COMMUNITY SERVICE: KID'S COMMUNITY CLOSETS

The SE Atlantic Section is very proud to announce the establishment of Kid's Community Closets at Orchard View Elementary School in Delray and at Galaxy Elementary School in Boynton. Thanks to our "shoppers extraordinaire," Jodi Blumenthal and Elaine Zukerman, we have been able to supply both schools with much needed boys and girls clothing.

Our Kid's Community Closets help both students and their teachers by providing clothing necessities. Our Kid's Closet is there when an emergency happens. We can supply pants, collared shirts, and underwear. These items are kept by the child for their future use. The children can be less self- conscious and have a smaller risk of being teased or bullied if they have what they need, so both teacher and student can focus on learning. We select schools based on the percentage of students who receive free or reduced cost meals; this is the federal measure of poverty.

Computer Printing Tip:


Have you ever wanted to print out only one page of a bulletin? Here's how it works on a PC:

At the top of the screen, <u>do not</u> dick on the printer picture. Instead click on the word FILE, then click on PRINT.

After the PRINT box shows, select from the Pages To Print options.

ALL = prints every page in the document

CURRENT PAGE = prints only the page that the cursor is on
