I. CALL TO ORDER

Pledge of allegiance, Invocation, and Determination of Quorum.

Mayor Yost called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M. Present were Mayor Bobby Yost, Mayor Pro-Tem and Councilmember Nancy Cherry. We have quorum. Councilmember Vigoa and Thompkins arrived after attendance was taken.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Approval of April 15, 2021 Regular Council Meeting Minutes

Citizen Kelly Williams of 150 NE 1st Street Webster, FL 33597

Ms. Williams addressed council with corrections to the April 15, 2021 minutes and stated that the minutes are not specific enough.

Mayor Pro-Tem Malott asked that staff review other city/county minutes to determine their format.

City Manager Naugler stated that per the city attorney the minutes are a brief synopsis of the meeting. City Manager Naugler stated that she has reviewed other minutes such as Sumter County and have found that they are only a summary of the meeting.

City attorney David Hall stated that the minutes are not required to be verbatim minutes and the general policy is that they are a summary of the meeting and this follows the format of most other cities.

He also addressed the 55-mph speed limit by the middle school. Mr. Stafford stated he understand this is a county issue.

Ms. Williams addressed council stating that she is not in approval for the pets only be limited to the track and no other area in the park. Ms. Williams stated that if this ordinance can go by an affiant signing an affidavit saying they saw something, and a citation be issued on that basis alone that the other ordinances that we have should be likewise. Ms. Williams stated she has observed someone on a golf cart crossing a 35-mph zone which conflicts with the city ordinance. Ms. Williams asked why this is being treated any differently from the other ordinances.

Councilmember Vigoa asked Lt. Cassidy if a citizen filed a complaint that they observed a golf cart crossing in a no crossing zone would he issue a ticket. Lt. Cassidy responded that the officer would follow state statute in this case.

City Attorney David Hall stated that the ordinance stated that the if an affiant reports a violation that it has to be documented by an officer and the officer will investigate and determine if there is enough evidence to substantiate a violation.

Mayor Pro-Tem Malott requested that the verbiage be changed in the procedure that council will review city property for surplus and sale and not the City Manager.

Citizen Kelly Williams of 150 NE 1st Street, Webster, FL 33597

Ms. Williams addressed council requesting that they vote no on the procedure until it is fixed. Ms. Williams had several objections to the verbiage in the procedure. Ms. Williams stated that everyone she be treated the same when it comes to the sale of any city property.

Councilmember Vigoa asked that this item be postponed that a special meeting be held to review and discuss the policy before it is approved.

Mayor Pro-Tem Malott asked that the citizens submit their suggested concerns and changes for consideration.

Citizen Judie Mueller of 160 NE 2nd Webster FL 33597

Mrs. Mueller addressed council and stated that she had concerns about the procedure and the sale of property to non-profit organizations and requested that everyone be treated equally.

City Manager Naugler stated that at a prior meeting there was a discussion about placing dog waste stations at the parks but there was not decision made. Mrs. Naugler reviewed the different waste stations options and associated costs. Mrs. Naugler updated council on the complete streets grant. Mrs. Naugler stated that the city was approved for a feasibility study for the complete streets and there was an upcoming citizen meeting. Mrs. Naugler updated the council about the trail coming through the City. She stated that it is funded but has not received any dates for start of construction. Mrs. Naugler also stated that she is still working on funding to purchase the rest of the CSX property to have a trail spur that would run from Webster to and/or possibly through Center Hill. Mrs. Naugler stated she has also had conversations with Center Hill to get them on board to help with the funding. Mrs. Naugler stated that the City was approved for two FRDAP grants one for Sam Harris Park and one for Hewitt Park and that those upgrades have started. Mrs. Naugler stated that

she is also working with Florida Rural Water Association for an updated rate study and for the possibility of implementation of impact/connection fees. Mrs. Naugler stated that there are property owners north of Beville's corner that are interested in annexing into the City however this is being impacted by the Utility Service Area (USA). The area falls in the Bushnell USA Area. Mrs. Naugler has been working with Bushnell on the possibility of modifying the USA. However, it does not appear that Bushnell is amenable to this. Mrs. Naugler stated the only alternatives are that the property be annexed by contiguous annexation or that the City would have to look at a legal approach to modify the USA agreement.

Mayor Yost wanted to thank Grant Gore for the donation of the labor to do the brick work for our new city sign.

Councilmember Vigoa motioned to Approve the Purchase Four of the Higher-end Lifetime Guarantee Dog Pet Waste Stations, Two for Each Park, seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Malott.

