WARREN COUNTY (PEQUEST RIVER) MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY

MINUTES March 17, 2020

Chairman Niece called the regular meeting of the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority to order at 7:30 p.m. The meeting was held at the Authority's Administration building located at 199 Foul Rift Road, Belvidere, New Jersey.

Also, in attendance: Brian Tipton, Esq., Authority Legal Counsel; Kim Francisco, Authority CFO; Kevin Shoudt, Authority Consultant; and Patricia Kaspereen, Administrative Assistant. Stephen Donati, P.E., Authority Engineer was participating via tele conference.

Chairman Niece led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance then read the Introductory Statement. New language for the Introductory Statement was given to Chairman Niece from legal counsel, it is his intention to use the shortened language going forward.

MINUTES

Regarding the minutes from the February 18, 2020 Reorganization Meeting, Mr. Niece noted an error that needs correction. The tally for the votes for Chairperson should read 5 for Don, not 7.

Mr. Nyland moved to approve the minutes of the February 18, 2020 Reorganization Meeting, as corrected. Mr. Kiszonak seconded. All in favor, except 2 abstentions (Mr. Piazza & Mr. Deutsch). The motion passed.

Mr. Nyland moved, and Mr. Kiszonak seconded to approve the minutes of the February 18, 2020 regular meeting, as presented. All in favor, except 2 abstentions (Mr. Piazza & Mr. Deutsch). The motion passed. Mr. Piazza wished to discuss the minutes in Executive Session, since they pertain to personnel.

Mr. Nyland moved, and Mr. Kiszonak seconded to approve the minutes of the February 18, 2020 Executive Session, as presented. All in favor, except 2 abstentions (Mr. Piazza & Mr. Deutsch). The motion passed.

- 7) A letter dated March 2, 2020, from Michele Potter, Manager, Office of Quality Assurance, NJDEP to the Belvidere STP laboratory manager, regarding renewal applications for the FY 2021 NJ Environmental Laboratory Certification Program.
- 8) A letter dated March 2, 2020, from Michele Potter, Manager, Office of Quality Assurance, NJDEP to the Oxford STP laboratory manager, regarding renewal applications for the FY 2021 NJ Environmental Laboratory Certification Program.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At approximately 7:35 pm, Mr. Nyland moved, and Mr. Kiszonak seconded to adopt Resolution #20-17, to enter an executive session to discuss personnel and contract matters. All in favor, motion carried.

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Mr. Nyland moved and Mr. Kiszonak seconded to return to open session at 7:44 p.m. All in favor, motioned carried.

CFO'S REPORT

Mr. Francisco summarized the monthly financial report. In early February, most of our users paid their bills. Our cash position is up by about \$47,000 from the beginning of the year. Expenses are normal. The last page is an accounting of the Jaindl escrow account; this page was handed out before the meeting since a bill came in after the report had been completed. As of 3/20/20, their balance is \$6,125.02.

Mr. Francisco presented a resolution and agreement for a Shared Services Agreement with the County for the purchase of motor fuel.

Mr. Piazza moved, and Mr. Nyland seconded to adopt Resolution #20-18, authorizing the execution of a five-year shared services agreement with the County of Warren for the purchase of motor fuels. The term of this agreement is from March 1, 2020 to March 1, 2025. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

Mr. Niece asked Mr. Tipton if the resolution for award of a non-fair and open contract for wastewater treatment services needed to be modified in light of an addendum. Mr. Tipton preferred passing the resolution as presented and then allowing him to present an addendum to the agreement. The Board could then pass another resolution at the next meeting. He explained his reasoning to the members.

Mr. Nyland moved and Chairman Niece seconded to adopt Resolution #20-19, authorizing the award of a non-fair and open contract for wastewater treatment services to Kevin Shoudt & Associates, LLC for an annual cost of \$65,000 to be paid on a monthly basis from March 1, 2020 to February 28, 2021. The motion pass on a roll call vote as follows:

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Mr. Donati's report was included in the agenda packets. He summarized his report.

NJDOT Rt. 31 Bridge over Furnace Brook Project: On March 20th Mr. Donati attended the Town Hall meeting in Oxford Township. He gave the Board an update.

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Interceptor Inspections: Mr. Donati and Mr. Shoudt requested authorization to advertise for bids before our next meeting. Mr. Donati estimated the cost for the contractor will be around \$125,000 to inspect our lines, the County line and the White Township siphon line. Alternate bids can be done and then the Board can decide if they want to do the County line and White siphon line.

