

Have you received text messages, emails, or messages through Facebook messenger from someone claiming to be your pastor and asking for money or gift cards, indicating it's an emergency? Don't give. It's not your pastor. It's a scam. Your pastor will never contact a parishioner directly with an emergency request for cash or gift cards. Messages asking parishioners to help fulfill a need would come through the parish's or the diocese's official communication channels or be accomplished through a collection approved by the diocese. In addition, please note that neither your parish nor the diocese will ever sell or give away parishioners' personal information.

If you're not sure about a text or email you've received, do not respond. Call your parish office right away to notify a staff member. You can also file a report through the Federal Trade Commission's Complaint Assistant which helps the FTC detect patterns of fraud and abuse by going to https://reportfraud.ftc.gov/





Divine Mercy Sunday-The Second Sunday of Easter

APRIL 11, 2021

Mankind's need for the message of Divine Mercy took on dire urgency in the 20th Century, when civilization began to experience an "eclipse of the sense of God" and, therefore to lose the understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life. In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. St. Faustina's Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed. On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (Diary, no. 742).

MINUTES Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish Finance Council March 23, 2021

The meeting was called to order by T. Jessee and opened with prayer by Fr. Smith. Council met in the parish hall so that social distancing could be observed. Masks were worn.

Minutes from the January meeting were presented. Motion carried to approve the minutes as presented (L. Rietschlin/P. Schroeder).

Pastor's Report - Fr. Smith

- Fr. Smith opened discussion of the proper use of a federal grant the school will be receiving to use toward COVID-related expenses. Pending more information, discussion has been tabled.
- Festival discussions have begun. Per Health Department recommendations, we will not have rides (i.e. bouncy house, etc.)
- Church pews are being opened allowing more seating.
- A bi-parish retreat is being planned for April.
- Holy Week Masses will be held at Sacred Heart this year. Small choirs (less than 10 people) will be allowed.

Principal's Report – L. Myers

- L. Myers reported that the First Communion Mass will be held April 11. There are 8 children receiving the sacrament. Seating will be limited to the children and their parents. The traditional Blessing Cup meal will also take place.
- Baseball is organizing. All Parish children are welcome starting at 4-years-old to 8th Graders. The teams gather on Mondays and Wednesdays. Coaches are parents.
- In April the 7th and 8th graders will be attending the Damascus Leadership Camp. All but one parent approved.
- Registrations for the 2021-2022 school year are being accepted.

Follow Up on Prior Business

- P. Schroeder reported Durable Slate was in and worked on the church roof. They were unable to complete the work in one day so they will be back in a week or two.
- Asset Inventory was discussed. It was suggested take a video of the items with commentary instead of photos. This could be kept digitally on the cloud.
- Finance Council training Diocese is trying to design an on-line program. No new information.
- Tuition was discussed. Tuition will remain the same as last year.
- Salaries were discussed.

New Items for Discussion

- Review of January and February Financial Statements
 - Comparative Balance Sheet as of February 28, 2021 Assets total \$786,740. A total of \$731,905 is currently on deposit with the Diocese.
 - o **Income Statement/Budget and Comparisons** as of February 28, 2021 Year-to-date is showing a net income of \$37,055. The budget anticipated a net loss of \$4,667. Therefore, we are under budget by \$41,722. All bills and assessments are paid in full to date.
 - o The financial report was approved (T. Jessee/L. Rietschlin).
- J. Palm requested a Budget Meeting be set. An email will be sent with possible dates.

Next meeting: May 25 at 7:00 p.m. after Mass in the Parish Hall.

Meeting adjourned with prayer.