Pledge of allegiance, Invocation, and Determination of Quorum.

Request for Proposal when Properties are to be Sold.

City Manager Naugler and Council discuss request for proposal (RFP) for properties when they are to be sold.

Councilmembers discussed suggested changes to the RFP and provided their individual input and suggested changes.

Mayor Pro-Tem Malott asked Realtor Connie Mahan to the podium to provide input on the RFP process. Ms. Mahan cautioned council that the RFP is not a contractual obligation with the purchaser. City Manager Naugler stated that as part of the sale process there would be a developer's agreement required.

Mike Hinton of 4990 CR 707, Webster, FL 33597 – approached council about his hopes and vision for the city.

City Manager Naugler will make the proposed changes to the standard operating procedure for the surplus and sale of city properties as well as the Request for Proposal for the sale of city property and the revised documents will be brought to the June 15, 2021 council meeting.

Declaring City Property Surplus and Sale of Property

PURPOSE: This procedure outlines the process to declare City property as surplus and to list it for sale.

PROCEDURE: This procedure will outline the steps to declare City property as surplus and to list it for sale when the City Council has made the decision that there is no beneficial use to retain the property for use by the City.

On a regular basis, at least annually, the City Manager shall review the current inventory of City-owned personal and real property and present a list to council to determine what, if any, City-owned property is in excess of its foreseeable needs and be deemed to be surplus. Action taken by the City Council to declare City-owned property as surplus shall be by means of a resolution being adopted that has been collaboratively prepared by the City Manager and the City Attorney. Upon the City Council determining that City-owned property is surplus to the needs of the City, it shall direct the City Manager to list the property for sale.

The City Manager is vested with maximum discretion and authority to consider creative means and methods to attain present day value of surplus City property for the benefit of the City and to retain only such assets as may be of utility to the City in the future.

With regard to personal property, such property may be disposed of by auction, bid, notice in a newspaper of sales at listed prices (as determined by a review of prevailing market factor), publication in a trade publication, or any other lawful method, as determined collaboratively by the City Manager and City Attorney, or any combination of the above. If the above method does not generate favorable response, the City will have the option to solicit for a realtor through the appropriate request for proposal method to list and sale the property.

Whenever the City desires to sell any real property, the City Manager, in conjunction with the City Attorney, will be responsible for coordinating all activities related to such activities in accordance with requirements of controlling law.

When the City sells real property, it may engage in competitive bidding when a notice or notices are published on the City's website and posted at City Hall for a reasonable period calling for bids on the property; by private sale which, when the value of the property exceeds \$50,000.00 will involve the engagement real property appraisal services; by property exchange when the City and another property owner exchange parcels of comparable values which will also involve the engagement real property appraisal services when the value of the property exceeds \$50,000; and the sale to a government entity when the City Council determines that the City-owned real property is required for use by another governmental entity for a public purpose in which case the City may convey real property to that entity for such price, whether nominal or otherwise as the City Council may determine.

Also, a parcel of City-owned real property may also be declared surplus and donated for a viable public purpose in the best interest of the public for right-of-way, park or other public purpose.

With regard to the engagement of real property appraisal services, as to parcels that are valued at less than \$50,000, the appraised value of real property may be determined by procurement of an independent appraisal report or by using the value of the property as determined by the Sumter County Property Appraiser and adding 15% of that amount to that amount. For parcels that appear to be valued at an amount in excess of \$50,000, but not in excess of \$250,000, an appraisal from a qualified Florida appraiser shall be procured. For parcels that appear to be valued at an amount in excess of \$250,000, appraisals from 2 qualified Florida appraisers shall be procured.

Without City Council authority, the City Manager may grant easements, licenses and rights of entry to other governmental entities upon request by such entities said grants being in a form approved by the City Attorney. The City Manager may bring any such action before the City Council for approval as he or she deems appropriate. A license is a grant of permission authorizing the licensee to do a particular act on a parcel of City-owned real property. As distinguished from a lease, a license merely grants permission to use such real property and does not convey any property. Licenses cannot be assigned by the licensee and is revocable by the City at will. Closing of real property contracts shall be performed by the City Attorney in a manner approved by the City Attorney.

All transactions involving the conveyance of City-owned real property shall be confirmed by a resolution of the City Council or proclamation by the City Manager, with regard to transactions within the authority level of the City Manager, which will include a release any reservation of mineral, metal and petroleum rights and right of entry under the provisions of Section 270.11, *Florida Statutes*, and all such transactions shall be deemed to have included a petition for such release.

