## **Edison Tour**

On Sunday, April 18<sup>th</sup>, a beautiful sunny day some 20 NJORTC members went on a tour of the Thomas Edison Site in West Orange, consisting of the Edison House and Edison Lab. This was followed by a luncheon at a nearby restaurant.

The Lab, administered by the National Park Service, had only recently reopened. The house, called Glenmont, is located in Llewllyn Park.

Glenmont, a Queen Anne style mansion built in 1880, became the home of Mr. Edison and his second wife, Mina Miller on their return from their honeymoon in 1886. The house was Mina's wedding gift.

Our tour, lead by a ranger guide, started in the conservatory, filled with plants and flowers from the estate's greenhouse. We continued to a paneled reception room near the main entrance, another living room, a large dining room, a music room, the kitchen and servants' dining room on the first floor. We took the main stairs to the family bedrooms and other family rooms on the second floor. Mr Edison lived in the house until he died in 1931, Mina until she died in 1947. Both are buried on the grounds.

From the house tour, we went to Edison's Lab/Manufacturing area which was just down from the estate. The tour here was made on your own. The Park Service provided a walkie-talkie device in which you pressed a button at each stop. The lab/manufacturing areas consisted of a lavish library, a machine shop, stockroom with all sorts of exotic materials, various (Continued on Page 6)

I will not be able to make the Tune Up Clinic, but hope to see you all at Dominick and Eva's meeting on May 16<sup>th</sup>.



## T+(H TIPS Engine Knock

The following was a tip from the Early Bird of Nov-Dec 1976. While old, it is still timely as I have heard of this problem lately with both Birds and sedans. The original author was Lloyd Van De Bogart.

I would like to pass along a tip on a solved problem with my 55 Bird with an automatic transmission. The engine started knocking, which I believed to be a bearing going out. I rebuilt the engine completely and after installation I started it up and much to my chagrin there was the old familiar knock.

A few listens at several garages finally brought the answer from an old time Ford mechanic. "Check the drive plate which connects the transmission to the flywheel". The original drive plate connected to the flywheel at two places. These eventually work loose on the rivets and rock back and forth making a noise identical to a bearing knock.

I removed the engine a second time and sure enough the attach plates were loose. The replacement plate is attached at four places. The parting words of the old mechanic were "There were sure a lot of engines overhauled because of those early drive plates".

other rooms for research and development and a manufacturing area that under today's standard OHSA would love. Also included in the lab/manufacturing area was the famous turntable studio (called the black maria) which turned to catch the sun at all times of day. The tour stations were well explained through the hand held units and written material at the stations. A vast display of Edison's inventions and products was one of the last stops on the tour. Edison was a pioneer in motion pictures and he even tried to develop a process to make rubber from local plants. He and his staff opened the first electric light company in Manhatten in 1882 near Fulton & William Streets. They developed a complete system to generate and distribute electricity as well as household wiring, switches and lighting fixtures.

Thomas Edison pioneered and helped make the 20th century what people labeled "The American Century"