Mr. Piazza moved and Mr. Nyland seconded to allow CP Engineers to advertise for bids to inspect, via CCTV, the Authority's lines systemwide, the County Route 519 line and the White Township siphon line. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Climbing Screen: There have been delays in obtaining information because the chosen screen is from a European company.

Oxford UV Installation: The TWA application has been deemed administratively complete by DEP, who has 90 days to review it.

Belvidere Clarifier Restoration: The costs for the project will be a lot higher than previously discussed. Mr. Donati and Mr. Shoudt thought it best to have a discussion with the Capital Improvements Committee before any decision is made. Mr. Shoudt will schedule a meeting with the committee. Chairman Niece felt this was an important project.

Because Mr. Piazza was unable to attend last month's meeting, he asked Mr. Donati for an update on the County line and Jaindl.

AUTHORITY CONSULTANT

Belvidere STP: Mr. Shoudt said the FST arm bent on the skimmer. The operators replaced it with an arm from the old Oxford plant. They replaced the cooling fan on one of the blowers and disinfected the administration building prior to tonight's meeting.

An air permit expired in 2018 for the generator at the South Water Street Pump Station. The County Health Department issued a violation but no fine. Mr. Shoudt is working with the DEP in redoing a new permit. Mr. Shoudt is working with Mr. Donati to find out what the other expiration dates are for our other permits.

Oxford STP: The operators replaced the cooling fan for one of the blowers and they serviced the HVAC unit.

General Business: The lawn mower at Oxford is from 1996 and there are problems with the motor. We have been unable to find parts to rebuild it, and a new motor would be \$1,800. Mr. Should obtained a quote for a new mower with a trade-in for the old one. Mr. Nyland requested two additional quotes before any decision is made. Mr. Should agreed to obtain 2 more quotes.

The 1994 Ford Escort is rusting out really bad. He explained how the car is used daily and gets better gas mileage than either of our trucks. He asked the Board if they wanted to get another used car or new car, or just use the truck. Chairman Niece did not know if the car is used enough

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to justify the expense of buying a new car. The car was originally purchased for our former Executive Director and then given to the operators to use after he retired. He asked for comments from the Board and wondered if it was used for enough miles to make a difference. The consensus of the Board is to use the Escort until the wheels fall off and then use the truck.

Mr. Shoudt is reviewing lock-out, tag-out procedures with the operators.

He would like to set up a meeting with the 5-year Capital Projects Committee.

Mr. Kiszonak had questions on four bills from REP Pump Services. Mr. Shoudt explained the bills in more detail.

Mr. Should presented a resolution to renew the contracts for the monitoring of the fire alarm system and annual inspection at the Oxford plant.

Mr. Piazza moved and Mr. Nyland seconded to adopt Resolution #20-20, authorizing the execution of contracts for fire alarm system monitoring and inspections for the Oxford plant. The terms of the contracts will be for 24 months. The cost is \$35 and \$50 per month, payable quarterly. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

FINANCE

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #20-21 (Certificate No. 404: \$74,226.91) be approved to pay all bills from the Operating Fund, as presented. Mr. Kiszonak seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #20-22 (Certificate No. 411: \$6,755.00) be approved to pay all bills from the Capital Improvements Fund as presented. Mr. Nyland seconded. The motion passed unanimously on roll call vote.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #20-23 (Certificate No. 003: \$1,443.13) be approved to pay all bills from the Jaindl escrow account as presented. Mr. Nyland seconded. The motion passed unanimously on roll call vote.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Chairman Niece asked how the next meeting should be handled if this health situation continues as it is? It was decided to see how things play out. This meeting worked out. Social distancing was practiced. Everyone agreed, but stressed they did not want to be any closer until things are back to normal.

NEW BUSINESS

In light of the virus, the group on-line class for the Authority to earn credit for each commissioner who takes the class should be done individually in their own residence. The

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deadline is May 1, 2020. The class is only 20 minutes long. Information was in the Agenda Packets or a member can contact Ms. Kaspereen for sign in information

PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public present.

As there was no more business to come before the Authority, Mr. Piazza moved, and Mr. Nyland seconded that the meeting be adjourned. All in favor, motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8:14 p/m.

WHEREAS, there exists a need for wastewater treatment services relative to oversight and management of the business and supervision of the operations of the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority (Authority), as set forth in detail in the attached Agreement between this Authority and Kevin Shoudt & Associates, L.L.C. (Contractor); and
