eath and loss are challenging. This past month has been one of the most difficult seasons in my life with my father's passing. He brought such joy to everyone he met. He truly radiated Christ to all he met. When someone like that passes, you think, reflect on, and discover all that person has done in their life. It has been a blessing to hear from many people from all different contexts and eras of my life and hear them share about how my dad was a blessing to them. His service to God impacted many people, especially me, as he sought to share the Gospel with others.

And as I learned recently, my dad is still doing it, even though he passed. As many of you know, he suffered much from his cancer battle. It caused a lot of damage to his body, especially his organs. it. He was an organ donor, but we all thought the damage to his body was so great no one would find any use for his organs!

My sister, however, commented on some recent trivia she discovered: eyes are the most common organ donated by those who have passed. Sure enough! The next day, the hospital called my mom and asked if they could use my dad's eyes. They said his eyes could help restore the sight of four people! I have no idea how that works, but I will take it.

Now, this is how the Lord is so amazing. The day after my dad died, I attended my old church (where we eventually held his memorial) to tell everyone the news and be with them. The sermon preached that day was on this passage out of Matthew, where Jesus restored the sight of two blind men! That same morning at their church, my in-laws heard the same message from the Gospel of Luke! Here we are in my mother's living room later that afternoon, finding out two of us in different churches heard God's word about Jesus restoring sight and finding out that dad will help restore the vision of up to four people!

When we say God uses us, it is astonishing how that can happen when we trust God. In the end, we serve to allow people blinded to the Gospel to see Jesus with eyes fully opened. How can you help those blind to the Gospel receive the glorious vision of the risen Lord?

# Building & Grounds | The Sanctuary Gets Some Updates



From Monday, November 14th, until Friday, November 18th, we brought in a lift to take care of issues with the sanctuary. First we installed new speakers for the congregation and monitor speakers for the choir. The monitor speakers allow our choir members to hear someone at the pulpit. The installation is not complete, but we plan to finish by the end of the year.

Secondly, we replaced some of the bulbs along the sides of the sanctuary. We cleaned and replaced the bulbs in the 12 theater lights illuminating the stage. We also did some patch-up painting.

The workers were serenaded by the choir rehearsing, Shirley Woodson practicing the organ, and Greg Breed from the San Diego Theatre Organ Society (TOSSD) rehearsing on our versatile organ for the silent film TOSSD showed on Saturday, November 19th. We also replaced the bulbs in the lights in the upper parking lot. A big thanks to Gary Redmond, one of our Building and Grounds elders, for organizing this major rejuvenation, along with the help of Steven Lee, our facilities maintenance, and Riley Casey, our AV Tech.

We want to recognize Jim and Carolynn Baker who reworked our Christmas setup and labored long hours assisting the entire production. They were the boots on the ground while Gary Redmond was in the air.

Steven Rarick got the speakers up and running. Ken Marron from Sunbelt Rentals helped get us the lift. Chris Hammond from DCJ Theatrical Lighting assisted in correcting our lighting issues. Even people who don't attend Trinity Church helped immensely in getting this large project up and running, including providing financial discounts. Lastly, we want to thank Rob Franks, a Trinity Christian School dad who helped whenever possible.

## **Operation Christmas Child Boxes**