The proceeds received from the sale of surplus City property, shall be deposited into the City's Reserve Fund, unless otherwise required by controlling law or other legal requirement.

5/19/21 – Meet Paul with Westside Market to check his meter for a water line leak. It was determined that there was a leak on their side of the meter. Call FRWA and set an appointment for them to bring their leak detection equipment to assist in locating the leak.

6/7/21 – Build wood templates for base plate J Bolt layout for spring animals. Anchor bolts must be set in concrete and left for 48 hours prior to mounting the spring animals. The J bolts have to match the plates on the spring animals.

6/8/21 – Dig footers by hand for the spring animals at Hewitt Park. Layout forms. Pour concrete and install J Bars.

6/10/21 – Assemble monkey bars at Hewitt Park.

6/14/21 – Install spring animals, surfboard rider (on concrete footers) at Hewitt Park.

6/15/21 – Omni went out at LS # 1. After talking to Omni Tech Support, they felt the Omni box may have been struck by lightning or had a strong power surge.

6/15/21 – Go to Leesburg to pick up radiator hose for Kubota tractor.

6/15/21 – Tree fell at NE 1st St knocking down a powerline. Had to wait for the power company to get the line off the tree before we could get the tree out of the road.

6/16/21 – Assemble swing set at Hewitt Park.

6/16/21 – Omni issues at LS #3. We were able to work with Omni Tech Support and get this site working.

6/17/21 – Go to Webster Farm Supply to purchase Sakrete. They were sold out.

6/18/21 – Go to Lowery's Hardware in Bushnell and get Sakrete for monkey bar and swing set installation. Install monkey bars and swing set in concrete at Hewitt Park.

6/21/21 – Order Ortho-Polyphosphate for north well from Hawkins Chemicals.

6/22/21 – Jamie Hope from FRWA here discussing upcoming training classes for staff.

6/23/21 – Purchase and install new battery for golf cart.

6/23/21 – Start reading water meters.

6/24/21 – Had a resident complain about brush encroaching on CR 478 East. This is a County Right of Way. Contacted Sumter County Public Works and they issued a work Order to cut back the brush.

6/25/21 – Reading water meters still. Remote reader would be nice to have.

6/28/21 – Loose chlorine line at north well. Not sure how this occurred.

6/28/21 – Work on playground at Hewitt Park.

6/29/21 – Power out at LS # 2 due to blown transformer. Alarm at north well as well.

6/30/21 – Contact Sumter County and acquire As-Built plans for the water main extension at Beville's Corner.

6/30/21 – Pull wastewater sample from interconnect for Flowers Labs.

7/1/21 – Pick up (3) tires from Bushnell tire and mount on portable generator. It had (3) dry rotted tires on it and was not useable.

7/2/21 – Brennon Butcher from Ozello Water came and certified our RPZ backflow devices at the lift stations and City parks. He did it for 1/3 the cost of other quotes I had received.

7/5/21 – Holiday

7/6/21 – North well pumps not running. South well is supplying water for the City. Have had several conversations with US Water trying to figure out what is going on.

5/20/21 – Tom Gustafson from FRWA was at Webster with leak detection equipment and tried to locate where the water line leak was located. We finally narrowed the leak down to one on the restaurants. Westside Market has since brought in a plumber that found the leak within a couple of feet from where Tom thought it was. The leak has been repaired.

5/21/21 – Check images on SD cards from the cameras at Harris Park looking for illegal dumping pictures.

5/24/21 – Lift Station # 4 not operating properly. Had to troubleshoot the reason. Bad relay in panel.

5/24/21 – Purchase belt for the golf cart as the old one split and was in pieces.

5/26/21 – Start reading water meters.

5/28/21 – Order radiator hose for Kubota tractor. Old one was leaking causing tractor to overheat.

5/28/21 – Meeting with Deanna and Anthony Manzella to discuss future development within the City and the availability of utilities.

6/1/21 – Concession stand and bathrooms at Hewitt Park have had something broken off in all the door locks. You are unable to get a key in any of the locks so the doors cannot be opened at this time. Note: The gate to Hewitt Park was closed and locked at this time for remodeling of the park.

6/2/21 – Purchase J Bolts, washers and nuts for spring animals for park playgrounds. They did not come with hardware.

