

Current metrics

Salt Lake County remains in the "high transmission" level, along with every other county in the state.

Salt Lake City has a crude rate average of 317.97 cases per 100K.


Today statewide:

- 4,657 cases statewide, up 135 from last weekend and includes the holiday
- 7-day average: 1,382 cases per day (up from 1,108 last week)
- Referral ICUs at 89% capacity
- Covid ICU Utilization: 34% as of 9/6
- Total ICU Utilization: 87% as of 9/6

K-12 mask requirement

- Next Tuesday the City Council will be considering an extension of the mask requirement.
- 18 of the 37 schools in our district are reporting 36 cases total over the past 14 days.


Countywide district cases:

- 617 children ages 5-11 tested positive since Friday
- In the past week, 1,231 children ages 5-11 tested positive, compared to 101 during the same period last year (12.2x

higher)

Federal eviction moratorium expires October 3

- Increase in evictions is yet to be seen, but an increase in eviction filings is expected.



Fall Point-In-Time Count:

There will be a special point-in-time count that will be conducted this Friday, Sept. 10.

This count, which usually occurs in January every year, is a follow up to the count that was conducted earlier this year.

Volunteers will be conducting interviews with unsheltered people and specifically asking them if a COVID-19-related hardship led to their homelessness.
