## The Aims of this Workshop

- (1) To arm teachers with the skills to demonstrate and give their students precise instructions on how to articulate the more challenging sounds of the English Language, such as 'th': /θ/ as in 'think' and /ð/ as in 'the'
- (2) To arm teachers with the knowledge of intonation patterns, which they can impart to their students
- (3) To make participants aware of the common errors in pronunciation or articulation that they should look out for and correct in their students' speech and reading
- (4) To teach participants how to teach their students to speak or read fluently
- (5) And through doing so, to help these EL teachers to improve their own pronunciation, articulation, intonation and fluency.
- (6) To arm teachers with a systematic step-by-step programme comprising numerous exercises, to effectively improve their students' pronunciation, articulation, intonation and fluency
