Almond Flour Banana Muffins



Here's a super easy, delicious muffin recipe made with healthy ingredients.

Ingredients

- 3 large, ripe bananas with brown spots
- 3 large eggs
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 3 cups almond flour
- 1/4 cup dark chocolate chips
- cooking spray

Instructions

- Preheat oven to 350°. Prepare a muffin tin with cooking spray. Set aside.
- Place bananas, eggs, vanilla, cinnamon, baking soda, baking powder, and salt in a food processor. Process until the mixture is smooth.
- Add almond flour. Process just long enough to combine the ingredients. Then, scrape the walls down and process again just enough to combine. Add in the chocolate chips, stirring with a spatula.
- Divide muffin batter into prepared muffin tin. Bake for 30 minutes, or until golden brown and an inserted toothpick comes out clean. Remove from the oven and let the muffins cool for 20 minutes. Enjoy!

Some Helpful Hints for Glasses Fogging With Your Mask



- Try cleaning your glasses with soap and water before putting them on with your mask. Drying them with a microfiber cloth (like the one that comes with your glasses) so no lint will remain on the glasses will help.
- Tape the mask along the bridge of your nose and cheeks with micropore surgical tape. Then glasses on top.
- Another way is to put a folded tissue (dry or damp) across the bridge of your nose, under the mask.
- Apply a thin layer of shaving cream to the inside of your glasses, then gently wipe it off. The residual shaving cream will protect the lenses from misting up.
