This is what has happened to each of these ships:

1: USS Sampson DDG-10

Decommissioned on 11-20-92; Sold for scrap on 12-16-94.

2: <u>USS Page DEG-5</u> Decommissioned on 09-30-88; Leased to Pakistan on 03-31-89. Renamed TABUK. Returned on 01-12-94. Sold for scrap on 03-29-94.

3: USS Vreeland FF-1068

Decommissioned on 06-30-92; Leased to Greece on 06-30-92. Renamed MAKEDONIA. Renewed lease on 06-30-96. Record ends there.

4: USS Barry DD-933

Decommissioned on 11-82; 01-83 towed to Washington, D.C.; Moored in Washington Naval Shipyard as display ship. The 4th USS Barry is DDG-52 !!

5: USS Manley DD-940

Decommissioned On 03-04-83; Sold for scrap on 06-30-94.

6: USS Wood DD-715

Decommissioned in 1976; In 1983 towed to Puerto Rico and used in Missle exercises. After the exercises were over, she was Sank. The William M. Wood Association is currently in the the process Of getting a new ship named after Dr. William M. Wood.
