FROM THE PASTOR

August 19, 2018
Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time
John 6:41-51
 Gospel Jn 6:51-58

Dear St. Pius X and St. Anthony Church Family,

Peace! Jesus continues teaching His revelation about being our food for life in the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Christ is Faithful to us. He never stops inviting us to fuller communion with Him, and He offers this grace again and again with every celebration of Mass (By the way, **daily mass is a great opportunity** often overlooked to spend time with Him and receive the peace and strength only God can give us!) His teaching on the Holy Eucharist can be deep at times, but that should not stop us from jumping the more into it, as Jesus Himself said in Luke 5:4 “Cast into the deep for a catch.” So here we go again with our five week study (the 4th of 5) of Him as the ‘Bread of Life’.

Have you ever heard someone say, ““Stop laying it on so thick with those compliments, she’s eating it up!” ‘ We say such things to mean that someone is taking in and loving every bit of what they are hearing, even to the point of being full of it. Maybe it was flattery with praising someone a bit too much, and the recipient got full of themselves! Or have you been to a concert of a musician you adore, and you told someone about it, ‘I She sang all the best songs, I ate up every word!’ Or have you ever heard a life-changing speech, and you realized you needed time to process it completely, so you said, “I need some time to digest it fully!” All these sayings give a deeper glimpse into what Jesus is talking about when He describes His relationship to us as food to be eaten and metabolized within us. Receiving Jesus’ body and blood (eating & drinking) was a level of intimate communion Jesus wants between Himself and His followers. A shepherd and sheep are close, and a vine and branches are close, but is there any closer union than food taken in and eaten? This food is then metabolized first into our energy and then it grows into our actual bodies, as developed tissue or muscle. Jesus wants us to share His life; flesh and blood. Jesus is about identifying and living within his followers, not just being ‘linked to’ or ‘networked’ with us. He wants to live in union with us. In John 10:10, Jesus says, “I came that they may have life and life abundantly!” And Jesus is the ‘Life’ we receive (John 11:25, 14:6). So much so, that St Paul will say in Galatians 2:20, after he surrenders his will and converts to Christ, “I live, yet no longer I, but Christ lives in me”. Jesus describes this sacramental union between He and His followers in John 14:20 “Just as I am in my Father; You are in me and I in you.” It is all about communion; we become one through this process of taking in, consuming, and allowing what we receive to change, nourish, and to form us new. Maybe it was crude, but how many of us were told as kids to eat good food, because “You are what you eat”! We do become what we take in. I love the old Indigo Girls song ‘All that we let In’, that describes a union once shared as never being lost, because we are changed by all that we deeply experience. Even pain or loss, may feel like ‘dust kicked in our eyes’ but even hurt that is processed can make one stronger, giving us better vision so we may see clearer, that ‘we are better off for all that we let in...’ Jesus’ teaching about His union with us in the holy Eucharist is a deep mystery, but it is confirmed in our experiences of prayer. When people say ‘I can’t explain it, but I feel it in my bones’, it means that something has become so much a part of us by our ingesting it, that we may not be able to single it out or isolate it again. Every Mass is our return to God for such a blessed union!
