# 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time Sunday 8 October 2023 (Year A) You Are invited but .... Are You Dressed for It?

The image of a great banquet to which all are invited appears often in the pages of the Bible as a sign of Divine Hospitality - God's inclusiveness and all-embracing mercy towards all to any who would embrace and live by it even in times of suffering and oppression. In the first reading Isaiah reminds his people of God's merciful love for them at a time when the inhabitants of Jerusalem suffer under the ruthless invasion of the Assyrian Empire. Into this situation of sadness and want Isaiah brings a message of hope reminding his people of God's faithful love: "God will make a banquet for us. There will be plenty for all and God Himself will heal us - will wipe away the tears from every cheek."

God is present where all people can sit down together, putting aside differences, sharing the same fellowship and ongoing peace. God's vision is that life should be lived in the same fellowship, not once a year but always. In this sense, God comes to us disguised as our shared life.


Matthew's story of the wedding banquet, like several of the Jesus parables has a sting in its tale. The king is planning a wedding feast for his son. He sends out a lot of personal invitations to people who usually get invited to such occasions. But the Invited knock the invitations back without, doing the king the courtesy of explanations. Some even kill the king's messengers. However, the banquet will go on. The king sends his surviving messengers out again to invite anyone they might run into - rich, poor, good, bad, despised 'nobodies' in the eyes of the Elite. Such is the generosity of the king and the love for his son.

During the feast, the king notices that one of the last invited guests has not made an effort to come reasonably dressed for the occasion. When asked why, he ignores the question. The king's response is swift. He has the unprepared guest turfed out into the darkness. The original hearers would not have been in any doubt about the subject of this story. God's kingdom is not for the complacent, those who feel they belong by birth or piety. To participate one must come 'dressed for it.' In the early Church, being Baptized was likened to 'putting on Christ, a new garment' and was about 'living the Gospel as Jesus did'

In our Christian tradition, the image of the feast evokes the Eucharist - what the Second Vatican Council called the Source and summit of Christian Life. When we gather to share the Eucharist we experience the presence and the hospitality of Jesus who unites us as one family and is in the midst of us as 'One who serves'.

It is not just a matter of rocking up to the feast, we are called to repentance and a new way of living – to be community builders. To put on Christ is to be clothed in compassion, concern and humble service, making the connection between receiving

the generous hospitality of God and witnessing to it in our own interactions with others. We who are invited as friends are also the stewards and hosts united by the Hospitality (the Spirit) of God. So let's turn up suitably dressed. Let us put on Christ.



Matthew 22:1-14

Jesus began to speak to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more

servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He despatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out on to the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests. When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding garment, and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?" And the man was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth."
