

Welcome

Today, we welcome Kurt Crays, Executive Director of the Erie United Methodist Alliance. EUMA wants to end homelessness by making it rare, brief, and one-time, as Jesus would.

Under the EUMA umbrella:

The Refuge (for women with children fleeing domestic violence)

<u>The Rainbow Connection Thrift Store</u> (provides clothing, household items, furniture and small appliances to our neighbors in need)

EUMA teamed up with the VA and HUD (U.S. Dept. of Housing & Urban Development) to open <u>Liberty House</u> (transitional housing program in Erie Co. specifically for homeless Veterans)

EUMA has expanded services to address critical needs by piloting <u>Healthcare</u> for the Homeless Partnership that integrated housing and healthcare.

EUMA became the largest <u>Rapid Re-Housing program</u> in Erie County helping our homeless neighbors find, pay for, and stay permanently housed.

EUMA welcomed *Our Neighbors' Place* shelter (seasonal) as part of the EUMA family of ministries.

In partnership with Family Services of NW PA and Bethesda Lutheran Services, EUMA began the *Journey Home program* that provides youth aging out of foster care with independent and supportive living apartments.
