

Stephen Bartlett (1745-1813 or 18)
Second Lieutenant, Colonel John Waldron's regiment
Brigadier General Sullivan's Brigade, Continental Army

Bartlett was born in Pembroke, New Hampshire, on April 10, 1745. His parents were Christopher Bartlett and his wife, Esther. He married Hannah Belknap on Feb. 28, 1773, at Goshen, New Hampshire.

Stephen Bartlett displayed his commitment to the patriot cause by signing the Association Test for New Hampshire, in the town of Pembroke, on April 12, 1776. After joining the military, he was stationed at Temple's Farm on March 6, 1776 as a second lieutenant with Colonel John Waldron's regiment. This was part of Brigadier General Sullivan's Brigade, Continental Army. He then served as a Second Lieutenant with Colonel Daniel Moore's regiment of New Hampshire troops. This regiment was part of Captain William Barron's Company and was raised for service in Canada. He mustered with the regiment on July 22, 1776. On Sept. 19, 1777, he marched with his regiment from Pembroke, New Hampshire, to join the Continental Army under General Gates at Saratoga, New York. He collected a pension for his service.

He was a Deacon in the Congregational Church at the Corners and held several positions of trust in the town of Goshen during his lifetime. He and his wife had ten children: Hannah, Polly, Phoebe, Stephen, Abigail, Richard, Belknap, John Calef, Susannah, and Nancy. He died on May 16, 1813, in Goshen, and is buried in Goshen Four Corners Cemetery, Sullivan County, New Hampshire. His grave is honored with a Patriot Marker, installed in May 2015 by descendant Craig Paige.
