualifications may be HC.

Medium Tour: Combinations must have gained at least **60%** in an Official Intermediate I to compete in Intermediate A and B or Intermediate II **Big Tour:** Combinations must have gained **60%** on two occasions in Intermediate A. B or Intermediate II to be eligible to compete Grand Prix.

PARTICIPANT AND YOUNG HORSE TESTS – QUALIFICATIONS NOT REQUIRED. These tests do not incur grading points. PARA CLASSES – QUALIFICATIONS NOT REQUIRED.

The selection for all Champions will be made according to the EA Rules for Dressage: Rule 3.19. There will be no equal champions.

Amateur Owner-Riders (AOR) must nominate as AOR when entering by ticking the AOR box on the entry form. You will be flagged as an AOR rider, however you will compete with others in your nominated event. Championship rosettes only will be awarded to AORs for the aggregate of each EA level. There will not be individual place rosettes for each class, only Championship rosettes. These events are for Preliminary, Novice, Elementary, Medium and Advanced classes only according to the EA rules For Dressage: Rule 3.19. There will be no equal champions.

These events are for Horses only – not for Youth, Pony, FEI, Young Horse or Participant classes. Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 10, 11, 12 and 13 only.

RISK MANAGEMENT CHECKLIST.

- The EA Concussion Policy applies. Ensure you are familiar with the Policy! www.equestrian.org.au/news/%E2%80%9Cif-doubt-%E2%80%93-sit-them-out%E2%80%9D-eaconcussion-protocols-implementation-all-disciplines-1-july-2019
- From 1 July 2022 helmets must be tagged to show they are a current approved safety standard.
- A designated Risk Management Officer will be on site and available to answer / rectify problems as soon as practicable.
- Emergency Phone numbers for Doctor, Ambulance, Hospital will be at Secretary's desk.
- A First Aid Kit is available.
- Please keep Entry/Exit gates closed at ALL TIMES.
- Observe 10 km/hr speed limit within the Dressage Grounds.
- Parking Areas as defined.
- Fill in any holes your horse/s may dig. Remove manure to ends of stable for collection or place on the orange manure trailer. Please do not put manure around the small trees.
- Lunging will only take place in the designated lunging area in or adjacent to the Pony Club arena. You are considered to be lunging your horse if the horse is more than 2 m away from you regardless of whether you are using a lunging rope or a training rope.
- Stables to be kept clean and free from rubbish at all times.
- The Responsible Person of horses found to be posing a danger to other horses/persons on the grounds will be asked to remove them by the Risk Management Officer.
- Should you be involved in an incident while on the grounds please report to the office and fill in an Incident Report Form.
- In order to avoid incidents in the warm-up area please pay extra attention to your lines and spacing and make sure you are familiar with ANNEX F.10 and F.10.2 Etiquette for Warm-Up Arena of the 2022 Dressage Rules (including amendments as of 1 July 2022.)
- During Warm Up Please be mindful of the Para Equestrian Riders, these riders have physical and vision impairments etc and may not see or hear you
- With the co-operation of all persons riding or using the Grounds facilities a good time will be had by all.
