
Our February speaker will be John Langford



Hian Loflin's Macro Workshop

Following my macro class on campus, I wondered if a field class might improve field macro skills so I plotted with friend and student, Melody Lytle, about a workshop putting the classroom into practical field use. I am planning on using MO Ranch Conference Center, a facility near Hunt, Texas offering room and board and a photo lab. See http://www.moranch.com/index.php?t=1 Please let me know if the following is of interest and hold the date.

The dates would be

Friday June 20: arrive 1:00 afternoon class/shoot, dinner, instruction/shoot Saturday June 21, all day: breakfast, instruction/shoot, lunch, instruction/shoot, dinner, instruction/shoot Sunday June 22, morning only: breakfast, instruction/shoot, lunch, depart at 1:00

In order to make this happen, we need between six and eight participants at a tentative cost of \$495 each. This includes two nights double occupancy, the six meals above and access to a work room, the facility's Larkin Digital Lab so the cost is more than reasonable.

At this early stage, the above cost may change somewhat if our estimates are wrong but I will notify you quickly. Fifty percent is due with booking and the remainder due six weeks before class on May 10.

The date in June will be warmish of course, but the season provides an abundance of small invertebrates and plants to photograph.

2014 Assignments

March - Bridges: can be singular or plural, local or not, pedestrian or vehicle, modern, ancient or anywhere in between, color or monochrome.

May - Tiny Creatures: Close up views of insects, bugs, butterflies, spiders or even a small lizard. Nothing larger than an Anole lizard. Color or monochrome images are OK. Get out your macro lens, extension tubes or close up accessory lens and look for tiny creatures. Make it fun! You don't have to use any of the previously mentioned equipment; for butterflies etc. a standard lens may be fine.

July - A Texas Wild Flower: Just a single bloom, not a field of flowers. Single flower stalks such as bluebonnets that actually have multiple blossoms are fine. Images can be in color or monochromatic.

September 2014 - In Flight: An action shot demonstrating motion of anything in flight. Capture a bug, bird, person on a skate board, snow board, bike, an airplane or a skydiver, whatever you can find IN FLIGHT. Color or monochrome.

November - Wet Reflections: Capture reflections and anything wet. Could be as small as a drop of water or as large as the ocean. Wet streets, wet sidewalks or puddles are fair game. (Pray for rain!)

Assignment for January 2015:

Weather: An images that depicts weather but NOT a beautiful sunshiny day. Storm clouds, rain, sleet, snow, ice, wind, fog, rainbows are all acceptable.
