### Quilt Amana is This Weekend as **Quilting Comforts The Community**

Amana's one and only quilt show and sale has a beautifully colorful array of activities. The threeday show and sale is this weekend, Friday April 14 through Sunday April 16 at the Price Creek Event Center, Amana. It offers:

Quilt Amana will be honoring Rita Moore, whose work with the Quilts of Valor project has led to her creating 100 quilts, each one sewn and presented to an American hero. Talk with her about the project and its meaning.

Meet Jane Bazyn of Victor and Judy Rohret of Cosgrove, the quilters behind many of the beautiful pieces you'll see at Quilt Amana this weekend. They use their time and talent to give back to their communities in a number of ways. Several yearsago Jane Bazyn pledged a quilt to each veteran in her local Legion. To date she and a group of helpers have pieced, quilted and presented over 120 quilts. Heritage Designs is proud to partner with Jane in her efforts to honor veterans with these special quilts. Jane also donates utilitarian quilts through Hope Ministries in Des Moines. Hope Ministries provides food, clothing, shelter and life recovery support for men, women and children in desperate need. Jane has donated around 50 quilts to date, which the organization distributed to people along with Thanksgiving and Christmas meals.

Judy Rohret makes linens and specialty items, sized for the tiniest babies in University of Iowa neonatal intensive care unit. At the beginning of this year, Judy learned from a family member who works at the hospital that the Preemie Project was no longer serving lowa, and that the need for the items they provided is great. Items include crib sheets, fleece pads, special holiday linens, z-flo bag covers, bereavement blankets and gowns and fabric heart eye covers for surgeries. "Making the holiday items is the most rewarding," said Judy, "Trying to make the day special for families and staff who spend any holiday in the hospital is important."

## Tidy up the Seven

It's that time of year when the snow melts and we look around and think, "Ok let's clean up."

Here is some important information and a few reminders.

- The seven Amana Colonies are a National Historic Landmark. Please let us all respect the beauty and character of our villages.
- · It's a good thing to pick up litter whenever you see it along village streets, in the Middle Amana Park, around the Lily Lake and along the Nature Trail or Amana Kolonieweg trail. We are not an incorporated city. There is no parks department. We are the parks department. So every one of us has a responsibility to help.
- · Be aware that the Middle Amana Park and the parking area/ picnic area on the northside of the Lily Lake is private property, mowed and maintained at the expense of the Amana Society – and yes, that

expense is considerable. There is no smoking allowed in these areas. The public is invited to use these areas for their enjoyment. But please do not use them as a place to dump yard waste or trash and yes, please pick up after your dog.

•The only legal place to dump yard waste, trash or remodeling/ building waste is the Iowa County Landfill located at 3369 Highway 6, east of Homestead. Dumping anywhere in the Amana Colonies' forests, meadows and ditches is illegal and will result in ticketing and fines. Amana Society shareholders are permitted to dump only grass clippings, yard waste and tree limbs at the South Amana yard waste site - no others may use this site. Non permitted users will be ticketed with littering and trespassing.

•The Iowa County Landfill is open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. and Saturday from 8 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. The lowa County Landfill accepts garbage, furniture, appliances, building waste, remodeling debris, dead tree and brush waste. While it does not accept yard waste or grass clippings from Marengo and Williamsburg residents, yes, it does accept yard waste/ leaves/ grass clippings from Amana Colony residents as there is no city dump here for village wide use. So yes, if you live in the Amana Colonies you may take yard waste to the Iowa County landfill.

· Yes furniture can be taken to the Iowa County landfill for \$55 a ton. Mattresses may be brought for \$4 each. Yes they accept household appliances like old washers and dryers, refrigerators and TVs. Check iowacountylandfill.com for fees and updates. Check the Iowa County Landfill website or call 319-828-4943 for information and fees.

· Yes, you can recycle many things at the lowa County Landfill for free. There is no charge to recycle newspapers, books, cardboard, (they do not accept business paper / copy paper) clear glass, clean "tin" cans, propane cylinders, LP tanks, small light bulbs. There are small recycling fees for computer monitors and printers, televisions, household News & Notes continues on page 2

appliances and tires. Scrap metal can be taken for recycling to the lowa County Landfill.

- Yes, you can drop off household hazardous materials such as cleaners, rechargeable batteries, garden and lawn chemicals, antifreeze, motor oil, oil based stains and paints during normal business hours at the lowa County Landfill. Please dry-out latex paint by leaving the lid off of the can and then dispose of the paint can in your normal garbage. Check the lowa County Landfill website or call 319-828-4943 for information if you have a question about the disposal of waste materials.
- Two area companies do curbside pickup of garbage in the Amana Colonies. They are S and J Sanitation, PO Box 344 Marengo, 319-642-3325 and Cox Sanitation and Recycling, 2226 335th St. North English, 319-664-3025. Both offer various recycling services and can drop off and pick up dumpster boxes at your property.
- FYI you can recycle your old computers, laptops, printers, ink cartridges, phones, gaming equipment or other IT equipment any day of the week at your local Staples. There is no cost. Actually, you'll receive \$5 in in-store credit when you do. If you bring in ink cartridges or toner cartridges you can receive \$2 per cartridge in in-store credit. Staples also offers paper shredding services.
- Help Safe Haven lowa County by dropping off your aluminum soda and beer cans there. They take them in and collect the deposits as a fundraiser. Take clean empty cans to the drop-off box at Safe Haven on Highway 6.
