

### **Everyday Stewardship:**

#### **God Gives Us What We Need**

A few months back, my wife and I helped move my oldest son into his first real apartment. He was moving to start his first real job and was excited and cautious at the same time.

Sometimes, we think material possessions give evidence of a life lived well. Not only doesn't all our stuff amount to real evidence of what our life has really been like, but it doesn't make our lives better either.

What makes a life well lived will be the love and compassion that we have experienced, primarily with God who loves us so deeply. Due to that love, God gives to us what we need, not always what we want. More stuff will never amount to anything in comparison to what God provides to us. 

Why does the Catholic Church still use Latin in 2019? Originally, Latin was adopted by the Church because it was the common language of the people in the early days of the Church. Of course now Latin is no longer used commonly in any country, so why does the Church still use Latin? Why do we still sing in Latin at times? Saint John the 23<sup>rd</sup> outlined three reasons why Latin is still relevant in the Church, especially in the Liturgy. 1: "Just as the Church is by nature 'catholic', or 'universal,' the Latin language is also international, not belonging to one country or place" 2: "....because it is no longer a living language, it is also immutable." Words and phrases do not have the tendency to change usage and meanings as they do in living languages such as English. This is helpful when trying to explain the incredibly deep and difficult mysteries of the Faith. 3: "(Latin) is beautiful and elegant, and the Church is always a lover of arts and culture." There is a unique beauty to hymns and prayers sung or prayed in Latin. It can inspire us with a sense of sacredness and mystery in our worship of God, something that is easily lost in modern times.