6/7/21 – Contact Duke Energy asking if they would install bulbs in the ball field lights at Harris Park for the City. There are a couple of bulbs that do not work.

7/7/21 – Tropical Storm Elsa

7/8/21 – Talked to US Water about the north wells not working properly. Dean Fletcher said the south well has pumped 127,500 gallons while the north wells were down. Water quality of the south well is not as good as the two north wells. North wells are back up and running today, after the pumps were reset by US Water, but no one knows why they went down. A possible power surge was mentioned.

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-05

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WEBSTER, FLORIDA CALLING FOR A REFERENDUM ELECTION TO BE HELD DURING THE PRIMARY OF THE STATEWIDE GENERAL ELECTION OF 2022 (SCHEDULED FOR AUGUST 23, 2022) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROPOSING TO THE ELECTORATE OF THE CITY OF WEBSTER REVISIONS TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF WEBSTER RELATING TO SECTION 9 (2) PERTAINING TO THE POSITION OF MAYOR PRO TEMPORE; PROVIDING FOR BALLOT LANGUAGE; PROVIDING FOR LEGISLATIVE AND ADMINISTRATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT; PROVIDING FOR DUTIES OF CITY CLERK; PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTING ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIONS; PROVIDING FOR REVISED CHARTER OF THE CITY OF WEBSTER; PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS PROVISION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND SCRIVENER'S ERRORS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS AND PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDINANCE AND EFFECTIVE DATE OF PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT.

WHEREAS, controlling State law and the *Charter of the City of Webster, Florida* provide for alternative means whereby the *City Charter* may be amended; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has developed, and hereby recommends to the electors of the City of Webster, that the following proposed amendment to the *Charter of the City of Webster, Florida* be approved by the electors of the City at a referendum election held pursuant to the *Charter of the City of Webster, Florida* and applicable controlling State law; and

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Webster has concluded that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the City of Webster for the City Council to propose an amendment to the *Charter of the City of Webster* at a referendum election in accordance the *Charter of the City of Webster* and Section 166.031, *Florida Statutes*, and in the form set forth herein; and

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Webster approved this Ordinance on first

reading on the 20th day of May, 2021; and

Whereas, words with underlined type shall constitute additions to the original text, ~~strike through~~ shall constitute deletions to the original text, and ellipses (***) shall constitute text that is not changed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEBSTER, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE AND ADMINISTRATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT.

(a). The City of Webster has complied with all requirements and procedures of Florida law in processing and advertising this Ordinance.

(b). The foregoing recital (whereas clause) is hereby ratified, affirmed and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a part of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. PROPOSED REVISION OF SECTION 9 (2); MAYOR PRO TEMPORE; CHARTER OF THE CITY OF WEBSTER. Section 9 (2) of the *Charter of the City of Webster, Florida*, is proposed to be amended to read as follows:

Section 9. Powers and duties of the mayor and mayor pro tempore.—

(1). ***

(2) **MAYOR PRO TEMPORE.** — At the first regular meeting after each regular municipal election, at which newly elected City Council members assume their duties of office, ~~the five City Council members shall, by majority vote of the City Council, select a City Council member, exclusive of the Mayor, shall be appointed~~ to act as Mayor Pro Tempore. The appointment shall be made on the basis of the longest tenure of service on the City Council, longevity of service, which shall include all periods of service regardless of whether consecutive in nature or not, of the members of the City Council not serving as Mayor. The calculation of the term of

service shall be accomplished by the City Clerk and verified by the City Manager and City Attorney. In the event that there is a tie in terms of longevity of service, the determination as to which City Council shall be determined by lot which shall be accomplished in a manner determined by the City Attorney. In addition to the regular powers invested in any City Council member, the Mayor Pro Tempore shall:

(a) Have all the powers and duties of the Mayor in the absence from the City of the Mayor or his or her inability to act, whether by reason of his or her death, resignation, impeachment, mental or physical sickness, or for any other reason, and the City Clerk certifies as to the absence from the City of the Mayor or his or her inability to act, upon demand, when the Mayor is so absent from the City or unable to act; and

(b) Serve as acting Mayor during the absence or disability of the Mayor, and, during such period, has the same powers and duties as the Mayor.

