MCGAUGHY'S Bump Stop Instructions

- 1. The stock bump stop assembly needs to be cut off from your frame. You can cut it with a die grinder or sawzall.
- 2. The rear-end housing has a flat saddle welded to the top on each side that the original bump stop would make contact with. At the rear most point drill a 3/8" hole and install the hexagon shaped bump stop and tighten nut down (supplied with kit).
- 3. Check that no brake lines or wires may interfere with any part of the rear-end housing, if so, move them accordingly.
