ZONING AND PLANNING

WATER AND MAINTENANCE

-The well pump was pulled and replaced. Albrechts informed Ahlers that there is a hole in the well casing that is allowing rocks through. It will eventually fill in the well if not kept cleaned out or we can install a liner, but that would require a smaller pump.

A second well was discussed with a price given from Albrechts at around \$55,000 plus extras. Ahlers stated one installed privately could be around \$30,000 plus extras.

-Received bids from Grassers for water repairs in the town garage. Bid #1 was for repairing the water leaks which will be approximately \$200 per leak. They are unsure how many leaks until water is turned back on. Bid #2 is for fixing the bathroom for \$595. After discussion, it was decided that there is no need for a bathroom in that building. Will have Grasser's cap everything in the bathroom.

Haar made a motion to fix the leaks and cap the bathroom with a second from Trone, motion carried.

-Info was received from NCICG concerning surveys. Harrison will contact them to inquire whether they have any ideas on how to get residents to fill them out.

There was no further business. Next meeting will be held on August 8, 2018. Trustee Vaskie made a motion to adjourn the meeting with a second coming from Trustee Wegrzyn. Meeting was adjourned.