SECTION 3. BALLOT QUESTION. The form of the ballot for the *Charter* amendment provided for in Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be as follows:¹

¹ See, Section 101.161, *Florida Statutes*, relating to referenda and ballots relating thereto. The statutory provision provides as follows:

101.161 Referenda; ballots.—

(1) Whenever a constitutional amendment or other public measure is submitted to the vote of the people, a ballot summary of such amendment or other public measure shall be printed in clear and unambiguous language on the ballot after the list of candidates, followed by the word “yes” and also by the word “no,” and shall be styled in such a manner that a “yes” vote will indicate approval of the proposal and a “no” vote will indicate rejection. The ballot summary of the amendment or other public measure and the ballot title to appear on the ballot shall be embodied in the constitutional revision commission proposal, constitutional convention proposal, taxation and budget reform commission proposal, or enabling resolution or ordinance. The ballot summary of the amendment or other public measure shall be an explanatory statement, not exceeding 75 words in length, of the chief purpose of the measure. In addition, for every amendment proposed by initiative, the ballot shall include, following the ballot summary, a separate financial impact statement concerning the measure prepared by the Financial Impact Estimating Conference in accordance with s. 100.371(5). The ballot title shall consist of a caption, not exceeding 15 words in length, by which the measure is commonly referred to or spoken of. This subsection does not apply to constitutional amendments or revisions proposed by joint resolution.

(2) The ballot summary and ballot title of a constitutional amendment proposed by initiative shall be

prepared by the sponsor and approved by the Secretary of State in accordance with rules adopted pursuant to s. 120.54. The Department of State shall give each proposed constitutional amendment a designating number for convenient reference. This number designation shall appear on the ballot. Designating numbers shall be assigned in the order of filing or certification and in accordance with rules adopted by the Department of State. The Department of State shall furnish the designating number, the ballot title, and, unless otherwise specified in a joint resolution, the ballot summary of each amendment to the supervisor of elections of each county in which such amendment is to be voted on.

(3)(a) Each joint resolution that proposes a constitutional amendment or revision shall include one or more ballot statements set forth in order of priority. Each ballot statement shall consist of a ballot title, by which the measure is commonly referred to or spoken of, not exceeding 15 words in length, and a ballot summary that describes the chief purpose of the amendment or revision in clear and unambiguous language. If a joint resolution that proposes a constitutional amendment or revision contains only one ballot statement, the ballot summary may not exceed 75 words in length. If a joint resolution that proposes a constitutional amendment or revision contains more than one ballot statement, the first ballot summary, in order of priority, may not exceed 75 words in length.

(b) The Department of State shall furnish a designating number pursuant to subsection (2) and the appropriate ballot statement to the supervisor of elections of each county. The ballot statement shall be printed on the ballot after the list of candidates, followed by the word "yes" and also by the word "no," and shall be styled in such a manner that a "yes" vote will indicate approval of the amendment or revision and a "no" vote will indicate rejection.

(c)1. Any action for a judicial determination that one or more ballot statements embodied in a joint resolution are defective must be commenced by filing a complaint or petition with the appropriate court within 30 days after the joint resolution is filed with the Secretary of State. The complaint or petition shall assert all grounds for challenge to each ballot statement. Any ground not asserted within 30 days after the joint resolution is filed with the Secretary of State is waived.

2. The court, including any appellate court, shall accord an action described in subparagraph 1. priority over other pending cases and render a decision as expeditiously as possible. If the court finds that all ballot statements embodied in a joint resolution are defective and further appeals are declined, abandoned, or exhausted, unless otherwise provided in the joint resolution, the Attorney General shall, within 10 days, prepare and submit to the Department of State a revised ballot title or ballot summary that corrects the deficiencies identified by the court, and the Department of State shall furnish a designating number and the revised ballot title or ballot summary to the supervisor of elections of each county for placement on the ballot. The revised ballot summary may exceed 75 words in length. The court shall retain jurisdiction over challenges to a revised ballot title or ballot summary prepared by the Attorney General, and any challenge to a revised ballot title or ballot summary must be filed within 10 days after a revised ballot title or ballot summary is submitted to the Department of State.

(4)(a) For any general election in which the Secretary of State, for any circuit, or the supervisor of elections, for any county, has certified the ballot position for an initiative to change the method of selection of judges, the ballot for any circuit must contain the statement in paragraph (b) or paragraph (c) and the ballot for any county must contain the statement in paragraph (d) or paragraph (e).

(b) In any circuit where the initiative is to change the selection of circuit court judges to selection by merit selection and retention, the ballot shall state: "Shall the method of selecting circuit court judges in the (number of the circuit) judicial circuit be changed from election by a vote of the people to selection by the judicial nominating commission and appointment by the Governor with subsequent terms determined by a retention vote of the people?" This statement must be followed by the word "yes" and also by the word "no."

(c) In any circuit where the initiative is to change the selection of circuit court judges to election by the voters, the ballot shall state: "Shall the method of selecting circuit court judges in the (number of the circuit) judicial circuit be changed from selection by the judicial nominating commission and appointment by the Governor with subsequent terms determined by a retention vote of the people to election by a vote of the people?" This statement must be followed by the word "yes" and also by the word "no."

Mayor Pro Tempore.

An amendment to the *Webster City Charter* is proposed to provide that the Mayor Pro Tempore will be appointed on the basis of the longest tenure of service on the City Council, longevity of service, which shall include all periods of service regardless of whether consecutive in nature or not. SECTION 4. REFERENDUM ELECTION.

(a). A referendum election is hereby called to be held on the date of the Statewide Primary Election for 2022 which is scheduled for August 23, 2022 with the Sumter County Supervisor of Elections having noted that July 25, 2022 is last day for a person to register to vote for this election and that early voting is planned for August 13-20, 2022.

(b). The Supervisor of Elections of Sumter County is hereby requested to coordinate all matters relating to the said referendum election with the City Clerk, the Division of Elections of the Florida Department of State, and the City Manager, City Clerk and City Attorney.

SECTION 5. DUTIES OF CITY CLERK.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to ensure that the advertising and notice

(d) In any county where the initiative is to change the selection of county court judges to merit selection and retention, the ballot shall state: "Shall the method of selecting county court judges in (name of county) be changed from election by a vote of the people to selection by the judicial nominating commission and appointment by the Governor with subsequent terms determined by a retention vote of the people?" This statement must be followed by the word "yes" and also by the word "no."

(e) In any county where the initiative is to change the selection of county court judges to election by the voters, the ballot shall state: "Shall the method of selecting county court judges in (name of the county) be changed from selection by the judicial nominating commission and appointment by the Governor with subsequent terms determined by a retention vote of the people to election by a vote of the people?" This statement must be followed by the word "yes" and also by the word "no."

requirements of Section 100.342, *Florida Statutes*,² are complied with and to coordinate all activities necessary to conduct the referendum election called in this Ordinance with the Supervisor of Elections for Sumter County.

SECTION 6. IMPLEMENTING ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIONS.

(a). The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to implement the provisions of this Ordinance as may be deemed necessary or appropriate by the City Manager.

(b). The City Manager and City Attorney are also hereby authorized and directed to generally implement the provisions of this Ordinance and to take any and all necessary administrative actions to bring into effect the provisions of this Ordinance in accordance with controlling law as such officers may deem appropriate in their respective roles and functions under the *City of Webster City Charter*.

SECTION 7. REVISED CHARTER OF THE CITY OF WEBSTER.

(a). If the proposed amendment to the *Charter of the City of Webster* is approved by the electorate in the referendum election called for in this Ordinance, it is the intention of the City Council, and it is hereby ordained, that the approved provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the *Charter of the City of Webster*.

(b). The City's Code codifier is granted broad and liberal power and authority to codify the *Charter of the City of Webster* in terms of making appropriate harmonizing, technical or editorial changes and notes that do not affect the substantive provisions

² 100.342 *Notice of special election or referendum.*— In any special election or referendum not otherwise provided for there shall be at least 30 days' notice of the election or referendum by publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the county, district, or municipality, as the case may be. The publication shall be made at least twice, once in the fifth week and once in the third week prior to the week in which the election or referendum is to be held. If there is no newspaper of general

thereof.

SECTION 8. SAVINGS.

The prior actions of the City of Webster relating to the enactment of the *City Charter*, and any and all related matters, are hereby ratified and affirmed.

SECTION 9. SEVERABILITY; SCRIVENER'S ERRORS.

(a). Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or other part of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any portion thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

(b). Typographical errors and other matters of a similar nature that do not affect the intent of this Ordinance, as determined by the City Clerk and City Attorney, may be corrected with the endorsement of the City Manager, or designee, without the need for a public hearing.

SECTION 10. CONFLICTS.

All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE.

The provisions of this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon enactment. The amendment to the *Charter of the City of Webster* proposed for approval in this Ordinance shall become effective only upon approval at a referendum election of the electors of the City of Webster in accordance with the provisions of Section 166.031, *Florida Statutes*.
